

LETTERS TO EDITOR

FROM READER: Bob

I have read two letters in your newspaper and I completely side with the one by Brook Damiano. This letter is my personal opinion based on what I have read in Dr. Haves letter. I found Dr. Hayes's letter to be offensive considering this is a profit making organization that seeks to make a profit off the mentally ill using any argument it can including the bible quotes to force itself on a neighborhood that does not want it for the safety of the children living nearby. People moved to Orangevale to raise families and live a decent life and not become forcibly involved in helping a profit making organization that is willing to risk our way of life and our families including children just so they can make a dollar. Please look at the constant ads on Channel 64-3 and 64-3 about the violence this clients bring when they go off medication, leave the facility, etc. I find it interesting

that Dr. Hayes brings up old stereotypes to try and raise false guilt feelings because people do not want this kind of business in it's neighborhood. Is this company willing to pay for all claims and is Dr. Haves willing to be personally responsible and serve the jail time anytime one of these clients violates felony laws. Is she willing to put her personal safety, personal freedom, and personal wealth to back up what she claims to believe and is trying to force on local residents?

We already have enough mentally ill people walking the streets of Orangevale that refuse treatment and do not want to get better. The law protects that right and we have to live with their crimes, panhandling, and destruction of property. I have been assaulted by one such person who leaves his facility and refuses to go back and we have had to run a number of them off in Orangevale when the cops refuse to do anything.

We are tired of these so-called clients robbing us, scaring our children, and assaulting people. The community has no final say in who is housed in this proposed facility due to privacy laws on medical records. I would not trust Dr. Hayes assurances when her job is to get this facility approved. I bet she lives no where close to the proposed site and will not be a resident of Orangevale for long once her job is done.

I encourage everyone to fight this facility whether you live near it or not and be prepared to sue everyone including Dr Haves and hold them personally responsible for the action of those they are trying to force upon us. It is time we stand up to Dr. Haves and say something before our children are put at risk by an uncaring heartless for profit organizations that would risk our children and families to make a dollar. Let Dr. Hayes live across the street from the facility, if they manage to build one, and let the staff do the same thing. I have seen hypocrisy sink to unbelievable sink to some deep levels but Dr. Haves takes it to a new lower level. I have lived here forty years and if have read a lot of letters but this is one of the worst in my personal opinion. when your facility is rejected I hope you leave Orangevale Dr. Haves because if you cannot put the safety and well being of children before the making of a dollar you are not the type of person we want in Orangevale.

Ms Damiano has a right to raise her kids in a safe environment without risk of criminal behavior or an organization that will use privacy laws and politicians to protect their profits. As neighbors we need to stand up and support the people most impacted by an organization that brings no benefits to Orangevale and nothing positive. Ms Damiamo did not cause the problems their clients suffer from so send them back to their own communities for service. Bob

It has been a very interesting reading the recent articles regarding the proposed Crisis Residential Home on Elm Ave. in Orangevale. Dawn M Hayes MD chooses to address "that's fine, just not in my neighborhood". Where I read "The point is the provider has picked the wrong location." written by Brooke Damiano. I would like to offer a more factual perspective: FACT

1.There are 181 school days in a year

2.9048 Elm. Ave has a frontage on Elm Ave. that stretches more than 100 feet

3.From 7:00 AM to 8:00 AM on said school days more than one hundred 11,12, and 13 year old students walk unaccompanied to school, on this frontage.

4.From 2:30 PM to 3:30 PM the same students walk unaccompanied home from school.

5.A number of these students wait up to 45 minutes, unaccompanied at this location. 6.In order to enter or exit the property at 9048 Elm Ave, adult patients will interact with these unaccompanied students.

7.Any officer responding to a crisis at this time will be forced to deal with the added factor of innocent children.

These facts are constants. When looking for a site designed to help mentally ill persons in crisis safely and successfully transition back into community, did the Board of Directors of Turning Point Community Programs factor in these constants? I believe any reasonable person considering these facts could conclude that Turning Point is actually setting these patients up for failure. There are 005 square miles in Sacramento County. Just 7,000 feet away, (in the same neighborhood) from this unresearched site is a property that would ideally serve the purpose for these patients. None of these risk factors affect this property. It is time to place accountability where it belongs. It is clear to me that Turning Point bought 9048 Elm Ave. without knowing these risk factors. Rather than admit to this error and take steps to rectify it, they have put their bottom line above the needs of the patients they purport to help. The continued pursuit of a use permit for this property supports this fact.

The county planner Thomas Vogt needs to apply his knowledge of statistical methods and analysis, and provide all Sacramento County citizens an accurate result. I urge all Sacramento County residents to gather the facts, form their own opinion and send that opinion to vogtt@saccounty.net . Control NO: PLNP2016-00419. The project name: Turning Point Residential Care Facility.

Given the risk factors, the county should take accountability and protect two of the most vulnerable demographics in our county, children and adults in crisis. If we do not take accountability now twelve jurors will assign accountability later. Thank You.

DID YOU KNOW?

Thinking of Becoming A Cosigner?



It is an easy meal for a delicious pot pie from puff pastry shells. Even though there are many variations of pot pie, this a perfect comfort food for the month of January.

(Based on the recipe from

Pepperidge Farm)

1 pkg (10 oz.) frozen Pepperidge Farm Puff Pastry Shells

1 Tbsp. vegetable oil

1 medium onion, chopped finely

1 can condensed cream of chicken soup (any variety) ½ cup milk

1 pkg (10 oz.) frozen peas and carrots or your favorite frozen vegetables 2 cups cooked chicken, cut in bite-sized pieces

Bake, cool and remove tops of pastry shells according to the directions on the package of puff pastry shells.

Heat oil in large skillet over medium heat. Add onion and cook until tender.

Add soup, milk and frozen vegetables in skillet and heat to a boil. Reduce heat

to low and cover with a lid. Cook for 5 minutes or until vegetable are tender and heated through. Add chicken and cook until mixture is hot and bubbly. Serve in pastry shells.

According to the package directions, this 6. supposed to serve but if you are someone with a regular appetite, this will serve 3 adults. The mixture should be overflowing the shells.

My sister uses the grocery store rotisserie chicken for her chicken, but I used the 13 oz. canned chicken breast that I get at Costco and Sam's Club. I also used 16 oz. of frozen vegetables to make up for the smaller amount of chicken.


