THE BUDDY BENCH



A third grade Green Oaks Fundamental Elementary School student demonstrated over his summer vacation that dreams can come true.

Several months ago, Wilson Pollock, 9, and his classmates were assigned to write and deliver 'I Have a Dream' speeches about their aspirations and wishes. At first, he planned to talk about his belief that bullfighting should be outlawed, but upon further thought he decided to speak about a much more personal topic. "I have a dream that every student feels included at school," was his title.

He asked other students to join him in making new friends by inviting them to sit together at lunch or play games at recess. "Let's make sure every kid has a buddy and feels included at our school," he told his classmates. "Let's all go be awesome, and let's do it together!"

Researching on the Internet with his mother's help, Wilson learned of a blossoming worldwide movement spawning 'Buddy Benches' at schools where anyone feeling lonely, left out, or just in need of meeting new friends can sit to alert others of their

need. In his classroom speech, Wilson spoke of his dream of having a Buddy Bench at his school.

"Just because someone is different from you doesn't mean they don't need to feel included," he said. "I know I am not the only one who feels lonely sometimes. I think that having a Buddy Bench might help kids be nicer to each other and make new friends." Wilson's teacher, Lori France, encouraged Wilson to follow his dream by making a proposal to the student council urging installation of a Buddy Bench on the playground. Student Council members unanimously agreed, setting in motion a series of events that led to permission to proceed.

Wilson was instructed first to choose a committee to help him with design and location. He and his classmates, Lydia Chechourka-Price and Davin Huegel, decided an existing table with two benches could be

transformed to fulfill the vision. Principal Robert Reynolds enthusiastically supported the idea, and once he approved the plans, construction became a family project. Brightly painted new wood replaced the old, and students arriving for the new school year will enjoy a dazzling yellow and blue table with the words "Buddy Bench" inscribed on its two benches. "When someone feels lonely or left out they can sit on the Buddy Bench and other kids will know that they want someone to play or talk with," Wilson said.

"The Buddy Bench will be a great bridge for communication," Principal Reynolds said. With nearly 500 students at the school, "there will always be some kids who might be shy." The Buddy Bench gives students a place to connect with each other, he said, while providing an opportunity during school assemblies to discuss the importance of inclusion.

Wilson said he hoped the bench would lead to many new friendships and fewer isolated children. Asked how he felt about completing the project, he said, "I'm proud because I finished my dream." NOTE: This story was written by Kent Pollock, a retired journalist who is Wilson's grandfather.





LETTER TO EDITOR

SUPERVISOR FROST
PROMOTES UNNECESSARY
AUSTERITY

Sacramento County Supervisor Frost's recent email newsletter in effect declares the County is "out of money." The County has a reserve of only 1.5% of its budget, while the next lowest County has 9.2%. Sacramento County "only saved 10% of the money [it] gained this year." When I objected to the austerity this implies, Ms. Frost asked whether I believed "we shouldn't have even saved the 10%?"

Never mind that this compares apples and oranges--is Tuolumne County's reserve an appropriate guide for what Sacramento's should be? And never mind how reserves vary over time--in 2007, Contra Costa County's reserves were -0.5% of their budget. What I suggest is that austerity entirely misses the point. Ms. Frost's "reserves" are insignificant compared to what she ignores.

Despite the widely held view to the contrary, public sector spending provides something of value to society at large. Good roads not only bring produce from farm to fork, they save tires and are a net benefit, though to the County, roads remain only a cost.

Reserves can magically appear too--Sacramento City recently gave the Kings a quarter billion dollar subsidy with money that appeared nowhere as reserves. Narrowly focusing on the County's budget reserves does not tell the whole story.

Ms. Frost might respond: "But we'd need to borrow or tax for a program of street improvements or something like "Housing First" for the homeless--which could save 50 - 80% of the \$40 million the region currently spends.

Yes, sometimes it takes money to save money. But if borrowing produces social benefits exceeding the cost of the loan, why not borrow?

Meanwhile: Why are we borrowing from private banks? A public bank could give the County a line of credit so it could have a "prudent reserve," and produce overall savings without shorting other programs or raising taxes. North Dakota has had public banking for nearly a century, borrowing at low rates, recycling repayment in-state

rather than sending the money to Wall Street. It has lower taxes than California and was one of the few states unscathed by the Great Recession.

Public banking is no novelty. Herbert Hoover's Reconstruction Finance Corporation funded the Tennessee Valley Authority, and the first Bay Bridge. Eisenhower ended the RFC, so, like the Kings stadium subsidy, Goldman Sachs underwrote the second Bay Bridge. California actually has an infrastructure bank, but in a suspicious twist, their underwriting is so restrictive that they couldn't fund the Bay Bridge rebuild.

The Bank of North Dakota's earnings exceeded Goldman Sachs'. Investing in public banking could provide the County's pension fund with better returns than Wall Street.

Meanwhile ordinary citizens get "We're out of money!" as a prelude to some sacrificed service, but when the plutocrats need a bailout--as the Kings' owners did, as Wall Street's Ponzi capitalists did in 2007-8--No problem! Take as much money as you want!

We've seen where austerity leads, too. Margaret Thatcher pled austerity and privatized U.K. public assets like their railways, where ticket prices promptly soared while levels of service declined. Before Thatcher, one in ten British children was poor; after, one in three. Once austerity arrives, funding declines persist, too. In California education funding is down 15.8% compared to pre-recession levels (in North Dakota it's up 38.6%!).

So Ms. Frost has my best wishes for her term as supervisor. It's a tough job, but I'll ask that she please not accept the "we're out of money" obsession as a viable excuse to cut County services. We're not out of money any more than the scorekeeper at the ball game is out of points.

One of Sacramento's greatest economic drivers is agriculture. Protecting our crops is crucial. Sacramento County has a new pest detection team. Cairo—a big black Labrador-and his handler, Mariah de Nijs, arrived in Sacramento this year.

Cairo was discovered in 2010 in a Georgia shelter by



the National Detector Dog During Training Center. his time in Georgia he worked with Smuggling Interdiction and Trade Compliance (SITC) and traveled the country intercepting federal quarantine material.

Mariah earned a Bachelor of Science in Animal Science and Management at the University of California, Davis, and has worked as an Agriculture and Standards inspector for more than 11 years.

In 2013, Cairo was teamed with

Mariah to protect California's from potentially produce invasive pests that could eradicate crops and crush the local agricultural economy.

The team begins each week with a full day of training, typically learning new scents in new places (like buses and stadiums) to make learning interesting. Cairo is never reprimanded. He is trained by being rewarded only when he makes a correct indication.





HOMEMADE CREAM OF MUSHROOM SOUP

Ingredients:

- 1/4 cup unsalted butter
- •3 cloves garlic, minced
- cremini 1/2 pounds mushrooms, thinly sliced
- · 1 onion, diced
- salt and freshly Kosher

ground black pepper, to taste

- •1 cup red wine
- 4 cups chicken broth
- •1 cup heavy cream
- 1/2 teaspoon dried thyme
- •2 tablespoons cornstarch Directions:

1.Melt butter in a large stockpot or Dutch oven over medium heat. Add garlic and mushrooms, and cook, stirring occasionally, until tender and browned, about 5-6 minutes; season with salt and pepper. to taste. Stir in onion and cook. stirring frequently, until translucent, about 2-3 minutes.

2.Stir in wine and bring to a boil; reduce heat and simmer until slightly reduced, about 5 minutes. Stir in chicken broth, heavy cream and thyme.

3.In a small bowl, whisk together cornstarch and 1/4 cup water. Stir in mixture to the soup until slightly thickened, about 1-2 minutes; season with salt and pepper, to taste. If the soup is too thin, add more cornstarch as needed until desired consistency is reached.

4. Serve immediately. Serves

TEETH CLEANING

It's Kathleen again. I would like to talk about the top reasons why canine dental cleaning is important to your dog. I prefer to have non-anesthetic teeth cleaning done on my personal dogs. Their teeth get cleaned every other month in order to prevent health issues.

Let's talk about anesthesia. I only have my animals put under if they must have major surgery. While this is my personal choice, it is based on a concern about the risks of anesthesia. These risks range from the mild, such as considerable itchiness, to the moderate, such as swelling at the injection site, to more serious outcomes such as anaphylactic shock or death. Many dogs that come to my grooming shop after having anesthesia are typically very itchy, with reddish skin and very matted hair, all resulting from scratching themselves because of the itchiness. But in some cases when dogs don't like to be touched in the mouth, or have major mouth/ teeth issues, teeth cleaning is important enough to have it done using anesthesia.

Bad breath, tartar, inflamed gums, and tooth loss, are some indications that you might want to see a canine tooth fairy. Dogs can start developing plaque and bad breath at the age of three. The American Animal Health Association (AAHA) has a new study that shows gum disease can lead to heart disease. Going from neglecting canine teeth to heart disease is a very scary



thought!

So how can we prevent our dogs from getting plaque/ tartar? Visiting a canine tooth fairy is a great start. I feed my dogs raw bones because chewing on them helps remove plaque. You can find raw bones and healthy food at local feed stores. Stay away from dog food or treats that contain wheat, gluten, soy or corn; saturated or trans fat: added sugar or salt: animal byproducts (gelatin, animal glycerin); chemical preservatives; artificial flavors or colors. Remember your dog is a carnivore related to wolves. They are supposed to have 70% water in their diets, and eat meat. guts, bone and seasonal fruit ind vegetables.

You have the power to dramatically improve and maintain your dog's health and reduce risk of diseases and other serious illnesses through diet, exercise, a home dental care program, and regular vet wellness exams

I hope you find these thoughts on the topic of teeth cleaning informative and helpful. It means so much to me to try to educate people about their canine partner, and in so doing become a small part of their lives!
