





For too long, the Sacramento region's economy has been almost entirely dependent on a single employer: the State of California. For years, regional leaders have talked about diversifying our economy so that our jobs market and local tax base are no longer so heavily reliant on the decision making of our State's elected leaders.

I am proud to announce that Sacramento County is leading the way to our region's new economy, not just by talking about it, but through actions that are bringing real, new, permanent jobs to our region.

The biggest highlight vet in this effort is Amazon.com's recentlyannounced decision to locate an 855,000 square foot fulfillment center in Metro Airpark, just of Sacramento east International Airport in the unincorporated area of Natomas. This fulfillment center will not only lead to more rapid deliveries for Amazon customers in the Sacramento region, it will employ over 1,000 people – good-paying,

permanent positions that will continue our region's recent economic recovery.

Other projects are in the works as well. It is our expectation that Amazon will be just the first in a number of successes at Metro Airpark, and that additional large-scale employers will locate there in coming years. As the infrastructure in the project area – including a new interchange with Highway 5 – is built, new jobs will come to our region rapidly.

Additionally, the County continues to lead the way to new jobs with the redevelopment of closed Campbell's Soup Factory. While its closure was a significant blow to our hopes at regional growth, its redevelopment represents a renaissance for one of the largest sites industrial infill anywhere in the region. New projects are in the works that I hope will be announced soon.

Additional investments are being made in other areas as well. The Sacramento Jet Center investing millions of dollars in a new general aviation facility at Mather Airport; the renewal of the Howe 'Bout Arden shopping center is well underway; and smaller shopping centers throughout the County are seeing new activity and investment.

All of these successes will

lead to a brighter future for the County, with a more stable economy. As we grow less reliant on the State of California, we will truly become what we have always known ourselves to be: a worldclass region with that is an excellent place to live and raise a family.

As always, I look forward to meeting the people I represent. I hold regular Community Cabinet meetings with my constituents. Orangevale, we meet on the first Friday of the month at 7:30am at Annie's Breakfasts and Steaks. In September, I will be hosting Sacramento County's Chief Probation Officer, Lee Seale, I look forward to seeing you there

# SUNNY DAYS, SICK PETS

Warm, dry weather is here to stay for the next few months. In addition to the browning lawns around town, our pets are also feeling the heat. It is important to keep your pets cool and well watered because it's even easier for them to suffer from heat stroke and dehydration. Mild cases can result in lethargy

and fever; but severe cases can cause coma or even death!

As humans, we're lucky to be able to sweat (and build air conditioning units!). Our furry family members are not as lucky! There is only so much that panting can do to cool off the body, especially in triple digit heat. If you are feeling hot, just remember your pet is feeling it worse!

The biggest thing to avoid is

keeping your pet out of hot cars. The heat inside a car can very quickly rise to oven-like temperatures. Even if your car is in the shade, with the windows cracked, your pet can experience heat stroke in a few minutes. Don't risk the quick run into the market. Just say no!

Even just being outside can be deadly without adequate water supply and cool shade. You should also consider providing a small wading pool to help them cool off. Dogs that are flat faced (pugs, bulldogs, Boston terriers, boxers, etc.) have a narrowed airway compared to their body weight so they have an even more difficult time keeping cool. For them, even with shade and water, just being in 90 degree heat can kill.

If you think your pet is overheated, douse them in cool water (no ice) and call your veterinarian immediately. Alcohol on the feet does not remove enough heat to be effective. Like other things in life, the best treatment is prevention!





been vou ever mesmerized by the electric pressure cooker infomercial? I have and I actually went out and bought a stovetop pressure cooker. It is amazing and it is not your grandmother's pressure cooker. The new ones have safety features that eliminate the past horrors of things exploding or flying off. Lynne Miles bought an electric pressure cooker called the Instant Pot in February and she LOVES it. Not only does it cook food fast, but it doesn't heat up the house for summer cooking.

Lvnne uses this pressure cooker for numerous items and recipes. One of the first, most miraculous, things she made was the potato salad. This recipe calls for cooking the potatoes and eggs together. For summer it's a great time and heat saver.

#### Quick Potato Salad in the **Pressure Cooker**

Yield: about 8 servings

- \* 6 medium russet potatoes. peeled and cubed
- \* 1 1/2 cups water
- \* 4 large eggs (Lynne uses 5)
- \* 1/4 cup finely chopped onion
- \* 1 cup mayonnaise
- \* 2 tablespoons finely chopped fresh parsley
- \* 1 tablespoon dill pickle juice
- \* 1 tablespoon mustard
- \* Salt and pepper to taste
- 1. Put the steamer basket in the pressure cooker pot. Add the water, potatoes, and the eggs. Lock lid in place, select High Pressure, 4 minutes cook time and press start.
- 2. When timer beeps, turn off pressure cooker and do a quick pressure release. When the pressure is released, carefully remove the lid. Remove the steamer basket from the pressure cooking pot. Put eggs into ice cold water to cool.
- 3. In a large bowl, combine the onion, mayo, parsley, pickle juice, and mustard. Add cooled potatoes and gently mix the mayonnaise mixture into the potatoes. Peel and dice three of the cooled eggs and stir into

potato salad. Add salt and pepper to taste. If needed, add more mayonnaise to achieve desired consistency.

4. Chill at least one hour before serving. Top with slices of remaining hard-boiled egg.
