

Eskaton's No Falls League Shares Moves for a Healthy Stance

Residents from Eskaton's two Roseville communities teamed up to promote National Fall Prevention Month this September. Led by their coach, Christy Barry, an Eskaton Fitness and Wellness Coordinator, the No Falls League developed a video to encourage people to exercise. These men and women, ages 67 to 95 years old, demonstrate low impact exercises. Regardless of age, these seniors prove exercise can be fun and easy for anyone. The moves Team Eskaton demonstrate on the football field are designed to strengthen muscles. improve coordination and reduce one's risk of falling by creating better balance.

"Gaining better balance is essential for the aging population," says Coach Barry. "One in three people over the age of 65 will fall this year. In the Sacramento region alone that can be well over 100,000 people." Barry teaches a 'Balance and Breathing' class weekly at Eskaton Village Roseville. The training starts by building confidence as the brain relearns how to move. As the body regains its balance capabilities, the individual feels success and moves on to more complicated mobility actions. "Once the brain remembers how to move and balance, the body reacts accordingly," she says. Barry's students have improved their balance with excellent results. One woman who hiked a narrow switchback trail said the side steps she'd done in class, plus the exercises for good posture, helped her complete the hike with confidence. Another woman on a cruise ship used the



weight shifting exercises to navigate the ocean's movement when she was standing still. Others told their coach of maintaining balance after missing a step because exercising regularly improved their reaction time.

Eskaton created the No Falls Video with Team Eskaton to give seniors a place to start improving their balance in a fun way. In addition to the 'how to' video, Eskaton is offering fall prevention classes open to the public. Check out Team Eskaton live on Sac and Company, ABC10, Sept 22 at 11:30am. Thev will demonstrate some exercises and "coach" Christy Barry will talk about the importance of fall prevention.







I shared this recipe a few years ago and I just made it again this week! Very yummy! I found this recipe when I was watching a daytime talk show. Usually the recipes are posted on their websites, but many times the recipes are different than what is viewed on the show. This recipe was pretty accurate, but I replaced the main flavor! The recipe is inspired by a Lavender Chicken recipe by Graham Elliot when he was on The Talk. The lavender did not sound good to me, so I replaced it with rosemary. It was wonderful with the rosemary, I cannot even imagine lavender!

Butter Fresh Rosemary- 2-3 sprigs remove from stem

Pepper and Salt

Yield 3 servings

1. Season chicken with salt and pepper.

2. Heat a small amount of olive oil and butter in a skillet over high heat.

3. Add chicken skin side down, cook 2 minutes and then reduce heat to medium high; continue cooking skin side down until fat renders and skin is golden brown about 5- 10 minutes.

4. Turn chicken over and add more butter (1 tablespoon) and the rosemary.

5. Continue cooking chicken and add more butter. Spoon the butter and the rosemary over the chicken as it is cooking.

6. Check chicken by cutting into the thickest part. If it is still pink, then butterfly the chicken (cut it so it is thinner) and continue spooning the pan juices over it; add more butter if needed. Keep burner



at medium or lower so you do not burn the butter.

 7. When meat is cooked through, remove from heat.
 8. Serve with your favorite potato and a salad.

This makes great leftovers for lunch!

Note: Use skin-on breasts because it keeps the moisture in and the crispy skin is delicious! (I doubled the recipe in the photo)

PETS

GOOD DOG, BAD BEHAVIOR

Most people do a great job teaching basic commands to their dog. Learning to sit, stay, and down lay a great foundation to communicate with your dog and maintain some basic control. The important thing I stress to pet owners is that this is the start of training and not the end! Even if you know how to teach your dog the basics, all dogs should go to obedience classes early; not only to for the social interaction of being out of the house with other people and dogs, but also to build your dog's confidence and help you maintain control in unfamiliar surroundings.

It can be easy for most dogs to focus on what their human

is trying to ask of them in the comfort of their own home. Frequently, this focus is lost when there are strange smells to investigate at the park or they see someone else throwing a ball. The key is impulse control. You want your dog to listen to you, even when they would rather go do other things.

When looking for a trainer, it is important to find someone practices positive who reinforcement. Avoid those who use pain or punishment as a tool. These can lead to more fear and frustration for your pet and other unwanted behaviors. When your dog does something undesirable. you should approach the situation calmly (difficult, I know!) and firmly. Your pet is very attuned to pick up on your emotions; frustration or anger will hinder their progress. Praise when they do well and stay consistent. Improvement can be lost if one family member lets the dog get away with bad behaviors.

The average dog can learn a vocabulary of 168 words, with some breeds going up to 500! The possibilities are much greater than most people realize. If you continue to teach new tricks and commands to your pet, you will be a long way towards a lasting bond with your pet, more control in unexpected situations, while limiting the destructive results of your dog becoming bored.




