Has Packed More Than 3.4 Million Meals

ROCKLIN – A local effort to pack meals for malnourished children around the world successfully packed 505,440 meals over a three-day period at William Jessup University in Rocklin.

The Rocklin Feed My Starving Children MobilePack[™] attracted nearly 2,500 volunteers from all walks of life – from children as young as 5 to seniors over 90 years old.

"We want to thank everyone who turned out to pack meals and so many local companies who partnered with us to make this possible," said Alexia Hall, chair of the organizing committee.

Organized groups of volunteers came from major corporations, churches, youth groups and various civic groups from throughout the area. One of the largest sponsors of the MobilePack,



Wells Fargo, sent nearly 100 volunteers to help with the packing.

The event was supported by a number of community organizations and businesses, including: Wells Fargo, St. Matthew's Lutheran Church in Rocklin and Randy Peters Catering & Event Center, each sponsoring more than 45,000 meals; Annie's Sno Biz, William Jessup University, Valley Springs Church and Kohl's, each sponsoring more than 22,000 meals; Wildlands, Law Offices of Sims, Lawrence & Arruti, UNFI, Advantage Marketing & Print, each sponsoring more than 11,000 meals; Reeve-Knight Construction, Halldin Public Relations, Kniesel's Auto Service Centers, Trudy van Dyk of Tru California Real Estate, and Westlake Grahl & Glover, each sponsoring more than 5,000 meals; CiminoCare, Propp, Christensen Caniglia CPAs, Umpqua Bank, U.S. Bank, Foothill Fire & Wire and U.S. Legal Support, each sponsoring more than 2,800 meals

Feed My Starving Children is a Christian non-profit that distributes culturally-neutral, nutritious meals to nearly 70 countries through more than 90 missions and humanitarian agencies. In most cases, the free food is used to operate orphanages, schools, clinics, and community feeding programs that contribute to long-term community development. "The community has supported our annual MobilePack for seven years," Hall said. "Each meal we pack costs just 22 cents but we couldn't pack more than 500,000 without the financial support so many organizations in our community have provided."

The meals packed will be shipped to communities where Feed My Starving Children works with local organizations that serve malnourished children. Last year, meals packed in Rocklin were sent to The Philippines, Myanmar and Thailand.





ORANGEVALE RESIDENTS PROTEST PLANNED RESIDENTIAL CENTER FOR MENTALLY ILL

Plans to open a 15-bed crisis treatment center for the mentally ill in a residential home on Elm Avenue are raising serious concerns among Orangevale citizens, who question why such a facility is being sited in a peaceful, residential neighborhood.

The facility's location is less than a block from Louis Pasteur Middle School and within a half-mile of three other schools. It is surrounded by homes with large lots, including many with horses.

The plan by Turning Point Community Programs was the subject of an emotional hearing before the Orangevale Community Planning Advisory Council (CPAC) Tuesday night (Nov. 1).

Residents who spoke had multiple concerns, including whether patients would include those with criminal records, why a commercial facility would be placed in a semirural setting with agricultural/ residential zoning, and why no notification had been made to the community.

Opponents also were concerned to learn that Turning Point had received a grant to open the facility and had purchased the property in August – before any public hearing and despite the fact that a use permit must first be obtained before it can open as a 15-bed mental health facility.

"This makes it look like a done deal—like we have no say in this at all," one resident told CPAC members.

"Why is the county always dumping on Orangevale?" another neighbor asked.

Residents protesting the facility acknowledged society's need for additional mental health services. But the audience agreed that a residential home on one acre in Orangevale is the wrong location for such a crisis treatment facility.

Concerns were expressed about the impacts on community character, a reduced sense of neighborhood safety, potential crime problems, noise problems for nearby neighbors, loitering by mental health patients who would be free to venture out onto Orangevale streets as well as traffic impacts from staff and visitors.

No vote was taken, and another hearing will be held once a formal application is received by the county in the coming weeks. Article and photo submitted by E.B of Orangevale

COWBOY COOKIES

1 cup white sugar 1 cup brown sugar 1 cup butter or margarine ¹/₄ cup corn oil 1 egg 1 teas vanilla 3 ½ cups flour 1 teas cream of tartar 1 teas soda 1 cup shredded coconut ¹/₂ cup chopped nuts 1 cup Rice Krispies

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Blend sugars, soft margarine/ butter and oil together, then add one egg and the vanilla and beat until it doesn't separate.

Sift together flour, soda and cream of tartar, then add coconut and nuts.

Mix liquid with ingredients. When mixture is fairly well mixed, fold in Rice Krispies.

Make dough balls and flatten with bottom of glass. Bake on greased cookie sheet or parchment paper.

Bake at 350 degrees for 10-12 minutes. Makes approx 76 yummy cookies.


This event is hosted by The American Legion, Post #637, Commanded by Paul Reyes and by The Veterans of Foreign Wars.
