This February marks the 30th year of business for the Boardwalk music venue here in Orangevale, and this established venue is ready to make some changes. For the past 3 decades the Boardwalk has hosted countless acts in the rock and hip hop genres, with the last 20 years featuring its large open dance floor allowing

company called Boardwalk Entertainment, LLC, providing a smaller music venue for bands playing for the owners of the larger Midtown club Ace of Spades. This contract with Boardwalk Entertainment runs out at the end of December 2016, and the owner of the Boardwalk has plans to take back control of the venue. Mark Earl, Boardwalk owner, says it's time for a change in both the appeal and layout. He plans to turn the open dance floor into additional seating with tables for food and drinks to create a more relaxed music enjoyment experience. Also part of the plan is to attempt to draw in a more mature audience. All age shows will still be hosted at the venue, however more frequently the bill will include country music groups, cover bands and jazz performances to give the 21 and over crowd an alternative to the popular



## LETTERS TO EDITOR

The notice arrived in our mailbox in late October, and when I read it my heart sunk: A company called Turning Point was proposing to open a 15-bed crisis center for mentally ill adults on Elm Avenue, across the street from our house.

To say our family was upset would be an enormous understatement. We bought our home in August, overjoyed at the prospect of raising our kids in a peaceful neighborhood where we could have a horse and chickens in the backyard and live the country lifestyle we had always coveted. Suddenly, we face the prospect of a commercial mental crisis treatment facility a few hundred feet from our door – and right on

the route our daughter was looking forward to walking when she starts junior high next year.

Everyone knows society needs more services for people struggling with mental illness, and I fully support that. But that's not the issue. The point is this provider picked the wrong location. The site is within a half-mile of four schools and is zoned agriculture/ residential, requiring the operator to obtain a county exemption and special permit.

People move to Orangevale expecting a safe, rural community where kids can ride bikes, play outside and set up a lemonade stand on a sunny day. Zoning is our insurance policy, a guarantee protecting that sort of life.

Unfortunately, the proposed facility would change all that, housing people who have just experienced a psychiatric crisis and, according to the state, are "at risk of harm to themselves or others." There is no lock on the facility door, no requirement that patients stay on the property or on their medication.

What if a patient decompensates, hears voices and acts out violently when schoolchildren are walking home on Elm? Can anyone promise this won't happen?

I don't think so. Brooke Damiano

As a 26-year resident of Orangevale, I am deeply disturbed by the recent article and subsequent letters to the editor regarding the proposed Crisis Residential Home, this program designed to help mentally ill persons in crisis safely and successfully transition back into the community.

Let me start by saying that there is not ONE of us who has not been touched in some way by mental illness, be it through an immediate family member, relative, friend or coworker. Mental illness is a disease, an illness not a crime. The Crisis Residential will house people who are CHOOSING wellness, who are hopeful for recovery and a safe transition back into the community, a return to their loved ones and a stable life.

Unfortunately, there are those who would say "that's fine, just not in MY neighborhood." implication is that people with mental illness are all criminals and child

That they molesters. should be rounded up and transplanted to "a more appropriate location." What you maybe didn't know is that there are mentally ill people already co-existing with you, for example the neighbor down the street who is schizophrenic, your teenager's classmate who is bipolar, the veteran around the corner with PTSD. All perhaps recently hospitalized.

As human beings, we fear what we do not understand. I challenge vou. Orangevale Community, to set aside your prejudices and to help us stamp out the stigma of mental illness. To help us help the suffering.

Orangevale is a largely Christian community. encourage you to re-read Matthew 25:34-40. Consider that you are there but for the grace of God




or two of them?



# HOLIDAY TIPS FOR

family and pets healthy to keep the holidays happy. Here are some potential home hazards to avoid that will help keep your pet out of danger this coming season.

Decorations/Wrapping This is supposed to be a fun time of year with decorations around the house and commonly wrapping paper and within ribbon easy reach of vour pet. solid Anv material ingested by your pet cause lead to a trip to the emergency room and possibly surgery. Especially dangerous are string or ribbon, so be sure supervise your pet playing with these tantalizing toys.

#### **Plants**

Many species of bulbs (iris, lilies, daffodils)

We all want to keep our that add some color during the fall and winter months are toxic to your pet's kidneys. Any part of the plant can be toxic so be wary of allowing your pet to even chew on the leaves. Poinsettias are actually not toxic, as commonly believed, but can cause stomach upset.

> Some types of mistletoe are very toxic to the liver so it is best to keep these out of your pet's reach.

#### Food

The holidays are a tempting time to indulge your pet with some scraps from the table. Be very cautious with grease or heavy (even turkey) foods they can cause

for pets if you want to spoil your pet this year. One common sugar replacer found in foods. gum and candies is xylitol. It is highly toxic, even in low amounts. It is also best to avoid allowing access macadamia nuts or grapes/raisins.

Chocolate is by far the most common offender on the list of holiday toxins to your pet. It acts as a stimulant that can, in low levels, cause stomach upset. Higher levels can cause rapid heart rate, tremors, seizures, or even death. As different types of chocolate can be more toxic than others, it is best to consult your veterinarian if you suspect your pet has



### GROOMING TIPS

**By Kathleen Schults** 

I would like to talk about the importance of professional grooming during the winter While everybody prefers their dog's hair long because of the cold, not many people understand how to care for the hair of medium/ long haired dogs and cats during this time of year. Now that the colder months are upon us, it is especially important to pay attention to the condition of your pets. Colder months bring more moisture in the air which causes the hair to come together to create possible mats when wet.

What are mats you ask? Mats are created by hairs that clump together as animals do what they do best. Those small everyday activities include activities such as going to the bathroom, going on a walk, and frolicking in the dog park. The

small tangles that get knotted together are typically dead undercoat and debris that gets tangled to create bigger mats. As the mats get closer to the skin, they can pull on the skin and cause it to become tender,


which results in your animal's discomfort. Where are mats commonly formed? Behind the ears, between and in front of the legs, in the groin area, under the collar or harness, and in the armpits. When brushing and combing are not on your daily or weekly schedule, depending on your animal, mats can increase in size and cause constant discomfort due to the constant tugging of the skin. Each time a pet gets wet, mats become larger and concentrated, causing more pain to the animal.

The importance of professional grooming on dogs and cats is because it can help take care of the matting before it even occurs. Most dogs and cats should be groomed every four to six weeks, and definitely within eight weeks. Most of my clients get their dogs bathed in between grooming six to eight weeks in order to maintain up the pet's healthy coat. It my be a surprise that short hair dogs are no exception -- Labradors, Boston Terrier, Pugs, you get the idea, all have undercoat also.

What is undercoat? It is the soft, downy and dull color hairs that often come out in clumps in short coated breeds. You may notice more shedding on shorter hair dogs such as Boxers because their hair follicles are on a shorter life cycle. It is the end of a hair follicle life cycle that causes all shedding. This is why all dogs and cats, whether short or long haired, benefit from professional grooming.
