These shows include the Colonial Theater's four live shadow renditions of "The Rocky Horror Picture Show" and several short film festivals in the cult classic and horror genres across different parts of the city. His events allow Sacramento's artists, performers and film makers to connect with the greater Sacramento community and drive the ever-growing Sacramento art scene. All of Meunier's previous fund raising events were directed at funding the various festivals and performances throughout the year, but for the first fund raising event of 2017, set to occur on January 28th, he wanted to reach out and help a local charity, and in the process bring to light an issue that hits close

to home for many of us. The event was properly named Louder Than Wolves, and was hosted by the Historic Colonial Theater in Sacramento and was produced with the help of performer, aerial instructor and friend Rebel Rose, who works with Momentum Dance and Fitness center in Davis and is also the director of aerial arts at Med+Fit Carmichael.

"The reason I threw this fundraiser was because nearly all the important people in my life have been directly affected by sexual assault. I was sick of people like Brock Turner and the system that allowed him to serve such a vanilla sentence. I'm not a politician. I wanted to use my skill set as a promoter to do something about this culture of rape that many deny exists." Tim

said.

Tim's lineup for the evening included short films made by local directors and actors, aerial and dance performances, spoken word and poetry, musical pieces and moving personal stories from victims of assault, both men and women. Some 17 acts took the stage throughout the night, with hosts Jamie DeWolf and Jaz Sufi. With 100% of both admission and silent auction sales being donated to WEAVE, Tim boasted that over two thousand dollars had already been collected in just the cash donations alone, and that the credit card donations were still being counted and would greatly increase the total. Many of the artists were also selling goods after the show, with their profits also being donated to WEAVE.

"I wanted a produce an event that celebrated survivor strength, to give voice to those who stayed silent too long, and to hopefully inspire hope and change while benefiting a charity that is proactive in helping the community in regards to surviving sexual assault. I wanted to create a safe place, even if it was for only one evening, for male and female survivors to potentially heal and be celebrated." Said Meunier. Tim has another charity event in the works for this year. the details of which are still being worked out. The Louder Than Wolves charity event is expected to return in 2018 for another drive to benefit WEAVE and can be found on Facebook.

SENATOR GAINES INTRODUCES BILL TO HELP BUSINESSES SAVE MONEY

SACRAMENTO – Senator Ted Gaines (R-El Dorado) today announced Senate Bill 13, which will provide much-needed tax relief to the manufacturing, research and development, software and agricultural industries by expanding an existing sales and use tax exemption.

"Small businesses are the backbone of California's economy and we need to do everything we can to make sure they capitalize on any available tax break," said Senator Gaines. "I will continue to push for lower taxes and simpler, less burdensome regulations to let employers know that California is open for business in order to get our economy back on track."

Existing law allows manufacturers and research and development companies a sales and use tax exemption for their qualifying tangible personal property purchases up to \$200 million a year. This includes property such as machinery and equipment used for manufacturing activities. Property that is considered to have a useful life of less than one year is excluded.

Senate Bill 13 seeks to expand the definition of businesses eligible to receive this exemption by including publishers software and others who conduct agricultural business activities. It will also increase the annual property purchase limit from \$200 to \$500 million a year. Finally, it will define property as having a useful life of one or more years if the property includes a warranty for one or more years.

Senator Gaines introduced this bill on the heels of recent reports indicating that the existing tax exemption has been severely underutilized. Since its inception on July 1, 2014 through September 30, 2016, businesses utilizing the exemption were only 21 percent of the original estimates made by the Department of Finance and Board of Equalization.

"My hope is that by clarifying and expanding the exemption, that more businesses will be able to take advantage of it," said Senator Gaines. "Businesses should be rewarded for their contributions to our state, not continually penalized at every turn. I'm going to let them keep more of the money they earn instead of shipping it to an unaccountable Sacramento."

Senator Ted Gaines represents the 1st Senate District, which includes all or parts of Alpine, El Dorado, Lassen, Modoc, Nevada, Placer, Plumas, Sacramento, Shasta, Sierra and Siskiyou counties.

Orangevale Recreation and Park District?

Orangevale residents: Representative democracy is a form of government founded on the principle of elected individuals serving a group of people. The more I read the more I learn about our recreation and park district, and what it should be. Orangevale Recreation and Park District is not the recreation and park district that was promised to us. Orangevale Recreation and Park District is fundamentally a self-serving authoritarian local government!

In 1983 Sacramento County Supervisors reorganized Orangevale Recreation and Park District specifically for Orangevale residents and to provide for their recreation and park needs. It was reorganized by County Supervisors (RESOLUTION NO. 83-1084) by a vote of Supervisors Bryan, Collin, Johnson; Ayes. Smoley, Sheedy; Noes.

County Supervisors held a public hearing (August 16, 1983) to hear all written and oral protests. If 25% of Orangevale residents opposed the reorganization, the matter of the reorganization would be put on the ballot for a public vote, only by Orangevale voters. Two (2) Orangevale residents opposed the reorganization.

Orangevale residents: After 33 years you will find no public records from Orangevale Recreation and Park District concerning the "true purpose" for the reorganization of Orangevale Recreation and Park District by County Supervisors. The District's 2009 (SAC-LAFCo) Municipal Service Review does not include our District's reorganization or history. Orangevale Recreation and Park District does not include Orangevale residents on its Organizational Chart.

Orangevale residents: We could have the recreation and park district that was promised to us, but we don't. It's the District Administrators District. It's the Board of Directors District. It's their lawyer's District. Fundamentally it's an authoritarian local government!





The head that sits upon our shoulders, should sit so our ear is over our shoulders. A majority of us carry a forward head, where the ear may be inline with our collar bone. Every inch our head sits beyond our shoulders adds 10 lbs of added weight to our cervical spine. This can stress our tendons, ligaments, muscles and fascia.

With so many hours spent working at a computer and looking down to read, this adds wear and tear on our cervical joints and connective tissue. Slowly whittling away at our uprightness.

Help yourself when reading or using a tablet by propping it up on a pillow. If working on a laptop, bring it closer to your body. Look out, and not down. You can also do neck stretches every 50 minutes to keep your joints hydrated. Start by tilting left then right, look left then right. Make side to side neck rolls, shoulder rolls and arm circles. These steps can help to prevent upper back tightness and headaches.


