



TO: Editor;

After reading the "Petacular teeth cleaning" article in the recent issue of the Orangevale View, as a medical professional I found it very difficult to leave the inaccuracies in the article unchallenged. The person writing the article is not a trained veterinary professional and some of the statements prove this. The most obvious inaccuracy that dogs are omnivores NOT carnivores as stated. The author also states, "considerable itchiness" is a potential side effect of anesthesia. I am not sure where this comes from: in the 26 years I have been in the field, 7 of which I have been a veterinarian. I have never experienced or heard about a case of generalized pruritus (itching post anesthesia). However, animals can lick at the site where the IV catheter was placed due to irritation from shaving. Sadly "anaphylactic shock or death" are potential side effects but thankfully very rare. The risk of not pursuing good dental care or other procedures often far outweighs the risks. As for non-anesthetic

As for non-anesthetic cleaning, this is not the best option for pets as the only source of oral hygiene. Significant disease can lurk below the gumline and without the ability to take whole mouth x-rays diseased teeth will be left behind. The infection will spread affecting other teeth, and there is concern that systemic

illness could occur due According to to this. AAHA (American Animal Hospital Association the correct use of the acronym) there is concern that non-anesthetic cleanings can be stressful and painful to animals. Many dental specialists and veterinarians have performed whole mouth extractions on pets that have routinely received non-anesthetic cleanings. The owners are shocked to learn their pet must lose all its teeth and often state: but I have been getting them cleaned regularly.

Small dogs have a genetic predisposition for poor oral hygiene despite some owners attempts at good oral health care. "Bad breath, tartar, inflamed gums, and tooth loss" are NOT indications to see the canine tooth fairy, they are indications to seek out a veterinarian who has access to whole mouth x-rays, and have an anesthetic dental to fully assess the state of the pet's oral health and treat appropriately.

The author and I agree when she states: "you have the power to dramatically improve and maintain your dog's health and reduce risk of disease and other serious illness through diet, exercise, a home dental care program, and regular vet wellness exams."

Ours is a small community but far-sighted and supportive use of water resources is a state-wide, world -wide concern in agriculture, a lack of which can and does, and is, resulting in devastation effect on people and nature. Maybe we can help.

OPERATION HOT SPOT

OPERATION: HOT SPOTS Human Trafficking "John" Stings

District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert announces "Operation: Hot Spots," a coordinated countywide sting operation aimed at reducing the demand side of human trafficking by targeting sex buyers.

Community based the organizations from Sacramento Together Against Human Trafficking coalition voiced the need to crack down on "Johns," who fund and sustain the sex trafficking trade. In response, DA Anne Marie Schubert led the effort to organize this countywide operation, with a commitment from law enforcement to conduct operations throughout the year to reduce sex trafficking.

The District Attorney's Office coordinated a training for law enforcement agencies with experts on human trafficking victims (adults and juveniles), suspect tactics/manipulations, trafficking investigations, what to look for and what evidence to collect for prosecutions as well as community resources and services available to victims of human trafficking. Victim advocates are also involved in the sting operations to assist with services if necessary.

On August 16, 2017,

multiple law enforcement agencies conducted sting operations throughout the county. In a show of support and importance of these efforts, DA Anne Marie Schubert joined Sheriff Scott Jones and Sacramento Police Chief Daniel Hahn on ride-alongs for street sting operations on Watt Ave. and Stockton Blvd.

Those convicted of soliciting another for prostitution or agreeing to engage in an act of prostitution, face a maximum penalty of 180 days in county jail, will be subject to search and seizure, and may be ordered to stay away from the involved locations or known "stroll" areas.

DA Schubert states, "Hearing the request of organizations and victims to expand our efforts in fighting human trafficking by targeting sex buyers, law enforcement our agencies are now working collaboratively to meet this challenge. Our county and city law enforcement sting operations should send a strong and unified message that purchasing sex from trafficking victims will not be tolerated in our community."




The Orangevale Food Bank will host its first ever annual Neighbors Helping Neighbors Dinner, Auction and Art on September 30th.
