



SENATOR GAINES SEEKS ENTRIES FOR FALL STUDENT VIDEO CONTEST

SACRAMENTO – Senator Ted Gaines (R-El Dorado) announced that he is hosting a Fall 2017 video contest and is seeking entries from high school and college undergraduates that reside in the 1st Senate District. The short, entertaining and creative videos will focus on the theme "The Bill of Rights & You."

"This is a great opportunity for students to demonstrate their video directing and producing skills and have their work displayed on my website," said Senator Gaines. "This contest celebrates the creativity and originality of our future leaders and I look forward to seeing what they come up with."

Participants must choose a Constitutional Amendment within the Bill of Rights and create a twoto five-minute video illustrating how it's benefitted them. The videos can feature live people, stills, animation whatever best conveys the message.

Videos can be submitted now through November 20, 2017. 

FREE MONEY DOESN'T EXIST

Free Money Doesn't Exist By County Supervisor **Sue Frost**

If someone were to offer to give you a modest down payment on a car that you otherwise couldn't afford, but left you the burden of paying expensive monthly loan payments, repairs, insurance, registration, gas, and all other ongoing expenses, would you consider that car to be "free?" I wouldn't, and I suspect most readers of the Orangevale View wouldn't either, because you would now be obligated to pay for something that you cannot afford. Yet that is exactly what the Sacramento Bee is claiming when they suggest that Sacramento County has "ignored millions in free money for homelessness."

To fill you in on the backstory, there is a federal grant that local municipalities can apply for called "Whole Person Care," which would fund a program

designed to help move the homeless people who use emergency rooms the most into more appropriate facilities for treatment. Sacramento City wanted to partner with Sacramento County to accept the money and jointly run a program. Sounds great, right?

Unfortunately, accepting this money doesn't make sense for several reasons.

First, this money isn't for ongoing funding, it's for a three year program - and after that three years is up we will be left to fund ourselves a program that costs \$64 million dollars annually. We would then need to either boot the homeless back to overcrowded hospitals, cut funding from other countywide services like police and roads, or raise taxes. None of those options are particularly attractive.

Second, the money would need to be used in a way that isn't very helpful to Sacramento County. This is because the money doesn't allow the spending on the two things we need most to help solve this problem, which are mental health services and housing. We don't need money to more efficiently connect the homeless with services, because we simply don't have enough services to connect them with (as can be witnessed by looking at the huge waitlists we currently have).

And last, in order to get the money Sacramento County would have to match the federal funds at a time when we have virtually no reserves. There is a significant cost associated with participating in this program, in addition to the fact that if we couldn't demonstrate improvements in certain

health outcomes, the federal portion of the money could be withheld.

In the end, Sacramento County decided to not apply for the "free money", and I am in complete support of that decision.

Instead of risking our money on this program, Sacramento County has focused its time and resources on programs that will offer more of what the homeless actually need. To help mental health we are investing in three new mental health crisis centers, opening a mental health urgent care center that can service 300-400 people, and increasing capacity at the Mental Health Treatment Center. And to help the housing problem we are creating a 24-hour homeless shelter to house 75 people each night, redesigning the family shelter system to provide housing for 33 families each night, and providing a shelter to high-risk families who cannot be diverted to permanent housing immediately while we assist them to find housing.

I recognize that these programs are not going to eliminate homelessness, because to be honest, we could probably throw hundreds of millions at this problem and still not eliminate homelessness (San Francisco spent \$275 million on homelessness last year, and their problem is only getting worse). But our programs are a good step forward to address our immediate needs while also refraining from spending outrageously. There are roughly 2,000 unsheltered homeless on any given night in Sacramento County, and 1,000 churches - perhaps a good, free solution would be to proactively help engage the faith community as part of the solution and build volunteer support.

Finally, I want to invite everyone to my next Orangevale community meeting on October 6th at 7:30am at Annie's Breakfast & Steaks (8800 Greenback Lane). It will be an opportunity for you to get an update from me, and to ask me any questions you may have. TIPS FOR YOUR FINAL WALKTHROUGH

As a buyer, one of the final things to do before getting the keys to your new home will be your final 'walkthrough'. So, what are some of the things you should know before you do? Here are a few things I share with my clients:

*Scheduling your final walkthrough.

The final walkthrough is typically done about one week before the closing date, but sometimes it can be done as little as 24 hours before closing. *Why is it necessary to do a final walkthrough?

The point of the walkthrough is to make sure the home is still in the same condition as it was when you made the offer. You will want to make sure all the major appliances and fixtures are still in place and that the home hasn't fallen into disrepair.

*What should you bring.

Generally, a copy of the home inspection and a checklist of things you want to make sure you check up on are all that's needed. Any red flags found during the home inspection should have been fixed by now, but you will still want to give the home a thorough once-over to check for any lingering issues. *Things should you check on during the walkthrough.

Verify that everything is working properly. This includes all the light fixtures, major appliances (including the heating and air conditioning), faucets, garbage disposal, and toilets. Be sure to check all of the windows and doors to make sure

that everything is in working order. Overall, you want to make sure that the home is still in the same or better condition as it was during your previous visits. Be sure to walk around the outside of the home to make sure that no exterior damage has occurred since your initial visits.

Once you are satisfied with the condition, your walkthrough is complete and you will be ready to seal the deal. Be sure to share any concerns you have with your real estate agent.




BLT PASTA SALAD

½ pound fusilli pasta or rotini

¹/₄ cup light mayonnaise (regular is my choice)

¼ cup lowfat buttermilk or milk (I only have milk on hand)

1 ½ teaspoon Dijon mustard



(I didn't have any and had to find a recipe online)
2 cloves garlic, minced
3/4 teaspoon fine sea salt
1/2 pound sliced bacon, cooked until crisp and chopped
2 large tomatoes, diced
1/2 red onion, diced
4 lightly packed cups of sliced romaine

Cook pasta according to

directions until just tender, drain, cool under cold running water and drain again.

SHOULD WE BE FEEDING RAW FOOD?

With more and more pet foods being marketed, trying to pick one is becoming increasingly difficult. Grain free, gluten free. and raw diets are being advocated for all pets by breeders, pet store employees, and even veterinarians. some Who can you trust? Ultimately, you should ask a veterinarian you trust as long as your pet does well on that diet. Much like people, one type of diet is not a perfect fit for every animal. Some pets with allergies do better without certain types of grain (NOTE-grain free diets are not meat only. Most contain potatoes or some other form of carbohydrate). Some pets have to have a home recipe specifically formulated veterinary nutritionists (yes they exist!) when no commercial product meets all their needs. Your veterinarian is the best person to ask about the specific health needs of your pet. This article is not to take place of that discussion.

Cats and dogs both deal

with the same health risks as humans with eating raw meat. There scientifically no documented benefit eating raw food, but there are risks. We see pets with both salmonella poisoning and parasites b from eating raw meat. You may have heard arguments such as "but that's what they eat in the wild" or "their stomach acids kill off all the bad bugs." Wild carnivores have these problems too, just not often enough to affect the population. Also, a wolf in the woods with worms is a different story than having a dog with worms sitting on your lap and licking your face. Although it's true that stomach acid is a first line of protection for any species, it's not fool proof. Canine stomach contents are not any more acidic than humans. Bottom line: once you find a commercial food formulated home recipe, iust make sure it's cooked.






