HUMANITY CALLS, AND A COMMUNITY ANSWERS By: Charlie Moynahan

Humanity is defined by "the quality or condition of being human", according to Webster's Dictionary. In 2017, many people have pondered the question of what level of humanity exists in the world, and if seeing visible examples of this virtue is even possible.

To the Orangevale Community, and now others across the world, the answer is a resounding "yes".

The story begins in 1933, when twins Gary and Klifford Koekoek were born in the Netherlands. Under Nazi rule, the brothers quickly discovered their life was going to be challenging – they just weren't quite sure that, after enduring battlefields and adjusting to life on more than one continent, they would be finding themselves stranded on the streets of Fair Oaks, homeless.

We all understand what it is to be human, and in times of dire need and duress, the need is never more present. This thinking is likely what propelled a family friend of the twins, Aaron Hoerner, to see if a simple Facebook post could awaken the empathy of people within his small niche of Orangevale. The post quickly caught the attention of news agencies, and soon Mr. Hoerner was being requested by



these broadcasters to setup a GoFundMe page.

"People will want to help, and will want to know where to do that most effectively," Aaron Hoerner was told. That night, his wife, Lisa Hoerner, setup an account with a humble request: \$5,000. "Please consider helping these wonderful members of our community be able to afford to find a place to call home," the GoFundMe request reads. In short, the Hoerners were asking for us to find our humanity for these two people who have experienced a tremendous loss. In under 12 hours, it quickly became apparent to Hoerners that their request of \$5,000 was going to be long forgotten. They had raised \$10,000 before noon the next day, and after a full 24 hours, they were approaching \$25,000. As of this writing, three days after the request had been

made, 2,463 members of "humanity" (from as near as Fair Oaks to the far reaches of the UK) have raised \$99,675 for these two veterans without a home.

The outpour of support has been positive and overwhelming. Soon after the fundraising account had been created. Aaron reached out to Gary Koekoek to let him know about the efforts to get them back inside solid shelter.

"He expressed so much hope with all the outpouring of love and support that they are receiving," Aaron recounted.

As they should. Humanity is about the quality or condition of being human. An idea so powerful, so humbling, that immediately it brings people in droves to fight for it. And with over 4,000 shares of this story on Facebook, humanity isn't slowing down anytime soon.



KICKING THE CAN DOWN THE ROAD

would like to pose a hypothetical to the readers of the Orangevale View. If you have a yearly income of \$40,000, a bank account with \$600 in savings, and you find out you have \$1,000 owed to you after you finish your tax returns, what would you do? Personally, I would save the money. Then, I would review my monthly expenses, find places to make some cuts, and do everything reasonably possible to increase my savings to a much higher number. Neglecting to do this could ultimately lead me to homelessness if I lost my job and couldn't quickly find one. I pose this question to you because Sacramento County was faced with this dilemma in the budget negotiations this past month, as we have a shockingly small amount in our reserves. We only have about 1.5% of our money in reserves when it should be closer to 15-20%. Of the larger counties in California, we have by far the lowest reserves, with the next lowest being Riverside with 9.2%, and the average being 26%. In hard numbers, our reserves are about \$300 million shy of where we should be. We also have a \$1.2 billion unfunded pension liability (and yes, you read that number right) but that's a story for another article.

So when I entered into budget negotiations with the knowledge that we had

an increase of \$47 million available funds this year to allocate, I thought it would be under the context of everyone making a deep commitment to increasing our reserves. But that is not what happened and instead, many of our discussions revolved around how to fund various new projects with the new money we had at our disposal. This was frustrating for me, because many of these new projects have great merit and I would gladly support most of them if we had the reserves to justify the expenditures.

But while I advocated for far more money to be put into reserves this year, I had to settle for the modest sum of \$4.7 million, which is 10% of the available funds we were to allocate. I supported some vital new projects, like the expansion of some of our services to reduce the growing problem of homelessness, but I could not support others, like doubling the Regional Parks budget.

Saving money is not fun and it doesn't catch headlines. But I believe you elected me to stand up for the taxpayers in Sacramento County, even if it's not particularly exciting. Reserves might not seem like

a big deal if you are looking at it in the short-term, but over time when another recession hits us we need reserves if we want to avoid the massive layoffs and disruptions of county services that happened in the mid-2000s.

Unfortunately we are not going to solve the problem of our reserves in the near future - we need to make this a priority for the years to come in order to dig us out of this hole. I would like to see us save 20% or more next year, and will be advocating that in the months to come. You have my commitment of continuing this fight until our fiscal house is in order.



First Things to Do After You Move In To Your Home

Do My Spouse and Kids Inherit Everything if I Die Without a Will?

Many people think that if they die while they are married, their spouse and kids automatically inherit everything. Dying with out a will is called "intestate". Each state has differing intestate laws. The general rule is that your spouse will receive a portion, and the rest is divided among your heirs. We will look more closely at California Inheritance Laws in our next article. However consider these four additional questions:

Who will be your kids' legal guardian?

If both of the parents of

minor-aged children die intestate or without a will and trust, the children are left without a legal guardian. Without this being in a will or trust, a court will appoint someone to be the children's guardian. The judge seeks to act in the children's best interests and gathers information on the parents. the children, and the family circumstances. The judge may not make the decision that you, as a parent, would have made.

What about your family structure?

When intestate laws were originally written, it was assumed that families consisted of a mother and a father and their natural born children. Many families are

not structured this way. This can get legally complicated and is out of your hands if you die intestate. With a will or trust, you control your estate and essentially eliminate the risk of your assets going to unintended family members.

What happens if you are separated from your spouse? If you are separated from your spouse when you die, state law decides what happens to your estate. The court often ignores your separation and just considers you still legally married.




