

SACRAMENTO – Senator Ted Gaines (R-El Dorado), with members along of the Haggard family, other dignitaries and community leaders held a dedication ceremony today honoring country music Merle legend Haggard and naming in his memory the overpass at the interchange of Interstate 5 and State Highway Route 44 in Redding as the "Merle Haggard Memorial **Overpass.**"

"The passing of this music icon was not only a great loss to his family and friends, but also to his millions of fans around the world," said Senator Gaines. "He was utterly unique in both his life and his music and I believe this memorial is a fitting tribute to him in Shasta County where he called home."

Merle Haggard lived in Palo Cedro in Shasta County for years before his death last year at the age of 79. Senator Gaines authored Senate Concurrent Resolution 139, allowing this overpass to be dedicated in Haggard's memory.

Legislative Although action is required to name state highways, state law precludes the use of state funds to pay for memorial signs. Luckily, Billy Pilgrim and Patrick John of country radio station Q97 in Redding took on the cause and spearheaded the fundraising effort by informing their listeners and selling t-shirts featuring an image of the memorial sign. The response was enormous and the money was quickly raised.

According to the California Department of Transportation, thousands of vehicles drive daily across the "Merle Haggard Memorial Overpass" and millions of drivers will see the signs

each year.

"Merle would've been proud to have an overpass named after him," said widow, Theresa Haggard.

Throughout his career, Merle Haggard achieved numerous hits including "Swinging Doors." "The Bottle Let Me Down," "I'm a Lonesome Fugitive," "Workin' Man Blues," and "Okie from Muskogee." These hits multiple earned him **GRAMMY** Awards. the Kennedy Center honors and various Academy of **Country Music Awards.**

## CALIFORNIA CANNOT REMAIN A SANCTUARY STATE



California Cannot Remain a Sanctuary State

If there is one thing Californians agree on, it is that our elected officials focus too much on political posturing and too little on the public interest. This penchant for putting political theatrics over sound public policy reached a new low with the Legislature's recent passage of a bill making California a "Sanctuary State."

Senate Bill 54, which I led the fight against in the Assembly Judiciarv Committee, will move California's relationship with the federal government into unprecedented and quite unconstitutional possibly territory. Introduced in December of 2016, when President Obama was still in office, the bill upends what has always been a key area of bipartisan consensus: that immigration enforcement should focus first and foremost on people who have committed crimes.

Specifically, SB 54 requires local law enforcement to ignore requests from federal officials to detain individuals, before they are released from a county jail, who have both violated immigration law and been arrested for a crime. Such cooperation across levels of government has been standard practice for decades, yet SB 54 prohibits it in all cases where the offender has not been charged with a serious felony. Under the California penal code, that would include crimes such as assault on a police officer, animal abuse, and gang-related activity. The bill has received near unanimous opposition from law enforcement, who warn it will jeopardize public safety. Even Governor Jerry Brown balked at this radical idea before ultimately being pressured to sign a modified version.

The concern is not merely offenders that released will re-victimize their communities. The kev issue is where immigration enforcement takes place. Federal authorities have long been tasked with finding individuals who have a criminal record and who pose a threat to public safety. This bill, by all but preventing orderly transfers of custody for such offenders in the safety of a local jail, moves enforcement actions into the community where they are inherently riskier and more

disruptive.

I would not be surprised if the Sanctuary State bill is struck down by the courts or even counteracted by Congress. The greater challenge will be reversing course in a state that for too long has neglected public safety concerns and stripped law enforcement of the tools they need to keep the public safe. In the coming year, I will be working with legislators in both parties to put politics aside and once again put the safety of our communities first.

## A HIDDEN REASON HOMELESSNESS IS EXPLODING

Homelessness is on the rise in Orangevale, and Sacramento County in general. The issue is evident just by keeping your eyes peeled while taking a short drive in any direction. Not to mention it being constantly talked about in public meetings, newspapers, radio, and the dinner table.

The reasons for this include many things out of our control, such as: rising housing costs. stagnant incomes, savings rates, and regional and national trends. But the fact remains that data shows homelessness in Sacramento County is rising faster than our neighboring counties, with a 30% increase in the past two years. Some counties that have huge borders with Sacramento, like Yolo and San Joaquin, have even decreased their homeless population in the same timeframe. Contra Costa County, our only neighboring county with a comparable population, decreased by an impressive 20%. This indicates to me that something we are doing locally is negatively impacting things, and I want to take a moment to explain to you what I think that "something" is.

It all revolves around the

settlement of a class action lawsuit against Sacramento County in 2010. In the lawsuit which Sacramento County lost, it was found that homeless camps were being removed without enough warning being given to the homeless to secure their belongings before they were destroyed. As a result, Sacramento County must do two things that other jurisdictions do not. First, we must give homeless camps 48 hours to move their camp. Second, if they do not move their camp within 48 hours, we must place their possessions in storage for 90 days and allow them to pick

them up.

While the implications of these two stipulations may not seem negative at first glance, they have some major repercussions. Because we have laws that are less strict than every county surrounding ours, the following is an example of a scenario that plays out time and time again. Sheriffs in a neighboring county find a homeless camp with nobody in it, so they immediately dispose of the camp and clean up the area. The homeless individual returns to find their camp destroyed, and then hear rumors that Sacramento County won't throw away their items. In fact, Sacramento County is so lenient that as long as they return to their camp every 48 hours they have nothing to worry about, and even if they don't return within 48 hours they can always go recover their items from storage. So naturally, they move to Sacramento County and end up staying.

While this is all bad news for Orangevale, it does not mean things are hopeless. It simply means we have to be a more vigilant and proactive community to earn the results neighboring counties are achieving. When you see a homeless camp, report it by calling 3-1-1 or by downloading the phone application by going www.311.saccounty. to net. If you want to donate your money, please refrain from giving it straight to the homeless, and instead give it to organizations that help them improve their This way you situation. can ensure your money is going towards putting a roof over their head or helping connect them with mental health support. If you want a list of great nonprofits to choose from please contact mv office.

Finally, I want to invite evervone to a special Orangevale Community Meeting I am holding with Assemblyman Kevin Kilev on November 13th at 9:00 am at the Orangevale Grange (5807 Walnut). It will be an opportunity for you to get an update from us, and to ask me any questions you may have. 
