You and Your Father knew at creation, that we, Your chosen would need affirmation.





Headricks have been residents of Orangevale since the 1950's. If you went to either Casa Robles or Bella Vista in the 60's or 70's there is a good chance you went to school with one of them, Larry, Annie, John, Ralph, and Mike Guttenberg or Launay, Moni, Mimi, Kevin, and Kym Headrick. In the early 80's Ralph Guttenberg and Kym Headrick were married and started their very own family right here in Orangevale. Together they had 3 children and worked very hard to provide a great life for their little family. Unfortunately, no amount of hard work could have prevented the tragic events of November 28th, 2003. Their oldest son Wyatt was attending a party with his friends. The events of that evening would forever alter the course of not just Wyatt's life, but the entire family. Towards the end of the evening an altercation occurred and while protecting his friends Wyatt was stabbed in the back of the neck, unbeknownst to him, cutting a ligament in his spine. Moments later as he fled to a friends truck, he unfortunately didn't make it all the way in before his friend accelerated, Wyatt fell out, hit his head and broke his neck. It was at that moment he realized he couldn't move. His friends immediately picked him up and rushed him to the hospital where he stayed for 5 months. That year he spent his 21st birthday, Christmas, and New Years in the hospital. Wyatt is now quadriplegic, but his injury is complex. It is considered an "incomplete injury" meaning his legs are typically numb and he has no control of them but every once in a while he has a little bit of feeling and/or a little bit of movement. Unfortunately neither are consistent or functional enough for him to take advantage of. The backside of his arms are numb including his hands but his biceps and the tops of his forearms function normally. Thankfully no brain damage occurred and Wyatt



about music & sports. Due to the extent of his injury his treatment options have been very limited in our area. There are no doctors that specialize or treat his type of spinal cord injury in Sacramento but thanks to modern medicine there are a lot of options available in other areas and Wyatt has researched them all (if you know Wyatt you know how he is about research) and after literally years, he has decided to give stem cell therapy a shot. Unfortunately its not that easy though, not only is it not covered by insurance, but it's also not approved in the United States. There is an amazing facility in Panama City, Panama called Stem Cell Institute (https://www.cell\_medicine.com) with an astonishing success rate. I think it is also important to note that this facility uses ethically harvested stem cells. The stem cells they will use will come from Wyatt's hip and from post birth umbilical cords. With treatment and travel expenses for the month it is going to be VERY expensive. Please consider helping this long time

Orangevale family in getting one of their own back on his feet. This treatment could very well give Wyatt a second chance at living the life he's always dreamt of. Since his injury his parents have cared for him every single day. As I mentioned before they are both hard working. Ralph started working for Tom Tomich when he was 15 and continued to help Tom around the orchard regularly until the day they closed the fruit stand. He was also a truck driver for UPS for many years until he retired this year. His mother worked a full time office job until Wyatt's injury and has since dedicated her life to caring for him. These are honest, hard working members of our community and hopefully we can rally around them and make this treatment a reality for their beloved son.



# BODYCAMS FOR SACRAMENTO COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT

#### Bodycams for Sacramento County Sheriff's Department By County Supervisor Sue Frost

It is a difficult time to be a police officer in the United States. While it may or may not be fair, incidents across the country have left many people feeling deeply negative towards how officers handle difficult situations. In response, many departments are equipping their officers with body cameras. I bring this up because it was recently announced that the Sacramento County Sheriff will soon be conducting research to identify possible vendors to supply the department with body cameras for officers to

In a day and age where transparency, accountability, and building trust are more important than ever for departments across the country, I applaud our Sheriff for seriously looking at implementing this emerging technology. I have three main reasons for supporting body cameras

First, the video collected by body cameras help juries paint an accurate picture of what happened in an incident. Whether that comes in the form of helping convict more criminals, or proving the innocence of the accused, society is better off for it. It will also provide clarity in cases of suspected police misconduct, as corrupt police officers will be more likely to be caught, and the honorable ones will be more likely to be exonerated.

Speaking of police misconduct, my second reason for supporting body cameras is that it causes improved behavior by everyone involved. Officers tend to be on better behavior when they know they are being watched, and the likelihood of citizens acting aggressively towards officers also diminishes. It also allows officers to review their own footage and improve how they handle their interactions. Speaking personally, the first time I was interviewed on TV I cringed a little as I evaluated my performance, but it served as a great learning opportunity and helped me improve.

My third reason is because it quantifiably reduces and complaints related expenses, as departments across the country are seeing positive results. In one study performed by the Rialto police department, it was found that there was a 60% reduction in use of force incidents and an 88% reduction in the number of citizen complaints. I also believe these cameras could present a fantastic opportunity for the Sheriff's Department to give the public a good idea of what the average day is like for an officer and potentially highlight the everyday good that officers do for our community.

But while there are numerous proven benefits to recording police interventions, there are also potential pitfalls, and this makes the careful approach the Sheriff is taking all the more important.

Like all new technology, there are large upfront costs associated with the cameras. This cost takes the form of the physical cost of the cameras themselves, and also the cost of storing the evidence and public records requests. While agencies certainly save time collecting and managing digital photographic evidence - video evidence requires an investment in either cloudbased storage systems or physical storage hardware, both of which are expensive. I have concerns about personal privacy while officers are in private residences and how evidence that could impact the outcome of a trial would be managed. There's also the problem of doing too much too fast, as when you have been doing the same job for twenty or more years, it can be a challenge to suddenly change procedures.

# TIME TO STOP THE HIGH SPEED RAIL BOONDOGGLE

#### Time to Stop the High Speed Rail Boondoggle

Never in the history of California, and perhaps the United States, have we seen a project with as little upside at as much cost as High Speed Rail

Inspired by the bullet trains of Europe and Japan, the project was always an odd fit for California. Most high-speed rail lines lose money, surviving off a blend of political patronage and creative accounting. In the few places worldwide where they do turn a profit, like the Tokyo-Osaka corridor, population density is roughly twice that of California. Factor in several additional challenges unique to our state such as the rugged terrain, or environmental regulations that stymie even the most deserving projects - and you have the makings of a train wreck.

It should be no surprise that, after nearly a decade, only a few miles of track have been laid, and cost estimates have soared to a staggering \$68 billion.

And things keep getting worse. Just over the last few months, projected costs for construction in the Central Valley have risen by another \$1.7 billion;

engineers have cast doubt on the technical feasibility of blasting through California mountain ranges; and the Rail Authority has announced that, yet again, it would miss by two years the deadline to complete the project's environmental impact reports. Investors are fleeing. Exasperated executives are tendering their resignations. Yet legislative leaders continue pouring billions into a project that, if ever operational, would be both the world's slowest and its most expensive "highspeed" rail service.

Meanwhile, these same lawmakers have just imposed the largest gas tax increase in state history. All of the road work this massive tax is supposed to pay for could easily be funded, without new taxes, if the money for High Speed Rail were cut off and redirected. In fact, billions would be left over to either return to taxpayers or invest in real transportation improvements that could reduce local commute times, improve safety, and better integrate regional economies.

That's why I adamantly opposed the gas tax, why I fully support its repeal, and why I have co-authored legislation to instead fund desperately needed road repair by terminating High Speed Rail. With the mounting controversy surrounding the bullet train, and with Governor Brown, its chief advocate, nearing the end of his term, it is time for legislators from both parties to come together and finally get our state on the right track.







# rangevale Cooks



by Suzanne Feblowitz

Phil in Orangevale shares how he uses up his leftover Every year after turkev. Thanksgiving, he finds that he has loads of leftover turkey. Even after a couple of days of sandwiches, he easily has three or four pounds of meat sitting in the fridge. And as each day passes, it gets harder and harder to convince people to eat turkey yet again. Phil needed to come up with something innovative that he could make that wouldn't send his kids running for the cold cereal.

As such, Phil created the following recipe for leftover turkey crepes. It might seem a bit intimidating at first (Crepes? Roux?), but once you give it a try, you'll find it's really pretty simple.

#### For the Crepes:

2 cups milk

- 1 1/3 cups all-purpose flour Pinch of salt
- 3 teaspoons butter, melted and cooled
- 2 whole eggs + two egg yolks Combine all ingredients and whisk until a thin batter forms. Refrigerate for one hour. For the Filling:
- 2-3 lbs leftover turkey (dark or light meat), finely chopped
- 3 tablespoons extra virgin olive

- 2 small shallots, minced
- 4-5 cloves of garlic, minced
- 3 stalks of celery, minced
- 2 tablespoons finely chopped fresh rosemary
- 2 tablespoons finely chopped fresh thyme
- 3 cups turkey stock (chicken stock can be used if turkey stock is not readily available) Basic roux (see recipe below) Salt and pepper to taste
- 1. Heat the olive oil in a large skillet over medium heat.
- 2. Add the turkey and cook for 2 minutes.
- 3. Add the shallots, garlic, celery, rosemary, thyme and salt/pepper. Stir and cook for 4 minutes.
- 4. Add the turkey stock. Bring to a light boil and simmer for 7 minutes.
- 5. Add the roux and stir to combine. Simmer for 5 minutes, then reduce heat to low.
- 6. On another burner, place a small saucepan over low heat.
- 7. Once the turkey mixture thickens, spoon it through a strainer into the saucepan. The idea is to separate the mixture from the "sauce."
- 8. Keep the sauce warm in the saucepan and return the turkey mixture to the skillet. Keep

warm over low heat. To make the crepes:

Heat a large pan over medium heat. Spray the pan with cooking spray.

Pour 1/4 cup of the crepe batter into the pan, tilting the skillet back and forth to form the crepe. Make sure not to use too much batter, the crepe should be thin. Cook 2-5 minutes, flipping once, until golden on both sides. Repeat with remaining batter.

To assemble: Lay a crepe out on a plate and spoon 1/2 cup of the turkey filling into the center. Fold the crepe in half over the turkey mixture (taco shape), then fold in half again. Top with an additional 1/4 cup of the mixture, then spoon the desired amount of reserved sauce over the top.

Serve with leftover stuffing, cranberry sauce, green bean casserole, etc. and enjoy!

Basic Roux Recipe

Melt 4 tablespoons butter in a skillet over medium heat

Add 6 tablespoons all-purpose flour and stir to combine

Toast mixture until mostly solid and lightly browned, remove from heat

NOTE: Roux can be made in advance and refrigerated for several weeks

We all want to keep our family and pets healthy to keep the holidays happy. Here are some potential home hazards to avoid that will help keep your pet out of danger this coming season.

Decorations/Wrapping This is supposed to be a fun time of year with decorations around the house and commonly wrapping paper ribbon within easy reach of your pet. Any solid material ingested by your pet cause lead to a trip to the emergency room and possibly surgery. Especially dangerous are string or ribbon, so be sure supervise your pet playing with these tantalizing toys.

#### **Plants**

Many species of bulbs It is safest get special

(iris, lilies, daffodils) that add some color during the fall and winter months are toxic to your pet's kidneys. Any part of the plant can be toxic so be wary of allowing your pet to even chew on the leaves.

Poinsettias are actually not toxic, as commonly believed, but can cause stomach upset.

Some types of mistletoe are very toxic to the liver so it is best to keep these out of your pet's reach.

#### Food

holidays are The tempting time to indulge your pet with some scraps from the table. Be very cautious with grease or heavy foods (even turkey) as they can cause anything from diarrhea to lifethreatening pancreatitis.

treats made for pets if you want to spoil your pet this vear.

One common replacer found in foods, gum and candies is xylitol. It is highly toxic, even in low amounts. It is also best to avoid allowing access to macadamia nuts or grapes/raisins.

Chocolate is by far the most common offender on the list of holiday toxins to your pet. It acts as a stimulant that can, in low levels, cause stomach upset. Higher levels can cause rapid heart rate, tremors, seizures, or even death. As different types of chocolate can be more toxic than others, it is best to consult your veterinarian if you suspect your pet has eaten any amount.


