SUPERVISOR FROST'S ORANGEVALE COMMUNITY MEETING

Supervisor Frost's Community Meeting began by reporting on the results of the Community Survey and invited audience questions, concerns, and feedback. A few highlights:

"Survey #2" is currently posted to Supervisor Frost's web page: http:// www.bos.saccounty.net/District4/ Pages/default.aspx

77.5% oppose the gas tax as a way to pay for the \$57 billion in deferred maintenance projects.

After less than 23% noted they are in favor of Accessory Dwellings in Orangevale, the definition of Accessory Dwellings was discussed ("granny flats, in-law quarters, etc.") and will be clarified on future

58.7% do not want the proposed Health facility Orangevale.

Homelessness was ranked as a "real problem" (3-4 range) in our area.

The community is "embracing" the reduction of 32 polling places down to two voting centers and the automatic mailing of absentee ballots. The location of the Voting Centers is still being determined, but will open 10 to 11 days before the election. A tip: Based on the experiences in other states, if you chose to go to a voting center on the last day during the next election, be aware that you may be standing in line for hours.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT ORANGEVALE COMMUNITY MEETING

The North Division Community Meeting began by reporting the latest community updates and invited audience questions, concerns, and feedback. A few highlights:

(K9) Canine Bureau Presentation:

Sergeant Mark Limbird gave a presentation about the K9 program including dog selection, training, and use in crime prevention and enforcement. A few tips about interacting with the dogs:

-If you see a deputy and K9 officer at a community event, you are welcome to approach and ask to pet the dog. However, please do not approach if you have another dog with you.

-If you hear an announcement to stay inside, please heed that warning and do not go outside to investigate noises as it may be the dog or the person they are looking for. If you hear a noise, call it in.

-While the dogs are selected for their sociability, they do have a prey drive. If you cross paths with a dog while he is working, stand your ground and look firm.

Deputy Ken Becker introduced Ranger, a five year old Dutch Shepherd, and discussed common commands and training.

Homeless Outreach Team (HOT): NorthHOT@sacsheriff.

Deputy Jim Knacke reported on camp clean-up efforts and acknowledged the support of the Board of Directors in working to solve homelessness through outreach, connecting to services. and increased personnel.

To help homeless veterans into services, report where they hangout and their name, if you know it.

Patience is urged as they work on way to pay for tow service and bid for contracts.

In the meantime, report by phone or email: where it is, what it is, who is in it, and whether it is chronically out of registration or on blocks. Continue to contact and describe the problem as they move locations so it can be tracked.

Reporting Issues to the Sacramento Sheriff Department: -"Be a good witness:" report where it is, what it is, and who is involved. The more reports are received, the more information the Deputies have to track and address the problem.

-Contact can be via phone and email. Include your contact information for follow-up.

-If you have surveillance cameras: Register them with the Sheriff's Electronic Eye (S.E.E.) program: https://www. sacsheriff.com/Pages/SEE/SEE. aspx | Registered cameras are added to a map and if a crime occurs in your area, you will be contacted for permission to see the footage. Footage will only be taken if there is evidence of a crime.

Sergeant Tom Bland reported on and answered questions about the latest crime statistics, focusing on Burglary from a Motor Vehicle. Some tips:

-Remove everything from the vehicle, as thieves will breakin for anything that appears valuable and/or may contain something of value.

-Make sure to lock your vehicle and turn on your lights at night.

Sergeant Tom Bland then answered questions about the new changes in the marijuana laws.

The next Sacramento County Sheriff Orangevale Community Meeting will be on Tuesday, March 14, 2018 at 6:00 PM at the Orangevale Community Center.

HIGH SPEED RAIL IS SLOWING YOU DOWN

High Speed Rail is Slowing you Down By County Supervisor Sue Frost

As I enter my second year as your County Supervisor, I find myself reflecting on what I have learned about the communities that I represent. I have learned that we have a community of people in Orangevale who love where they live and constantly want to help pitch-in to improve things. I have learned that people are passionate about keeping Orangevale more rural than surrounding communities. And I have learned that people here are generally happy if the roads are in good condition. Unfortunately, the roads are in a horrible condition and residents Orangevale rightfully upset.

I get it because I am upset myself. I see the deterioration of the streets that have needed repaving for years, and just last month I had to pay \$500 for new tires that my mechanic directly attributed to poor road conditions (tires I bought only 2 years ago). Because of this frustration, the question I get more than any other lately from residents in Orangevale is, "why can't you prioritize road repairs in our community?" I wish it were that simple, because if it were I would have done it many months ago. So I wanted to take this opportunity in my monthly article to explain to you why it's not so simple, and what we can do to change things.

What many people do not understand is that the vast majority of funds that are spent on local roads are from the state and federal government. Not only that, but many of these funds are competitive dollars, meaning we are only going to win those funds for major projects that have nothing to do with resurfacing, like the road widening happening right now on Hazel Avenue. So even if I wanted to prioritize local road resurfacings, the money Sacramento County divert towards roads would be insignificantly small compared to what the state and federal government have the ability to do. And this completely ignores the fact that Sacramento County has virtually zero reserves in our budget (if we had to rely solely on reserves, we would only have enough money to last us eight days).

The problem Sacramento County is experiencing with our roads is not localized to just our county or even region. This is a problem afflicting the entire State of California, as of last count our state had over \$57 billion in road maintenance that has been postponed due to not having enough money for our roads, highways, and bridges (also called deferred maintenance). This enormous deferred maintenance bill would feel more understandable if California was broke, but at the same time we have this bill we are spending outrageous amounts of money on California High-Speed Rail (CAHSR), which in my opinion is only a fraction as important as having reliable roads. CAHSR has the potential to benefit a small fraction of the population, specifically those that would use it to commute. Meanwhile, roads are used by everyone, including passengers, freight, fire service, police service, etc. To top it off, the train doesn't even come close to Orangevale, as the furthest north it goes is San Francisco.

When voters approved CAHSR, it was supposed to cost \$40

billion. As of today, the current estimate has risen to \$79 billion, and experts are now expecting that by the time the project is completed it will cost nearly \$100 billion. The first segment of CAHSR is currently being constructed - it is 118 miles through the Central Valley from Merced to Shafter and is supposed to be the easiest part of the construction. Just how easy is the "easy" part? It was expected to be done this year and cost \$6.4 billion, but is now expected to be finished in 2024 and will cost \$10 billion.

Even if we let CAHSR continue to build the central valley line and we abandoned CAHSR after that, we would save enough money to pay for every cent of deferred maintenance for all roads, highways, and bridges in California. Not only that, but we would also save enough to pay for all deferred maintenance in every department across the State, including things like water systems, courts, parks, colleges, fairs, etc. The California Legislature and the Governor have the capacity to fix our roads, they just need to change their priorities and focus on what California needs the



Attendees can also enter a drawing for camellia plants. Tours of Murer House and Gardens will be offered that day.



rangevale Cooks

Whenever a cross rib roast is on sale, I always pick one up! I use it for pot roast or for meat for burritos or tacos. I was tired of my usual recipe. so I looked up recipes on the internet and I found two that I mixed together to get a yummy recipe for shredded beef for tacos. We had enough left over for another meal, but I took it for lunch for a few days! It was the best recipe that I have made for shredded beef!

SHREDDED **BEEF TACOS**

3 lb. Cross Rib Roast (amount can vary)

1 onion, sliced

1 cup beef broth

1 4 ounce can chopped green

chilies 2-3 garlic cloves, chopped ½ tsp. cumin Olive oil (1-2 tbsp) Salt and pepper

1. Season roast with salt and pepper. Place olive oil in large pan over medium heat. Sear the roast on all sides until browned. Remove from pan and place in slow cooker. 2. Reduce heat and add onions to pan (you may need to add a drop of olive oil). Cook until softened, then add a bit of water and stir to get the browned bits off the bottom of the pan. Add onions and browned bits to the top of the roast in the slow cooker.

- 3. Add broth, garlic, chilies and cumin to the slow cooker. 4. Cook on low for 7-10 hours 5. Remove roast and let sit before shredding or breaking it into pieces. Keep it moist with the juices. (If you have a gravy separator, you can separate the fat from the broth.)
- 6. Serve with small corn tortillas for street tacos or serve with flour tortillas for

a burrito.

Note: I made this a day ahead and when it was finished cooking, after it cooled, I put the whole inside of my slow cooker in the fridge. Then, the next day, I was able to remove the fat easily.

And then, just heat it up for dinner!

If you choose, you can cook it while you are sleeping and then stick it in the fridge in the morning and reheat for dinner after removing the

IMAGINE A DAY WHERE HUNDREDS OF PEOPLE COME TOGETHER TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Plans for the Big Day of Service" in Orangevale and Fair Oaks are developing into what organizers hope will be one of the largest community service events ever to take place in the two communities.
