missed the entire season due to an ACL injury.



Everyone




FLC's Britney Johnson honored with National Award

Last month Jerry Brown delivered his 15th and final State of the State Address. It's too bad California legislators can't ask questions like our counterparts in the United Kingdom, who query their head of government during "Prime Minister's Questions." If we could, here are five questions I would have asked Governor Brown: 1.) In California, the cost of building a mile of road is triple what it is in other states. You recently signed a \$52 billion gas tax increase. Why not learn from other states that build better and cheaper roads before making Californians pay higher taxes? 2.) Under your watch,

California's unfunded pension liability has grown by over \$100 billion. You clearly recognize this as a problem, having just filed a commendable opening brief in what could be a landmark state supreme court case. So why did you allow this problem, which threatens vital services and future generations, to get so much worse?

3.) For children living in poverty, California is the worst place in America to get an education, ranking near the bottom for every academic performance measure. Your education plan has added almost \$30 billion in yearly spending, yet our schools have if anything gotten worse at educating poor children. How do you explain this?

4.)Since became you Governor, the State Budget has grown from \$129 billion to \$191 billion. What evidence can you point to that this new spending has improved the quality of life for ordinary Californians? Feel free to cite, for example, health outcomes, student achievement. housing affordability, infrastructure quality, workforce participation, poverty rates, family stability, or any other metric.

5.) The projected cost of High Speed Rail now exceeds \$67 billion, with new delays and cost overruns reported almost monthly. And many are doubting the bullet train will have any useful purpose. In the words of Elon Musk, "The train in question would be both slower, more expensive to operate and less safe by two orders of magnitude than flying, so why would anyone use it?" Why would anyone? Assemblyman Kevin Kiley represents the 6th Assembly District, which includes parts of El Dorado, Placer.

WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH -MARCH 2018

A FINAL TRIBUTE HONORING A SPECIAL LADY DURING WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH March 2018

Women's History Month celebrates the vital role of women in American history. The vibrancy and legacy of women past and present unifies and nourishes our collective whole as we march onward towards fundamental human equality.

Lieutenant Lynn Balmer, born September 12, 1907, on the family homestead in Plumas, California, saw history unfold before her eyes and created a bit of history herself. On her 108th birthday, she was recognized by American Legion Post 709, Rancho Cordova, California, as the oldest living female member of the American Legion.

However, now this special lady has been called to Post Everlasting. Lynn Balmer died peacefully at her home at Country Village in Chico, California, on December 9, 2017, at the vintage age of 110.

She was a lifetime member of American Legion Post 709, Rancho Cordova, California, where her nephew, Sgt. Ken Hicks, U.S. Air force veteran, was Historian. He is currently an active member of Post 709.

She was also a lifetime member of the American Legion Auxiliary Unit 637, Citrus Heights, California. After WWII started, Lynn Balmer joined the military, "to free a man for active duty." She served in the U.S. Coast Guard and achieved the rank of Lieutenant (junior grade) LTJG. Lt. Balmer secured a top secret clearance and worked in Military Intelligence. Using her mathematical keen abilities, she read and interpreted weather maps and charts and used morse code to help ships navigate through dangerous waters and adverse weather conditions between the **United States and England.** Prior to her military service, Lt. Balmer was an elementary school teacher, teaching her first class in 1927. She later taught mathematics to high school students. In 1943, her passion for teaching and love for her students, (having no children, she treated each and every child as her own) gave way to her patriotism and love of country when she enlisted in the U.S. Coast Guard.

Yes, Lt. Balmer entered two noble professions and gave of her immense talents whole heartedly.

Between the years of 1946 and 1967 she attended the University of Washington part time. taught mathematics to junior high school students. volunteered at a children's orthopedic hospital, and was a professional skater to boot! She retired and moved to Chico, California, in the late 1990s with her husband, Charles.

Lynn Balmer's passion for life lives on. She told stories about living through World War 1, living through the nationwide flu epidemic in 1918 by wearing bags of asafetida around her neck to school, living through the Great Depression, and when there were shortages of grain and sugar, feeling very lucky that her father had bees so their family of nine children had honey.

Her nephew, Sgt. Hicks, and her extended family and friends continue to carry on Lt. Balmer's storytelling to the delight of young and old alike. Women's The Suffrage movement was going strong in her childhood and when Lynn was 18 years old, she recalled that her mother got to vote for the first time in her life during the 1920 election. When Lynn became of legal age, she, too, proudly exercised her right to vote and encouraged all women, young and old, to exercise their hard-earned right to vote.

Lt. Balmer's deep love of country and patriotism still flourishes in the lives she touched personally and by the sheer power of her being.

Lt. Balmer died at 110 years old leaving a personal legacy of a life well lived. She did not let life pass her by. Her deep love of country and patriotism ignited her commitment to help protect our democracy and way of life.

She had richness of character, strength, gentleness, and a pioneer spirit exemplifying qualities of our American Legion veterans.

During Women's History Month, it is only fitting we pay special tribute to Lt. Balmer and reflect upon and celebrate the lives of famous women pioneers and leaders in our history, as well as celebrate the unsung women heroes of our daily lives.

3 Common Mistakes When Refinancing Your Home

Ready to refinance your home loan to one with a lower interest rate? Or maybe you want to refinance to either a shorter- or longer-term loan. Most times, this refinance will move along smoothly. However, there are times when homeowners make critical mistakes that either slow or scuttle the refinance process. Here are three wrong turns to avoid if you want your refinance to be as easy and stress-free as possible.

1. Don't Skimp on the Paperwork

Before lenders can approve your request for a refinance, they'll need to see some key paperwork: copies of your two most recent paycheck stubs, tax returns, and W-2 forms along with bank account statements from the last two years.

2. Don't Forget to Do the Math

Refinancing isn't free. In general, you can expect to pay from 1 percent to 1.5 percent of your loan amount in closing costs. For a mortgage loan of \$200,000 that comes out to \$2,000 to \$3,000. You need to make sure then, before even applying for a refinance, that your 'drop in' interest rate or the drop in monthly payment (when changing loan terms) leaves enough savings to make this move a smart one. 3. Don't Forget Your Credit Scores

You might not qualify for a refinance if your threedigit FICO score has fallen since you first took out your original mortgage. If your score is too low, you might not qualify for an interest rate that is low enough to make refinancing financially worthwhile.

So before even starting the refi process, check your credit scores from the three national credit bureaus, Equifax, Experian and TransUnion. If your credit cards or banks don't provide these scores, you can order them from the bureaususually around \$15 for each score—but at least you'll know beforehand whether a refinance is an option. MIKE'S PRAWNS IN GARLIC BUTTER

1 Tbsp. chopped fresh 1 cup dry white wine, boiled Devein prawns; set aside. Boil wine, reduce to $\frac{1}{2}$ cup: set aside. Chop garlic cloves; place in small pot. Add the rest of the ingredients, except wine and prawns and cook over medium heat until the butter has melted.

Lay prawns in a 9x11 (ish) sized baking dish. Add the $\frac{1}{2}$ cup reduced wine to the butter mixture and then pour over prawns. Broil in oven (middle rack) until pink/orange color, then turn prawns over to the other side and broil until pink/ orange color, approximately 8-12 minutes total. Serve with French bread. Make 3 servings.

Note: Suzanne used peeled and deveined tail on shrimp (21-30 per pound) and regular pepper because the white pepper was unavailable in the cupboard! Enjoy!




