Colorfully painted "Orangevale Rocks" rocks have been mysteriously appearing throughout town on atop signs, on park benches, drive-through coffee counters and elsewhere to promote what is shaping up to be the largest volunteer public service event in Orangevale history.

The rocks are being painted and then placed in public places in connection with the May 5 "Big Day of Service" in Orangevale and Fair Oaks. Hundreds of participants will pursue public service projects throughout the communities that day ranging from tree planting and installing free smoke detectors; to planting trees or distributing high-risk maternity care packages. Project teams will also wander through the community committing random acts of kindness.

More than 250 participants have already



signed up, but more are needed. Community organizations of people interested in participating can choose a project from a list and sign up at https://www.bigdayofservice.com/communityservice.

Event organizers report that they have raised thousands of dollars from civic organizations, businesses, churches and individuals to finance the event.

"The idea is to have an event where people can feel the joy of serving others and their community," said Brad Squires, director of the Fair Oaks and Orangevale Community Foundation. "We hope to provide many kinds of opportunities for participants to

contribute in large and small ways to their community."

The promotional rock effort is somewhat like a community game. Organizers hope people who find one of the rocks will take its photo, share it on either the Orangevale Happenings or Big Day of Service Facebook page, then move it to another location for someone else to find.

Creation of a painted rock garden at Orangevale's Pecan Park is one of the event's many planned projects. "Painting rocks promotes joy, encouragement, empathy and more," said Ellen Vigna, who is leading the project. "Once the rock garden is established, community members can come and leave a painted rock, take a painted rock or both."

Give and Receive' Community Resource Fair where opportunities to receive services will be accompanied by ways to give back to the community. For example, a person might get a free haircut then spend some time writing postcards to deployed military troops; or volunteer at one of the many community resource booths. A variety of no-cost services will be available, from dental hygienist treatments to food distribution, and there will be booths with representatives from many community-minded organizations available to answer questions or consider volunteers.



## SAFETY SCARE AT CASA

#### SAFETY SCARE AT CASA ROBLE, FROM A MOTHER'S

#### PERSPECTIVE.

We are all on high alert. The violence in our country rages on. The recent events in a Florida high school and the arrest of an Oakmont student gives me pause every day my youngest daughter goes to school. I am secretly glad she is graduating this spring. But graduation will not protect her.

What happened at Casa Roble in February just shows how fearful we are. Rumors can be dangerous. Action without communication feeds doubt. Social media fuels the fire. A lock-down drill rescheduled due to the horrible Florida tragedy was coincidentally rescheduled to this particular week. And, the balance between investigation and notification is a very fine line that, if crossed at the wrong time, could begin a sequelae of events no one could possibly predict.

I have to admit, I participated in the frenzy. I held my daughter from school last Friday, posted to Facebook, contacted the administration at Casa and sent e-mails to community leaders. I did what I felt was appropriate in this situation. I was frustrated that something so serious was being "ignored" and the normal daily onslaught of automated Casa e-mails and phone calls fell silent. Although my husband spoke with a Casa VP on Friday, I was not placated.

On Monday, the same VP called me. Today was for "damage control". We ran through the series of events and shared what we knew from an administrator's and a mother's vantage point. We agreed that in order to succeed our kids need to feel safe at school. I was given a great opportunity to share my feelings and ideas for possible changes. I was also assured that the lockdown drill, which happened during this tumultuous week was completely successful. The campus and all students/staff were secure within a couple of

What I learned from this conversation is that safety

is a priority. Casa Roble administration and staff worked closely with the Sacramento Sheriff's Department to secure the safety of the campus. Thorough and timely onsite and home investigations proved there was NO THREAT. There was "nothing" to report to the parents. But herein lies the problem, and the quandary. How far do we go, and how do we respond to something that is so scary and unpredictable?

The administration is responding by speaking with parents and community members about their thoughts and ideas. They will continue to routinely evaluate the safety procedures, the guidelines for appropriate communication to the parents, and the success of each safety drill performed. Appropriate changes and improvements will be implemented expeditiously. Parents and community members should also do their

Parents and community members should also do their due diligence to be prepared. It takes a village to raise a child and keep a child safe. Orangevale is such a "village". We all should:

• Talk to our children about their fears and questions.

• Teach them always be alert to their surroundings and where to find safe spaces.

•Give them resources of who, when and where to report something unusual.

•Teach them how to respond in the most reasonable way to protect their life when an active shooter is nearby. (see Department of Homeland Security website for info)

•Provide them how to provide first aid.

• Participate with our kids in community and school programs that raise awareness.

this I applaud Casa Roble administration, staff, students and parents. Never in California have I lived in an area so bound by a sense of community. Everyone is family, and everyone matters. Thank you for the conversations and actions that make this a better place for children to grow and learn, for families to flourish, and people to become life-long friends. Now let's move past this event and do better the next time we are faced with such a "scare".





-When calling either emergency number, please stay on the line and do not hang up-- if you hang up and call back you will go back to the end of the queue.



# rangevale Cooks

A few weeks ago at my niece's baby shower, I enjoyed stuffed bell peppers for the first time!

Originally, stuffed bell peppers have not been a favorite dish, but the funny thing is that this recipe is the one that I had tasted many years ago. The recipe is from my motherin-law's file of favorites, but it has been altered through the years by her children and grandchildren. As I am always looking for quick dishes, this one is very easy and it makes great leftovers!

#### **Edna's Bell Peppers** (Suzanne's Version)

1 lb ground beef Rice (34 cup uncooked) - you need about 2 cups cooked rice Small onion, diced 3 bell peppers 1 can condensed tomato soup Water (1/4 cup) Salt

Cheese, shredded (mix of mozzarella

Cajun Seasoning (optional)

Pepper

and cheddar or your choice)

Prepare rice as directed on package. While rice is cooking prepare other ingredients.

Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil. Cut and clean 3 bell peppers length wise from stem to butt. Remove seeds and stem and cook peppers in boiling water for 5-10 minutes; drain. Set aside.

In a large skillet, sauté beef and onions for 5 minutes, or until beef is browned. Drain off excess fat. and season with salt, pepper and a dash of Cajun seasoning. Stir in the tomato soup, and cooked rice. You decide how much rice you want. Add some water if it seems a thick.

Fill each bell pepper half with the mixture. Place in a baking dish that has been prepared with a non-stick cooking spray. Cook in a 350 degree oven for 20 minutes or until warm through and cheese is melted.

This serves 4 or 3 with lunch leftovers!

Notes: We had extra meat, so you could probably use 4 bell peppers. I used the colored bell peppers because they were more appetizing to me, but green is fine! I added the Cajun seasoning because I thought it needed a bit more flavor.


