Registration opens at 8am. Run will start at 9am with an opening ceremony including national anthem and paying respect to the flag of our country.



WE MUST DO MORE ABOUT TEEN MENTAL HEALTH

In 2016. Oakridge student Tiffany Wong had a conversation with emotionally troubled an classmate, and decided to take action. She held a concert to benefit her initiative to provide mental health training to personnel at El Dorado Hills schools. A year later, another Oakridge student, Stephen Bernard, started a club on campus to promote mental health awareness and help students cope with stress and anxiety.

In our local communities, students. teachers. and school leaders are stepping up to confront the growing challenge of adolescent mental health. It is time for the California Legislature to follow their lead. We must do more to address what is among the most urgent and important issues facing young people today.

More than three million teens say they struggle with debilitating depression, and six million with anxiety. The consequences are often tragic. Between 2007 and 2015, rates of suicide have doubled among teenage girls and jumped by 30% among teenage boys. In 2010, Los Angeles Unified School District reported 255 instances of suicidal behavior; just five years later, that figure had risen to 5,000. As teen suicide rates decline across the developed world, they have surged to become the second leading cause of death of young Americans.

Teen drug abuse is also on the rise. Until a few years ago, teen deaths caused by drug overdose had been declining. Between 2014 and 2015, however, they rose by 19%, primarily fueled by addiction to opiates, which many teens use as an antidepressant. With an estimated 120,000 American adolescents currently addicted to opioids, the trend will almost certainly worsen.

A few bills moving through the State Legislature are a good start toward addressing the problem. One would serve to focus the state's mental health spending on prevention and early intervention; another would bolster support for school counselors: and a third, which I have authored, would both introduce more accountability over mental health care spending and improve data sharing between state and local government.

But improving access to treatment can only be part of the solution. We must also focus on the conditions that lead to rising rates of teen depression, anxiety, and other forms of mental illness - an approach that will require contending with root causes. Here, solutions become less obvious, and policies harder to implement, as we wrestle with possible factors ranging from economic stressors to academic pressure to social media use.

As a first step, I am requesting the Assembly Education Committee convene an informational hearing on Adolescent Mental Health, where we can learn more about different approaches schools are taking across the state. With input from parents, education leaders, mental health experts, and students, we can better understand what is working, so we can do more of it, and where kids are falling through the cracks. This is hard work, but it must start now.

SMART MONEY AT ORANGEVALE LIBRARY

Money Smart Week began as a coordinated effort of the Money Smart Advisory Council, a diverse group of more than 40 Chicagoarea organizations working promote together to personal financial literacy. The Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago convened the Council's first meeting in July 2001, during which members agreed to share resources and ideas to achieve greater public awareness of the programs and services available in the city of Chicago. The result was Money Smart Week 2002 - six days of focused presentations by community groups, financial institutions. government educational agencies. organizations, and financial experts, all designed to help consumers learn to better their personal manage finances.

In 2010 the American Library Association joined the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago in a partnership to create a national financial education initiative and in 2017 over 1000 libraries in all 50 states participated in Money Smart Week programs.

Sacramento Public Library has reached out to partners throughout the Sacramento region and put together a slate of programs to educate community members about such topics as fraud prevention, building your credit, preparing for home ownership and much more. It is our goal to continue and enhance these partnerships and offer ongoing financial programs literacy and resources at all Sacramento Public locations.

The first Financial Education program in Orangevale will

THE ILLUSION OF RENT CONTROL Sacramento County

It is quite rare to see economists largely agree with each other on governmental policy. While economists are supposed to be non-partisan and purely scientific, that's not really how it works in practice. Often times you can have well respected economists taking radically different positions on the same subject. So for an issue that has 0% of economists strongly supporting it, one would think that the concept of rent control would similarly have zero political support. Yet as you read this, efforts are underway to bring rent control to Orangevale.

Rent control can sound good on the surface – rent gets set at a fair price and can only be raised by modest percentages so renters aren't priced out of their homes with huge rent increases that they cannot afford. Proponents will argue that low income families don't have enough options for where to live as it is, and that having to find a new home can be devastating (in some cases lead to to homelessness). But while these proponents are correct, their proposed solution to this growing issue unfortunately magnifies the problem.

The amount that property owners charge for rent is largely dependent on market forces. If the demand for rooms is low and supply is high, then rents decrease to ensure that owners are able to keep vacancy rates as low as possible. Converselv. if the demand for rooms is high and supply is low (as is the case currently) then the rents increase as more people compete for less units. If the government imposes restrictions on property owners and forces them to offer lower rents than the market would otherwise dictate, we see two incredibly negative things immediately happen.

First, no new housing will be built and in some cases, housing will be torn down and be replaced with other uses (like commercial business). By forcing rents below the market price, rent control reduces the profitability of rental housing, directing investment capital out of the rental market and into other more profitable markets. In a situation where there is already a lack of housing options, this is about the worst thing that can happen. If the quantity of housing options does not keep pace with population increases, the problem is greatly exacerbated.

Second, due to diminishing profits for property owners and an increase in demand, they are no longer financially able to perform proper upkeep of the property or to quickly respond to requests for repair. The quality of the properties quickly decline and that is not a positive thing for the renter, or for the community of Orangevale who has to live with deteriorating buildings in their neighborhood.

In places where there is demand for more housing, a more effective policy is to simply build more housing. The challenge then becomes how to reduce the cost of construction. where to site the housing, and how to implement affordable housing programs in a way that works for the neighboring communities. But in order to keep our housing affordable, we can't create policies that sound good on paper but make the situation worse - we have to come up with long term solutions if we ever want to fix things.

Finally, I want to invite everyone to my next Orangevale community meeting on May 9th at 6:00pm at the Orangevale Community Center (6826 Hazel Avenue). This is an opportunity for you to get an update from me and to ask me any questions you may have. 
