



Letter to the Editor

Re: Real Estate News: The Illusion of Rent Control

Supervisor Frost's well intentioned article is simplistic (Economics 101) and fallacious. Her supply/ demand argument applies to common goods, not housing. The "demand for rooms" example is valid for hotel room vacancy rates, which is seasonal and serves inherently transient population. Housing rental is far more complex than simple economics. It includes safety, security, financial stability, and quality of life issues for tenants who cope with the stress of frequent relocation due to unaffordable rent. In many cases, rent increases do not insure timely maintenance for both residential and commercial properties. Apartment rental

rates are never decreased to fill vacancies; landlords offer various incentives to attract tenants.

A thoughtful, well crafted rent stabilization ordinance (RSO) does not force rents to meet some ideal market value but should attempt to set increases at a level which is equitable for both the property owner and the tenant. Realistic economic data like COLA, CPI, etc., must be part of the equation. Real estate owners/investors must accept the reality and possibility of decreased profitability, just as investors in any venture. Ethics and morality

should be factored in because renters are people, not commodities. From the Washington Post, "Rent regulations help maintain diversity and stability in neighborhoods, which increase property values." Long term tenants maintain

and improve properties which contribute to neighborhood preservation and real estate value.

Supervisor Frost states, "In places where there is a demand for more housing, a more effective policy is to simply build more housing." The idea that rent decreases as more units are added is patently false. If you were to look at average rent in any Sacramento area, it has NEVER decreased in the last decade. Rents for newly constructed units are understandably higher, but "high tide floats all the boats" - rents on older units rise also. The most time sensitive and critical need which must be undertaken now is the retention of existing housing which meets affordability criteria. An RSO can help to preserve what we have at a

# Cooks Cooks

2 Green Bell Pepper, sliced in thin strips 2 Red Bell Pepper, sliced in thin strips -Or 3 large total 1 or 2 cups mushrooms, sliced 2-3 cloves garlic, chopped ½ cup Balsamic vinegar ¾ cup Olive Oil Salt Pepper

On low heat in a large frying pan, warm olive oil, garlic, sliced pepper and cook until tender. Be careful not to burn the garlic. Then turn up the heat and add the mushrooms; stir until done. This won't take long. Remove from heat and add vinegar and salt and pepper (to taste).

Serve at room temperature with French bread or over your favorite sausage. Enjoy!
