5th, that dream came to life when over 1,000 volunteers showed up for the first-ever Big Day of Service. It was truly an amazing day and one of the most unifying events our community has ever experienced.

The day began with a kick-off rally and pancake breakfast in Fair Oaks at New Life Community Church, one of the event sponsors. One highlight from the rally was a moment where local churches and event volunteers raised over \$3,000 for one of our local families, the Ballentines, who have been dealing with immense challenges. As Pastor Josh Hall of Fair Oaks Presbyterian



Church presented the gift he shared that “we want this event to be BIG across the community, but also to be very personal.” After the rally, the volunteers dispersed across the community to 27 different project locations where amazing results were accomplished. The day finished with a free tacos and a closing rally where we heard from many



of the volunteers about what it meant to spend the day serving others. One high school volunteer shared that “it was so fulfilling and so amazing to see what we accomplished together in one day.”

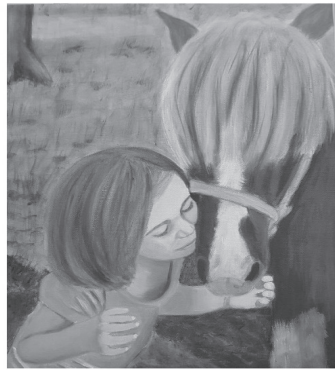

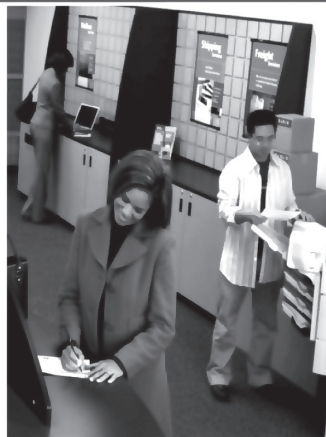

SASKA USA

SASKA USA trains in the Shotokan style of martial arts. Shotokan is a Japanese-style of martial arts that is popular worldwide, and is distinctive for its deep stances, and powerful motions. The training and dedication of the Orangevale SASKA dojo is truly impressive. Through mental and physical toughness the karateka of SASKA train in Kata (forms) and Kumite (sparring), and this training includes a competitive element, as many of the athletes compete at tournaments both locally nationally and internationally. SASKA USA is a member of SASKA International, WUKF, USA KARATE and AAU of USA U.S Open (March 30th-April 1st, Las Vegas)- This Spring, SASKA USA sent a group of athletes to compete at the US Open and Junior International Cup. The US Open/Junior International Cup are international competitions that bring together athletes from all over the world. For three days, the best martial artists in the world vie for the title of champion. The SASKA athletes made a good showing at the tournament with medals being won by Makenna Brown, Keenan Cockovic, and Tim Brown. A fourth athlete, Mason Brown, excelled in his competition group, but fell short of the medal stand. Local Competitions- The dojo has recently sent students to compete at tournaments in Dixon, Yuba City, and Sacramento, bringing home quite a handful of medals,



many of them gold. These tournaments are a perfect opportunity for students to challenge themselves and test their skills against students from other dojos. Most recently the team competed and the National Qualifying Tournament in Yuba City. This tournament was held in preparation for the US National Tournament, which will be held in Reno, Nevada this July. Out of 22 SASKA USA (Orangevale) Athletes our team brought home a total of 30 medals: 14 Bronze; 10 Silver and 6 Gold. Shihan Visit- This last year SASKA had the honor of being visited by Shihan Koos Burger. Shihan is a true karate Master; he is a 9th Dan black belt, and the style-head for the SASKA organization. Shihan is also the Vice President of the WUKF (World Union of Karate-do Federation), and has spent decades training in Europe and Japan. During his visit, Shihan spent a week training with the SASKA Orangevale dojo, and imparted his skills and wisdom to the entire dojo from white-belt students to 6th Dan black belts. Gashuku- The term Gashuku

means "gather your dojo," and the SASKA organization does just that several times a year. The Gashuku are opportunities for one day intensive training seminars that are usually done in outdoor, serene settings. The dojo holds smaller events throughout the year at parks in Orangevale, as well as an annual Gashuku, often held at the Point Reyes state park North of San Francisco. A Gashuku is a tremendous opportunity to tests yourself, and build strong bonds with your fellow students SASKA trains at the Orangevale Youth Center and the Orangevale Grange. WE MUST BE VIGILANT ABOUT CYBERSECURITY

It could have been the plot of a Hollywood thriller. Last March hackers breached the city of Atlanta’s digital network, freezing municipal employees out of their computers until a \$51,000 ransom -- to be paid in bitcoin -- was transferred to an anonymous online account. For more than a week residents couldn’t pay their bills; courts had no way to validate warrants; and police lost access to their criminal databases.

The ransom was never paid. Nevertheless, the hack cost Atlanta taxpayers more than \$2.7 million in system upgrades and repairs. And this wasn’t even the most egregious case of a recent security breach. A year earlier, a computer virus effectively shut down Britain’s national health system, preventing doctors from accessing medical records and forcing patients to stay home. The hack into Equifax, just two months later, compromised the tax IDs, social security numbers, and drivers’ licenses of an estimated 145 million Americans.

If trends hold, cybercrime will cost the global economy \$2 trillion a year by 2020. The highest price will be paid by small businesses, which are the victims of just over half of all cyberattacks. With the cost of a security breach averaging \$53,000, sixty percent of victimized businesses face insolvency within six months.

The gravity of the threat warrants a serious response. California

has been proactive in this regard, pioneering legislation that provides for reasonable safeguards of user data and -- as of three years ago -- setting up a cybersecurity task force to oversee the digital defense of government departments and critical infrastructure. I recently supported legislation to make that task force permanent, and have authored separate legislation allowing hacking victims to freeze their credit ratings without charge.

State security measures, however, can only go so far. Most cyber criminals infiltrate computer systems not through sophisticated hacks, but by so-called “phishing techniques,” where the victim is tricked into installing a virus by a phony website or a fabricated email that appears to come from a trusted source.

That’s why the best defense against hackers is to understand their tactics. To that end, I am hosting a Cyber Security Forum at Destiny Community Center in Rocklin on Friday, May 25th. The free event, to take place from 12:00 to 1:30 p.m., will feature presentations by cyber security specialists from Ariento Cyber Security (a nationally recognized cyber defense provider) and the City of Roseville.

Cybercrime ranks among the greatest threats to our public infrastructure and economic security. As is the case with any public safety challenge, a strong defense depends on shared vigilance.

MEMORIAL DAY – ALL GAVE SOME; SOME GAVE ALL

Memorial Day will be celebrated on May 28th, this year. Memorial Day, not to be confused with Veterans Day, is a day of remembering the men and women who died while serving in the United States Armed Forces. Veterans Day on the other hand celebrates the service of all U. S. Military veterans. Memorial Day, formerly known as Decoration Day, originated after the American Civil War in 1868 to commemorate the Union and Confederate soldiers who died in the Civil War. The end of May seemed to be appropriate since many spring flowers are available. By the 20th century Memorial Day had been extended to honor All Americans who have died in all wars in the past 240 years.

Every year, Sylvan Cemetery in Citrus Heights honors those that gave their lives in the defense of their county. This year the Memorial Day service will be held on Monday, May 28, 2018, at Sylvan Cemetery, 7401 Auburn Blvd., Citrus Heights. The ceremony begins at 10:30 with a march through the historical section of the cemetery, stopping briefly at each flag station to read a prayer and salute the flag. The men marching include the American Legion and American Legion Auxiliary, VFW, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, Sons of the American Revolution, Boys Scout troop 228, Police Officers of the Citrus Heights Police Department and all others that wish to march. This march will last about 30 minutes. The march will conclude at the gazebo where there will be a one-hour ceremony from 11:00 to 12:00. Many of the men marching will be in uniform – past and present – from American Revolution to modern day.

IN THIER SHOES



Supervisor Sue Frost

Since I was first elected to office 6 years ago, and continuing now as Supervisor, I have tried to be open minded and research all sides of every issue so I can make informed decisions and support policy that best meets the needs of our communities.

That is why last year I asked the Sheriff's Department to allow me to personally experience some of the training our deputies undertake to help them handle potentially deadly situations. Watching news coverage of the tragic shooting of Stephon Clark has compelled me to share with you what I experienced and learned from that training - even though some of my advisors have recommended that I not touch this issue with a ten-foot pole.

When I arrived at the training facility, I was brought to a portable room where an instructor talked to me about how much "force" to use in given situations, such as how to disarm someone using words - or failing that, when to use force or draw a taser - and lastly, when to draw a firearm.

After the discussion, I was given a holster with simulated weapons that had recoil, and put in front of a huge projector screen that ran a series of simulations. The operator of the simulator was able to change the simulation based on what I was doing and saying, and the simulator itself could detect my gunshots and react accordingly. This combination made me feel like I was actually there, and I completely forgot that I wasn't in actual danger.

In my first simulation, I was at the park responding to a call where I was told kids were playing with a gun.

When I arrived, I saw two boys sitting in the park holding something dark. In a matter of seconds I recognized that the object they were holding was a gun, but before I knew it one of the boys was accidentally shot. I was stunned! When I saw two innocent-looking boys holding something dark my heart wanted to think it was a book. After the simulator turned off for debriefing, we talked about why I did not identify myself as law enforcement, draw my gun and shout at them to drop the weapon. I was informed that had I handled things differently, nobody would have been shot.

In my next simulation, I witnessed a woman being robbed at an ATM. Learning my lesson, I drew my gun and started yelling commands, and continued to yell commands as I saw the man draw a gun. Almost immediately, the man had shot the woman, dropped his gun, and started to run away. I fired my "gun," shooting after him as the simulation again turned off for debriefing. We talked about why I should have shot the man earlier than I did, how chasing and shooting him as he ran away meant shooting him in the back when he had already surrendered his weapon, and how I could have accidentally shot an innocent bystander at a distance. My reaction added risk and liability to an already bad situation. I was asked how many bullets I thought I fired and was off by five. I was asked about what the man looked like, and was shocked that I could not recall anything about him other than he was a man.

As the morning went on, I had some simulations where I adequately solved the problem, and others that went just as bad as the first two. But the longer it went on, the more comfortable I was in the simulator and the better I was doing overall.

The experience opened my eyes to what our deputies have to be prepared to face while on patrol - and the training they receive on how to handle those situations. Before this experience, it was easy for me to watch a video of a police encounter and say how I would have done things differently. But after going through it, it has changed my perspective on all the police encounters I have watched - and has given me a greater appreciation for how hard it is for the officers.

I understand now how a person could

recall firing only four bullets when he in fact fired ten. I understand how in a split second you can fear for your life and assume the worst. And I understand that since only a handful of officers will face those situations in their career, it must be extremely difficult to mentally prepare them for when they do happen.

With the benefit of hindsight and multiple camera angles, we can see how the shooting of Stephon Clark might have been avoided. This opens our eyes to the need for intense policy review and enhanced training - but not by shouting people down, breaking car windows or blocking roads and freeways. Providing our officers the best available training so they can be as prepared mentally and physically as possible should be a top priority.

The simulator I went through was a single projector screen. But other law enforcement agencies in California have a more realistic series of five screens that surround trainees, providing more options - and a more realistic, higher intensity level of training.

Moving forward, I will be working to secure funding to either purchase this equipment for the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department (which could also be shared with other police departments that could benefit) or sending Deputies to train in a facility that already has such a system. We owe the benefits of such higher intensity training to the public - and to the officers who protect us every day.

Finally, I want to invite everyone to my next Orangevale community meeting on May 9th at 6:00pm at the Orangevale Community Center (6826 Hazel Avenue). This is an opportunity for you to get an update from me and to ask me any questions you may have.
