

## **APATHETIC?!**

"Why are youth not involved in government?" This question was asked at a senator's morning community coffee a few weeks ago. After giving a possible reason, the senator answered this question to a room filled with over sixty grandparents, "No young people are here today because they are apathetic."

The ladies sitting near me whispered, "You're here. Doesn't the senator realize that young people go to school and work?" After hearing his answer, I walked out. One of the senator's office staff had a surprised look on his face as he opened the door for me.

Often this topic is brought up at government meetings, showing that people notice an absence in society. Before this year, I too used to wonder why several of my peers were uninterested in politics. Now, since going more community meetings and beginning a legislative project, I am mocked and not taken seriously. Although such conduct is damaging to youth involvement, actions can be taken to turn this around.

Let's consider the possibility of my peers not knowing how to become involved in their community, instead of saying they are apathetic.

Youth not invited

Many of the community coffees are held during school hours, well publicized for senior citizens and where retired people hang out. With this information, it is no surprise that at many meetings the majority of the guests are senior citizens. When I asked how these attendees hear about the events, they say they received a mailed invitation. If government officials take the time to invite senior citizens, how much more effort is it to contact my generation?

After a county supervisor meeting, an older lady ran up to commend me for being the only young person there. She told me that she and her friends were debating on whether I was there for a homework assignment or because I wanted to be. Going out of her way to learn if I truly cared was a step that more people could take to encourage youth who do have political interest.

Youth not taken seriously While being a part of a legislative proposal and introduction is an

exciting new experience, to be heard and taken seriously is an uphill job.

On the first day of session, I walked around to several senate and assembly offices with some friends to express concern about an education safety issue. Following this up a week later, I delivered a legislative proposal to these offices.

Once we found an author, I called the offices I visited to request their interest in coauthoring the bill. They said, 'We will get back to you." I have yet to receive a call. If young people are important to the legislative process, why don't their representatives respond to

Laughed off the phone

When calling to share with my senator's office that an author for the proposal was found and that I wanted my senator to coauthor the bill, I was laughed off the phone. My generation can overcome this and find the kind politicians who are out there.

Assemblyman interested

Assemblyman Kevin Kiley has an internship program which successfully encourages youth to become involved in their local government. These high school and college students experience campaigning, learn about their district and what it is like to work in a legislature's office.

for and believes youth can be genuinely interested in their community.

called Assemblymember Kiley's office to schedule an appointment to share my concerns about an issue with one of his capitol office staff. A few hours after the appointment was set, I received a phone call informing me that he wanted to meet with me personally. On the first day of session, Assemblyman Kiley left the session early for the meeting. He is an admirable representative to reach out to youth more so than any I've previously met, or currently know of.

Youth are an investment

The ability to relate to young people can become an opportunity. While a minor cannot yet vote themselves, they have influence on several family members who can. Valuing youth can be a multiple interest investment.

Someday, the government will be on the shoulders of my generation. Until then, will politicians continue to ignore and undervalue us? You and I can be the change we need to see in others.







If you're listing your home for sale, the price vou list vour home is very important. If you overprice your home from the start, you will have fewer showings & possibly offers.
