

New Vote System - Challenges & Opportunities

In the most recent June 5th election, most of the Sacramento County voters were shocked or confused and some were angry. They were unware that one year prior. the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors had fundamentally changed the way we vote. In this election, all voters were mailed absentee ballots, and our 500+ traditional polling locations were closed and replaced with 77 "vote centers" that opened 11 days early to allow a longer voting period. While I was the sole vote in opposition to this switch, I wanted to use this opportunity in my monthly column to explain what we learned and what needs to change moving forward.

One change that will benefit everybody in November when we vote again is for people to take advantage of the vote centers. Not enough people realized that some vote centers were open for 11 days before the actual Election Day (and additional vote centers were open 4 days before the election).

There was a serious change in behavior among voters that resulted in only around 10,000 people voting at a vote center - which was only around 3% of the voters. Vote centers sometimes reported seeing only 1 person a day actually vote.

I think I know why this happened. People did not know that even though they got an absentee ballot, they could have thrown it away if they wanted and just gone to the nearest vote center to obtain a ballot and vote. They thought vote centers and drop off sites were the same thing.

Why was this a problem? On Election Day, many voters were turned away because ballot boxes were too full, and some other people reported being stuck in enormous lines. I think we can fix these problems by doing three things.

First and foremost, we need better communication. One of the benefits to this new program was saving money so it seems to me we can find the resources to get the word out more effectively. Some materials were mailed to voters, and banners were displayed throughout the County. We can assess how effective these strategies were and come up with a better way of getting clear information in the hands and minds of voters.

Second, I think we need more drop-off locations, even if that means we have less vote centers. More importantly, we need more drop-off locations outside the City of Sacramento. 65% of all 11 day vote centers were in the City of Sacramento, which only has 32% of voters. We need to make sure there are more convenient locations

spread throughout the county with secure bins large enough to accommodate a large number of voters in a single day.

Lastly, we need to make sure people understand all of their options. For many, this may have been their first time receiving an absentee ballot. The postage required can change based on the thickness of the ballot but what people may not realize is that if they mail it without postage, their vote will still be delivered and counted (the county just ends up covering the cost). But for people who do not like mailing their vote, they need to know that they can drop it off or throw it away and receive a brand new ballot at the vote center. Those who prefer to vote in person, like they always have, have the ability to vote at any of the 77 vote centers - whether it is the one closest to home, work or preferred grocery store.

There is some good news though. This year we believe we will end up with a 47% turnout, which would be the highest level in 20 years for a non-presidential primary in Sacramento County. The system needs improvement and if we can capitalize on the good parts while fixing the problems, we can have a great system. As always, I am listening and your opinions are important to me. Let me know how you feel about the changes in the way we vote.

Wildlife Care Association of Sacramento has a variety of roles including that filled by volunteer Dave Gish. As a community volunteer he's given over 1600 hours and logged hundreds of miles returning over 500 creatures to the wild in releases across the Sacramento region since 2016. WCA volunteers like Dave return wildlife to the area it came from originally on release back to nature.

Volunteers have fed, raised rehabilitated wildlife while others from across the community staff the Hotline, manage the office and keep the WCA facility up and operating thru the busy season.

Dave Gish also volunteers as a facility gardener working to maintain the grounds when not on the road to release



nature. Wildlife Care volunteers provide 98% of the critical skills needed to keep these heroes of wildlife on track. Working with skilled animal care staff and our community volunteer coordinator it's the people from

across the region from all walks

of life that make the difference

in life or death for wildlife.







Love Talk Read to Help Your Child Succeed PART 1

"It's hot. I'm bored." These are the words every parent dreads hearing when school is out. We love being with our children, but what to do when it is 100+ outside and the troops are restless?

You've been told repeatedly "Read with your children." But how do you make it fun and engaging? How do you avoid the dreaded "summer slide," where kids go backwards because they are not in school? As a mother and speechlanguage pathologist, I will share some easy, practical ideas that worked for me—and hopefully they will for you!

First of all, children need to see the adults around them enjoying reading. Children do what their role models do. If you are glued to your phone, your child will want to be on the phone too! If he sees you enjoying reading books, he will be excited about reading as well.

Remember that Orangevale Library is a wonderful free resource in our community—and the air conditioning is free! Google Orangevale Library for the hours they are open. You may be surprised at how many programs they have that are aimed at children. When our son Mark was little, we spent many happy hours there.

It can be very helpful to give your children incentives. For example, you can have a chart on the fridge where your child gets a sticker for every book she reads. When she gets a certain number of stickers, she gets to buy an item she has been wanting. Rewards can be very powerful!

With younger children, make reading exciting and fun by reading aloud to them using silly, dramatic voices. Be expressive! This is especially important for young children with limited attention spans. Read books your child is especially interested in. A great way to help your child learn to love reading is to provide books that are funny. Children love to laugh! In kindergarten, my son Mark started hating reading and would have none of it because his dyslexia made reading very hard. He would let me read aloud to him, though, and all he wanted to hear was Captain Underpants stories and Bible stories with bad guys (there are plenty of those!) Oh, and he liked the Dumb Bunny (by Dav Pilkey)

books as well. Sound effects and funny voices kept him attentive and engaged.

Make reading a priority. Bedtime stories are especially good because they children wind down and relax. Make it a special time of snuggling before they go to sleep. Sometimes children will want the same book over and over—that's fine! Don't be afraid to read the same book repeatedly. When children hear the same book read over and over, they capture the story line and are able to focus on more sophisticated details such as meanings of vocabulary words. Help your child figure out new vocabulary. Encourage your child to look at illustrations and pictures to figure out new words, but do supply the meaning if she starts getting frustrated.

It's that time of year! Time to celebrate! This is a great dessert recipe that is perfect for summer and celebrating the 4th of July. I received this recipe several years ago from Orangevale resident, Mary Beth Embree. If you look in any recipe book, magazine or even the Sacramento Bee, they have recently been promoting the "galette." Thanks to Mary Beth Embree, we were "in" before everyone else! It is a delicious recipe and it is easy to make.

PLUM GALETTE

Cut up about 16 plums into bite size pieces. Mix them with 1/4 c. white sugar, 1/4 c. brown sugar, and 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon. aside. Place an unbaked pie crust flat onto a parchment

lined baking sheet. (Mary Beth Embree uses the store bought unbaked pie crusts). Combine 3 tablespoons sugar and 1 tablespoon flour. Spread over the dough to within two inches of the edge. Arrange plum pieces on top. Fold crust over plums around the edge. Brush crust with egg white and sprinkle with sugar. Bake 30-35 minutes at 375 degrees until golden

Note from Suzanne: If your plums are a little tart, then add a little more sugar.

Easy Pie Crust 1-2/3 cup flour 2 teaspoons sugar ½ teaspoon salt 2/3 cup + 1 Tbsp butter (not

2-4 Tablespoon ice water

Mix dry ingredients together and then cut in butter with pastry blender or two knives until mixture is a crumbly texture.

Add 2 tablespoons water and mix: add more water if needed.

Flatten into a disk on waxed paper and refrigerate for 30 minutes. (Make galette filling while dough is

chilling.)

Roll dough into a roughly 12-inch diameter circle-ish shape, about 1/8 inch thick. Arrange the fruit on top, leaving about 1 1/2 inches clear around the edge of the dough. To fold the edges, fold the edge nearest to you toward the center. Rotate the galette and lift the adjacent piece of edge, and fold toward the center. The important part is to make sure there are no cracks where the juices will leak out during baking, so don't worry if it looks "rustic" ... it's supposed

SUNNY DAYS, SICK PETS

Warm, dry weather is here to stay for the next few months. In addition to the browning lawns around town, our pets are also feeling the heat. It is important to keep your pets cool and well watered because it's even easier for them to suffer from heat stroke and dehydration. Mild cases can result in lethargy and fever; but severe cases can cause coma or even death!

As humans, we're lucky to be able to sweat (and build air conditioning units!). Our furry family members are not as lucky! There is only so much that panting can do to cool off the body, especially in triple digit heat. If you are feeling hot, just remember your pet is feeling it worse!

The biggest thing to avoid is keeping your pet out of hot cars. The heat inside a car can very quickly rise to oven-like temperatures. Even if your car is in the shade, with the windows cracked, your pet can experience heat stroke in a few minutes. Don't risk the quick run into the market. Just say no!

Even just being outside can be deadly without adequate water supply and cool shade. You should also consider providing a small wading pool to help them cool off. Dogs that are flat faced (pugs, bulldogs, boston terriers, boxers, etc.) have a narrowed airway compared to their body weight so they have an even more difficult time keeping cool. For them, even with shade and water, just being in 90 degree heat can kill.

If you think your pet is overheated, douse them in cool water (no ice) and call your veterinarian immediately. Alcohol on the feet does not remove enough heat to be effective. Like other things in life, the best treatment is prevention!

Here's what you will learn at the family meetings

No one plans to become physically dependent on alcohol or other drugs. It usually starts very innocently as a social "lubricant" or a study aid to help students get through long nights of schoolwork. At some point, though, drugs or alcohol become essential to make it through the day, and your loved one will begin to withdraw from the family or manipulate others in order to function and survive. The family "system" becomes as sick as the family member.

Everyone may be in denial about alcoholism or addiction (known in the medical and insurance worlds as "Substance Use Disorder" or SUD) because no one understands what is happening, or it is too terrifying or painful to admit there seems to be a problem.

SUD is considered a chronic

brain disease that can be kept in remission through treatment. Without treatment, it is progressive and fatal.

You'll learn about the risk factors for SUD including early childhood trauma, family genetics, mental health issues and the age of first exposure to drugs or alcohol.

You'll discover that you didn't cause your loved one's SUD, and you can't cure it or control it. But you can learn to "untangle" yourself from their chemical dependency, which may give them a reason to reclaim a life of recovery without drugs or alcohol. And your life will improve, even if your loved one continues to abuse alcohol or other drugs.

As you learn about treatment and recovery, you will find that there are many ways and many resources to help your loved one recover from their addiction or alcoholism.


