

Thomas Capel Tomich, Scion of Orangevale Pioneer Family

February 19, 1925 -July 15, 2018

Thomas Capel Tomich died peacefully at home on July 15, 2018, at the age of 93. He and his beloved wife Lillian had just celebrated their 66th wedding anniversary. He was proud that he did not spend a single day of his long life in a hospital. Born at the family home, he was raised on the family farm in Orangevale, California during the Great Depression. Though no stranger to hard work and hard times, nothing could have prepared a 19-year-old for service as a combat infantryman in the U.S. Army during WWII. Tom was proud of his service in France, Germany, and Austria and as a liberator of Nazi death camps. His stories serve as a reminder of society's frailty, humanity's resilience, and our responsibilities as citizens in a free society. We trust that he is at peace and finally free from





the trauma of WWII.

Tom was THE master fruit grower; he approached farming as an art and craft as well as a science, producing the best fruit that most people ever tasted. He obtained his Bachelor's in Plant Science and Master's in Horticulture from UC Davis, where he also met lovely Lillian at Picnic Day. They married and together joined in his family's Orangevale farming tradition. Their children, grandchildren, nieces, nephews, friends, neighbors, and generations of local youth participated in the family farm effort, an Orangevale legacy. Tom was proud of the scores of youth who worked with him through the decades and saw his mentoring as a community service. He happily shared his skills with so many, though none of us attained his mastery. He also was passionate about many other things: nature, history, politics, community, citizenship. His spiritual life was deeply rooted, and he

was eager to worship every Sunday at his parish church.

Tom is preceded by his parents Prosper Tomich and Eleanor Wickstrom Tomich, and his brothers and sisters Nicholas, Frances, Eleanor, John, Quentin, and Frederick. Tom is survived by Lillian; their children Thomas Patrick, Victoria, Elizabeth, and Patricia; and their grandchildren Alannah, Erin, Erik, and Eden. His grandchildren are the fifth generation to have worked on the Orangevale farm, founded by his grandparents Albert




and Hannah Wickstom in 1897. Tom's passing marks the end of an era.

Tom was laid to rest with military honors at Sylvan Cemetery in Citrus Heights. A memorial mass and reception will take place at Divine Savior Catholic Church in Orangevale on Tuesday, August 14, 2018, at 10:00 am. 



## FAIR RULING ON FAIR SHARE

# Fair Ruling on Fair Share

In June, the United States Supreme Court issued a decision in the case of Janus v. AFSCME, ruling that the First Amendment protects public employees from being required to pay money to a union without their consent. As this was a high profile case that drastically changes the way unions operate, I wanted to use my monthly article to discuss the history of this issue, how I believe this will impact Sacramento County, and why I support the decision.

In 1977 the Supreme Court ruled that even though public employees cannot be required to financially support its political activities, they are still required to pay the union a "fair-share" fee to pay for the union's collective bargaining activities (the costs the union incurs in negotiating their wages, pensions, benefits, work conditions, grievance procedures, etc.). This fairshare fee was only a small bit less than paying the full fee, and as such, less than 800 of our roughly 11,000 employees elected to only pay the fairshare fee.

But now with this latest ruling, any union member can cease paying the entirety of their union dues while still receiving all the benefits of being a union member. New employees will be given the option of whether to pay into the union or not, and existing employees can leave the union whenever their union contract has to be renegotiated (every three years).

From the County of Sacramento's perspective nothing will change — we will still negotiate contracts with unions just as we always have. But from the union's perspective everything is

changing. Almost half of our union employees have

contracts up for renegotiation this year, and I expect a large number of employees to opt out of their union dues. This will force the unions to cut staff and limit the number of donations they make to political campaigns.

It is important to note that this Supreme Court decision does not impact all public sector unions the same. Public safety unions like the Sheriffs. Firefighters, and Probation are not worried about the impact, because they focus on service to their members, and don't tend to plunge into unrelated political fights that their membership doesn't support. I do not expect union membership in these public safety organizations to dwindle.

I agree with the Supreme Court decision because I fully believe any person should be able to have a career teaching children, fighting fires, or being any other form of public servant without having to pay a private third party for the opportunity to do so. I also believe it will bring some real benefits to the employees of Sacramento County.

Now, unions will have to work harder to justify their importance to the employees. They will need to ensure they are offering real value to their members, and they will be less likely to pick controversial political fights that end up angering their members who disagree. Public labor unions should be encouraging membership and dues on the merit of the benefits they provide, rather than require employees to pay what is essentially a payroll tax.

There are other good things about this ruling as well, such as lower wage workers seeing a boost to their paycheck and making it easier for them to support their families. The average union dues are over \$500 annually — which means workers who decided to stop paying dues will effectively get an annual raise. This money could be the difference between starting a college account for their kids or not, being able to reduce debt, or simply feeling more secure that the bills are taken care of.

I have no burning desire for unions to die off, or even to shrink. But I do have a desire to ensure that the employees of Sacramento County are given options regarding what they can do with their hard earned paychecks. The unions can come out of this situation alright, just so long as they truly listen to their members, deliver the types of services people need, and stay out of political campaigns that their membership aren't fully in support of.
