

#### VETERANS DAY

The eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month 1918 - an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities, was declared between the Allied nations and Germany in the First World War. Since no one knew that there would be a sequel in 20 years, it was known as "the Great War" or the war to end all wars but didn't have a number. Commemorated as Armistice Day beginning the following year, November 11th became a legal federal holiday in the United States in 1938. In the aftermath of World War II and the Korean War, Armistice Day became Veterans Day, a holiday dedicated to American veterans. Unlike Memorial Day, it was not in-

tended to just remember those that fell in battle. Instead it was a day to recognize all those that men and women that have served over the course of 241 years of this nation's existence. Whether the service was in war time or peace time or in foreign countries or at home, the Veteran would be recognized on this day. The veteran knows not what the situation will be when they sign the bottom line and raise their right hand and promise to support and defend the constitution. Peace time quickly can become war time.

Every year, Sylvan Cemetery in Citrus Heights honors those that served in the defense of their county. This year the Veterans Day service will be held on Sunday, November

11, 2018, at Sylvan Cemetery, 7401 Auburn Blvd., Citrus Heights. The ceremony begins at 10:30 with a march through the historical section of the cemetery, stopping briefly at each flag station to read a prayer and salute the flag. The men marching include the American Legion and American Legion Auxiliary, VFW, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, Sons of the American Revolution, Boys Scout troop 228, Police Officers of the Citrus Heights Police Department and all others that wish to march. This march will last about 30 minutes. The march will conclude at the gazebo where there will be a one hour ceremony. Many of the men marching will be in uniform - past and present - from American Revolution to modern day.

# CRACK DOWN ON HOMELESS CAMP

9th Circuit Court Takes Control of County's Authority to Crack Down on **Homeless Camps**

In September of this year, the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals issued a decision in the case Martin v. Boise which ruled local governments cannot cite or arrest anyone for sleeping on public property when adequate shelter beds are unavailable. Because of that ruling, Sacramento County Parks Rangers stopped enforcing the County anti-camping ordinance at our regional parks and dependent park districts. On October 16th, the Board of Supervisors discussed the implications of this decision, so I thought this would be a perfect opportunity to update you on the subject.

As soon as I heard that our Park Rangers had stopped enforcement of our anticamping ordinance, I reached out to my constituents and asked for their input. There were some great suggestions, but most of those suggestions had some critical flaw that is not immediately obvious. Drug free requirements are not allowed because we cannot place any conditions on the people who are offered housing. Designating certain areas of the parkway for camping is not allowed because we have to give access to all locations. Creating a "tent city" does not lower the amount of shelter we need to build in order to start enforcing our ordinance again, because in order for a unit to count as shelter it must meet certain requirements like a minimum amount of space and running water.

This is an issue that we need to get used to for a while.

The ruling is being appealed to the U.S. Supreme Court, but since no stay of enforcement has been issued, the court decision is the law of the land (for now). I could easily see this decision being overturned, but we are years away from that ever happening and we can't hold our breath waiting for that possibility. We have to act now and deal with this issue.

The obvious solution is to build shelter, because if enough shelter is built than we can go back to enforcing our ordinance. We have been actively doing that through our scattered site shelter model, which is where we utilize currently vacant singlefamily properties that house individuals in need of shelter. The houses are spread out so there are only a small amount in each community, each house has 24-hour inhouse monitoring, and the residents get connected with the social services they need to fix the problems that were keeping them homeless.

Earlier this year California allocated nearly \$20 million in funding that Sacramento County and Sacramento City are eligible to receive, just so long as we declare a "shelter crisis" in Sacramento County. So on October 16th Sacramento County made this dec-

laration, which doesn't really obligate Sacramento County to anything new, given the Ninth Circuit decision.

Among other things, this money will get us significantly more homes for the scattered site shelter model I described above, increased family shelter capacity, and the creation of a program connects homeless youths with families who want to house them on a short-term basis.

On top of that, if Proposition 2 passes in November Sacramento County will be able to allocate more dollars to housing for the homeless, that were previously dedicated to mental health for the home-

Unfortunately, I do not think this will get us the amount of housing needed to go back to enforcing our ordinance, and neither do my colleagues on the Board of Supervisors. We told staff that we are not satisfied with the status quo, and want them to report back to us on if we can more rigorously enforce along our parkways. We have health and safety concerns for the people trying to utilize the parkways, and also concerns about the environmental damage being done. In 2018 alone we have removed over 6.5 million pounds of trash from our parkways, and that's not acceptable.

I have compassion for the homeless, which is why I have authorized funding multiples times now for new homeless programs - but I also have compassion for the residents of our County who want to use our parks/parkways for recreational purposes. I'm committed to finding a solution to this impasse our community is in, and will update you as we work through





#### Xylitol: A Bittersweet Sweetener

Xylitol is a low-calorie, natural sugar alcohol that is growing in popularity as a sugar alternative due to its low glycemic index. It is commonly found in chewing gum, baked goods, candy, dental hygiene products (such as toothpaste and mouth wash), and some over-the-counter medicines and supplements. Now it can even be found in some new brands of peanut butter, which could pose a serious risk to dogs that get peanut butter as a treat or to help administer medications.

While xylitol is perfectly safe for humans to consume, our furry companions are not so lucky. Xylitol is highly toxic to dogs, a small dose can cause life threatening hypoglycemia (low blood sugar) in as little as 30 minutes, but it may also be delayed up to 12 hours after ingestion. Additionally at higher doses xylitol can cause severe liver failure which can occur 12-48 hours later. Symptoms of xylitol toxicity include weakness, lethargy, disorientation, collapse, vomiting, tremors, seizures, jaundice, blacktarry stool, coma, or even death.

The best way to prevent xylitol exposure in our pets is to avoid having any products that contain it in the home. If you must have certain products, then they should be kept safe and secure, well out of the reach of pets. If you suspect you pet has ingested a substance containing xylitol it is best to seek help immediately by calling your veterinarian or animal poison control. Early detection and treatment of xylitol ingestion is essential, and if we act fast enough, chances of a full recovery are excellent.

So remember when giving any food to our pets, always check the label for xylitol in the ingredient list, especially when something is labelled as "sugar-free" or "no added sugar." Additionally, before giving any overthe-counter medications or supplements, be sure to check the inactive ingredient list for xylitol. When in doubt, don't give it or check with your veterinarian before giving anything new to your pets.





The class will be held on November 10th from 10 am to Noon, at the Grange located at 5807 Walnut Ave. Orangevale. The first hour will be dedicated to learning about how to compost with worms and the second hour will be building a worm bin. The class is free. If you want to build a worm bin, bring two opaque storage bins (between 10 and 18 gallons) a 1/4 inch drill and a spray bottle. Worms will be offered at \$10 for 1/3 of a pound. A free Goodie bag will be offered while supplies last.

Kate Waldo started Worm Fancy in November 2009 with the objective of teaching children about waste reduction primarily by means of composting with worms.
