

ORANGEVALE RECREATION & PARK DISTRICT SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE NO. 18-11-003 ADOPTED NOVEMBER 8, 2018

By action of the Board of Directors of the Orangevale Recreation & Park District (the "District") adopting proposed Ordinance 18-11-003 Encroachment Ordinance (the "Encroachment Ordinance") at its regular meeting on November 8, 2018, the following Summary of Adopted Ordinance No. 18-11-003, Encroachment Ordinance, is authorized to be published in a newspaper of general circulation throughout the jurisdiction of the District within 15 days after adoption of the Ordinance, in order to notify citizens of the adoption of the Encroachment Ordinance. The following Summary of Ordinance No. 18-11-003 has been adopted by the Board of Directors of the District pursuant to the provisions of Government Code section 25124(b)(1) and has been prepared by the District's Legal Counsel at the direction of the Board of Directors. The purpose of this Ordinance is to regulate encroachments upon District Property and set forth the procedures to be followed by members of the public to obtain permission from the District to access District Property for the purpose of gaining access to other property, or for the purpose of constructing and/or maintaining any improvements, structures or objects which are partially located on District Property.

This Summary shall be published at least fifteen (15) days after the regular meeting of the Board of Directors at which this Encroachment Ordinance was adopted.

The following constitutes the official Summary of Adopted Ordinance No. 18-11-003, Encroachment Ordinance of the Orangevale Recreation & Park District (the "Ordinance").

- 1. Section 3 of the Ordinance defines an encroachment has any structure or object or improvement of any kind or character, including but not limited to, building extensions, fences, decks, retaining walls, landscaping, culverts, bridges, pipelines, or other structures or improvements, or personal property such as vehicles, trailers, boats or equipment located on District Property. "Encroachment" also means to obtain access over District Property for permissible purposes.
- 2. Section 4 of the Ordinance provides that it is unlawful for any person to undertake any excavation or place an encroachment in, under or over any District Property whether or not currently improved, or to permit an encroachment to exist on District property unless an Encroachment Permit has been issued by the District The District will issue Encroachment Permits for authorized uses of District Property which do not interfere with the District's use of such property for the provision of public services. Such Encroachment Permits only permit limited public access to District Property for temporary periods of time.
- 3. Section 4 of the Ordinance provides that the form of Encroachment Permit requires the permit applicant requesting authorization for construction and/or installation of any structure or improvement on District Property, or authorizing any excavation on District Property, to post performance security with the District in the form of a performance bond, irrevocable letter of credit, or cash in the amount of 100% of the estimated cost of the work to be performed pursuant to the encroachment permit.

4. The Ordinance at Section 4 provides that the Permittee will be required to indemnify the District from and against all actions, liability, damages, claims, losses or expenses arising from the negligent performance of, failure to perform, or dangerous condition caused by the authorized work of the Permittee pursuant to the Encroachment Permit; and requires that the Permittee provide insurance to cover such potential damages.

In addition, this section of the Ordinance provides that any application for an encroachment permit may be denied or revoked effective immediately upon any one or more of the following grounds: (1) Violation of any of the provisions of this Ordinance or the Permit; (2) misrepresentations of any material fact in the application.

On a motion by Director Montes, seconded by Director Swenson, the foregoing ordinance was passed and adopted by the Board of Directors of the Orangevale Recreation & Park District this November 8, 2018, by the following vote:

3 eggs

2 teaspoons pumpkin pie

1/2 teaspoon salt

Filling:

1-15 oz can of pumpkin 1 cup sugar

spice

2 teaspoons vanilla extract 2/3 cup heavy cream

Streusel topping:

2 cups flour

1 1/2 cups sugar

2 teaspoons cinnamon

1/2 teaspoon salt

12 tablespoons butter,

melted

Preheat oven to 375. Butter a 12" cast iron skillet or casserole dish. Set aside.

Filling: Whisk together pumpkin, sugar, eggs, pie spice, salt and extract. Once mixed, add in cream and whisk. Pour into the skillet and set aside.

Streusel: In a medium bowl, whisk flour, sugar, cinnamon and salt. Add butter and stir with a fork until crumbly. Spread streusel topping on top of pumpkin pie mixture in an even layer.

Bake until the filling is set and top is golden brown - 40 to 45 minutes. Let cool about 10 minutes, then top with vanilla ice cream.






