The 7th annual Howl 'o Ween Parade and Harvest Festival are scheduled for Saturday, October 20th, in Citrus Heights. Applications are now available for both parts of the popular event that was created and is coordinated by the Citrus Heights Community Marching Band (CHC-MB).





BASIC GUIDELINES FOR SCARECROW

Late Entries will be accepted up to time of judging. Entries must be registered and installed by 5pm, Oct 20, 2018, to be included for Judging. Basic 2x4 frames are recommended. You may have multiple entries (\$10 each).

Scarecrows that are difficult to assemble may still be submitted if they are installed on the designated pole by the maker.

All pieces must be secured so as not to be easily disassembled by the weather.

Names for display are optional. They may include naming the submission, name of maker including business name /phone number/website. These signs must be easily secured to the display pole or the scarecrow as not to create a safety hazard. Suggested is using an 8 1/2x11 laminated sheet stapled to the wood poles or tied to the metal poles. Duct tape should not be used on the street lighting poles as it will damage the finish.

You must remove it between November 3rd through the 6th. Any remaining entries will be disposed of.

Organizers may omit a submission if they find the theme offensive or too political. $\label{eq:condition}$

<u>If entry will be set up by Festival Committee</u> it must be no more than 3 pieces to assemble not including the name sign. Scarecrows will be stored by organizers and reinstalled each year as long at the submission maintains its integrity.



THE GOOD, THE BAD, & THE UGLY

California's New Laws: The Good, the Bad, and the Ugly After nine months, 1,016 new laws, and 201 gubernatorial vetoes, this year's legislative session has arrived at its formal conclusion. Among the flurry of lawmaking, covering topics from cyber security to clean energy, three themes have dominated: taxation, public safety, and sexual misconduct. Now that the dust has settled, it is worth taking stock of where the state went right, where it went wrong, and what remains to be accomplished.

Taxation: Following last year's historic gas tax increase (which I strongly opposed), lawmakers have pushed forward with proposals for even more new taxes, including a tax on fireworks, a tax on cell phones and landlines, and the state's first-ever tax on water. Thankfully, all these taxes were defeated — though not without a fair share of mischief. For example, when supporters of the water tax realized they were just short of getting support from 2/3 of the Legislature (a requirement for new taxes), they attempted to rebrand their proposal as an "optional fee," which would have needed only a simple majority to pass. Fortunately, rank-and-file lawmakers saw through the ploy, and the bill failed anyway.

Public Safety: In recent years the Legislature's record on public safety has been especially abysmal. That trend continued through 2018, with new laws to reduce penalties for being an accomplice to mur-

der, or in the case of young offenders, actual murder. There was some silver lining, however. My legislation to make it easier to prosecute disorderly conduct was signed into law, and the Governor vetoed legislation that would have permitted a city to administer injection sites for heroin.

Safe Workplaces: The legislature passed several measures aimed at stopping sexual harassment in the workplace. That includes legislation to require sexual harassment prevention training, as well as legislation to protect whistleblowers from retaliatory lawsuits. My own bill to protect California students from sexual misconduct in schools was also signed into law.

The results of this year's legislative session are decidedly mixed. One issue that's gone unaddressed, however, is California's increasingly unaffordable cost of living. With more Americans moving out of the Golden State than moving in, this must become our priority.

FIVE POWERFUL WAYS TO TURN THE TIDE ON TOO MANY DRINKS OR DRUGS

There just might be someone in your family who drinks too much or misuses medications, especially after a surgery or injury. And they just might need some help leaving alcohol or other drugs behind and finding freedom from the substances that damage their lives.

Healing can truly begin when your loved one seeks treatment for their addiction or alcoholism, which we know today as a brain disease called "substance use disorder." And it's not just the "substance abuser" who finds recovery: the entire family can get better, too, with the help of these five basic steps: 1.Learn about substance use disorder, a brain disease that disrupts normal brain function so the addict/alcoholic persists in destructive behavior in spite of negative consequences. This is not a disease of character or a moral failing. You can't "guilt" your loved one out of this disease or "love it away," but you can empower a return to health by supporting him or her in sobriety, not in addiction or alcoholism.

- 2. Circle the wagons. Educate family members about what healthy support for recovery looks like. Substance use disorder is a family disease that can take everybody down; at the same time, an informed and united family is a powerful force in recovery.
- 3. Understand that you didn't cause your loved one's substance use disorder, you can't control it and you can't cure it. You didn't make him/her sick and you can't make him/her better. Recovery is your

CRACKING DOWN

CRACKING DOWN ON REPEAT OFFENDERS

In 2014 California passed Proposition 47, which reduced the classification of most nonviolent property and drug crimes from a felony to a misdemeanor. This policy resulted in a surge of automobile and petty theft crimes throughout the state of California, and the effect of this was seen in businesses and on the streets of Orangevale almost immediately. Since our jails are overcrowded and we do not have room to jail people for misdemeanor crimes, Sacramento Sheriff's would arrest someone for something like theft or drug dealing, only for them to be released that same day, skip bail, and get arrested soon after for something new.

There was a person committing crimes in Orangevale who was the poster-child for this behavior. He was unofficially referred to as the "Mayor of Orangevale" and was locally notorious for always being drunk in public and wreaking havoc on the community. In a period of eight days he was arrested six times, and each time he would be right back in the community the same day he was booked into jail. Another person in the County had around 1600 arrests accumulated through his lifetime (and no, that is not a typo).

In response to these, and similar criminals who act with complete disregard for the law, in 2016 Sacramento County implemented something called the "Chronic Nuisance Offender Program". It is a program I take pride in, and I want to explain to you how it works.

Whenever our Deputies notice someone who is getting arrested over and over again, they keep track and as soon as they have been arrested for the tenth time in a one year period, they notify the District Attorney's office. A District Attorney then offers the criminal a choice, they can either spend 120 days in jail, or they can spend 90 days in a drug or alcohol treatment program (90% of the people in this program are addicts). This produces one of two outcomes:

If they reject the treatment and spend the 120 days in jail, at a


minimum the community can be at peace for a four month period. But in many cases, we are seeing a much greater impact than that. Since these criminals are used to being able to get back onto the street the same day they are arrested, a four month stint in jail is a huge shock. Upon release, many times they either leave the area or clean up their act.

If they enter the drug/alcohol treatment program, we are getting the same benefits as the jail option since they are off the streets for 90 days, but with the added benefit of being able to attempt to treat one of the root causes for their criminal behavior. This only heightens the likelihood that we can positively impact their lives.

Neither I nor the majority of my district supported Proposition 47 because it makes it more difficult for our local law enforcement to keep us safe, but I am proud of what Sacramento County has done to think outside the box and work with what we have got.



¼ tsp Ground Nutmeg ½ cup Sugar ½ cup Shortening 1 Egg, beaten ¼ cup Milk 1 cup Grated Raw Apples

Preheat Oven to 350°. Sift together flour, baking powder, salt, nutmeg, and sugar.

Cut in shortening. Add egg and milk, and then fold in apples.

Pour batter in muffin pans with paper cupcake liners. Bake 20-25 minutes until they are golden in color and tester inserted into center comes out clean.

TOPPING:
