CAN'T CALL? NOW YOU CAN TEXT



"CALL IF YOU CAN – TEXT IF YOU CAN'T"

Sacramento County 9-1-1 Centers representing all law enforcement and fire agencies in the region are excited to announce Text-to-9-1-1 service is available countywide. This means all 9-1-1 Public Safety Dispatch Centers are now equipped to receive and respond to mobile phone Text-to-9-1-1 messages from our citizens.

Individuals who are deaf and hard of hearing members of the community, or those in a situation where it is too dangerous to dial 9-1-1, will have another option to call for help in an emergency, Text-to-9-1-1. The benefits to our citizens are significant, especially in cases when the caller cannot communicate verbally. Examples include not only the hard of hearing, but also when a crime is in progress, the caller is facing domestic abuse, the caller is injured and cannot speak, or other scenarios.

In anticipation of providing this service, we wanted to share some information with you.

Even where text-to-9-1-1 is available, if you can make a voice call to 9-1-1, please call instead of texting

Here are some guidelines for how to contact 9-1-1. If you use a wireless phone or other type of mobile device, make sure to do the following in an emergency:

- •If you can, always contact 9-1-1 by making a voice call, "Call if you can text if you can't."
- •If you are deaf and hard of hearing and Text-to- 9-1-1 is not available, use a TTY or telecommunications relay service, if available.
- If you text 9-1-1 and text is

not available at that time or in your area, you will receive a bounce back message advising "text is not available please make a voice call to 9-1-1."

- *Location accuracy varies by carrier and should not be relied upon. Be prepared to give your location.
- •Text-to-9-1-1 service will not be available if the wireless carrier cannot ascertain a location of the device sending the message.
- •Text-to-9-1-1 is not available if you are roaming.
- •A text or data plan is required to place a text to 9-1-1.
 •Photos and videos cannot be sent to 9-1-1. They cannot be received at

the 9-1-1 center currently.

- •ext messages should be sent in plain language and not contain popular abbreviations (SMH, LOL, ICYMI) or emojis, which will not be recognized.
- •Text-to- 9-1-1 cannot be sent to more than one person. Do not

send your emergency text to anyone other than 9-1-1.

•Texts must be in English only. There currently is no language interpretation for text available. This is still in development.

This is exciting news for our region and we are looking forward to providing this service to our community.

VETERANS DAY

The eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month 1918 - an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities, was declared between the Allied nations and Germany in the First World War. Since no one knew that there would be a sequel in 20 years, it was known as "the Great War" or the war to end all wars but didn't have a number. Commemorated as Armistice Day beginning the following year, November 11th became a legal federal holiday in the United States in 1938. In the aftermath of World War II and the Korean War. Armistice Day became Veterans Day, a holiday dedicated to American veterans. Unlike Memorial Day, it was not intended to just remember those that fell in battle. Instead it was a day to recognize all those that men and women that have served over the course of 241 years of this nation's existence. Whether the service was in war time or peace time or in foreign countries or at home, the Veteran would be recognized on this day. The veteran knows not what the situation will be when they sign the bottom line and raise their right hand and promise to support and defend the constitution. Peace time quickly can become war time.







This week, we have a recipe from Lynne Miles. She made this dish twice in one month. It's easy to make and the flavors are rich. She didn't think she would like the mint, but it was fabulous. Her family also ate it on the romaine lettuce cups. (She thought her husband would dip into his tortillas, but the lettuce was so fresh and delicious he didn't.) This is another great recipe for a fall evening!

THAI LETTUCE WRAPS

2 lbs lean ground beef (you can also use ground pork, chicken, or turkey) 2 cups beef broth (substitute chicken broth if using other ground meat)

3 cloves garlic, crushed 1/3 cup fresh lime juice (2-3 limes)

3 Tbsp fish sauce –find it in the foreign food section at the grocery store

2/3 cups very finely chopped cilantro (about 1 bunch) 2/3 cups very finely chopped mint (about 1 bunch)

Head romaine lettuce to serve Directions:

1. Brown ground beef in a large skillet over medium-high heat, breaking up frequently with a spoon or spatula to achieve a fine cooked ground beef texture (small pieces), 8-10 minutes.

2. Add broth to beef. If broth is unseasoned, add 1/2 teaspoon of salt. Let simmer, stirring occasionally, until broth has completely boiled away, about 6-8 minutes.

Meanwhile, 3. combine crushed garlic, lime juice and fish sauce. Finely chop and then combine cilantro and mint in a separate bowl. Separate lettuce leaves and cut in half if very large.

4. Once broth has boiled off completely (if you listen carefully, you can hear the moment that there's no longer any water in the pan), stir in the lime juice mixture. Simmer, stirring, until the lime juice mixture has also boiled away, about 2-3 minutes.

5. Stir in chopped herbs, immediately remove beef from heat and serve.

6. To serve: scoop a generous spoonful of beef mixture into a lettuce leaf, wrap the lettuce leaf up around the edges like a taco. You can also serve as a salad on a bed of shredded lettuce.

BAD DOG BREATH IS NOT A GIVEN

When enjoying a new puppy or young dog, it is normal to spend most of your time trying to burn through all their energy or working on solidifying those basic obedience commands. This is also the perfect time to get them accustomed to a dental health routine!

Brushing a dog or cat's teeth daily is the best way to stave off gingivitis-causing plaque and tartar. There are so many on the market, so you want to find one that is approved by the Veterinary Oral Health Council (VOHC), as they have been shown by scientific studies to support the company's claims.

Aside from lessening bad breath, dental pain, and infection, prevention is 1/3 the cost of treating major dental problems later in life. Even if you pet already has bad teeth, you can start this new routine after your pet has a professional cleaning by your veterinarian. Healthy smiles for all!





For three days, October 9th, 10th and 11th, teachers and parents brought a class each day to the Fair Oaks Community Garden for an educational outing.

Susan Hammond, a member of the Community Garden and Christy Wallace, Master Gardener and a Community Garden member, introduced the students to various aspects of growing vegetables. The Bugs (Good and Bad): This part of the session is quite my favorite, for after a discussion of which bugs are not good to have in the garden and which are beneficial, they got to hold live lady bugs for a few minutes then turn them loose to devour aphids in the garden. The entire garden was filled with

laughter.

The Tour: Groups are split into two groups and taken through the 84-plot garden, to see in person many kinds of vegetables as they are growing. These include eggplant, corn, tomatoes, beans, carrots, celery, pumpkins, strawberries, blackberries, cucumbers, onions, garlic, bitter melon, artichokes, and many more.

The Work: Since the Community Garden has a large area set aside in which to grow vegetables for donation to the local food bank, the students helped with that effort by pulling weeds from one of the raised beds. They all did a really good job and their help is appreciated!

The Next Part: Each student planted a seed, watered it and got to take it back to class in a clear cup which, as the plant sprouts and grows in their classroom, will have roots in the dirt visible through the cup.



Another "Great Happening" is going to be held at the Orangevale Grange Hall. Come join the Orangevale Grange and Worm Fancy Kate Waldo to learn about turning your kitchen waste into black gold by composting with worms. The class will be held on November 10th from 10 am to Noon, at the Grange located at 5807 Walnut Ave, Orangevale. The first hour will be dedicated to learning about how to compost with worms and the second hour will be building a worm bin. The class is free. If you want to build a worm bin, bring two opaque storage bins (between 10 and 18 gallons) a 1/4 inch drill and a spray bottle. Worms will be offered at \$10 for 1/3 of a pound. A free Goodie bag will be offered while supplies last.

Kate Waldo started Worm Fancy in November 2009 with the objective of teaching children about waste reduction primarily by means of composting with worms. Through the past eight years, Worm Fancy has worked with clients like the City of Sacramento, Republic Services, the City of Elks Grove, Cal EPA, the Sacramento Zoo, Sacramento State university, Consumes River College and hundreds of area residents. When Kate is not sharing her passion for composting and conservation she works as an Environmental Engineer.
