

## **PROPOSITIONS IMPACT**

Impact of Propositions to Sacramento County By Sacramento County Supervisor Sue Frost

As has become typical in California, this past November we had a large number of propositions to vote on. Now that the election is squarely behind us and we know the outcome of each proposition, I thought it would be timely for me to explain the immediate impacts that some of these will have directly on Sacramento County and Orangevale.

Proposition 1 (passed). This proposition does a variety of things, but it has two main components that will impact the County. First, it provides \$1 billion in the form of loans to veterans to make it easier for them to get into home ownership. With over 87,000 veterans living in Sacramento County, this will undoubtedly help many of our residents.

The other main component is \$1.5 billion in the form of loans for the construction and rehabilitation of rental housing for people with income below 60 percent of the area median income. A report from October showed that when compared to the 50 largest markets in the United States, the Sacramento Metropolitan Area has the #1 worst housing crisis. Local builders will be applying for a significant amount of that money since the demand is so high.

This money is not free however, and California will need to pay it back with interest.

Proposition 2 (passed). Simply put, this proposition takes some State money that is dedicated to mental health treatment, and diverts it to housing for the homeless. While the County most certainly needs more money to help with mental health treatment, we also have an enormous need for housing that gets much larger every year. The passing of this proposition will get Sacramento County an estimated \$4.2 million yearly, as well as make us eligible to compete with nine other counties for funding from a pool of anywhere between \$486 million to \$682 million.

Proposition 4 (passed). This proposition authorized \$1.5 billion in bonds for the construction and expansion of children's hospitals. Locally, that means UC Davis Children's Hospital will receive \$54 million as a one-time payment.

As with Proposition 1, California will need to be pay this money back with interest.

Proposition 6 (failed). This proposition would have repealed the "gas tax" that was approved by the legislature last year, and since the tax was already implemented, nothing will change now that the proposition did not pass. But now that we know the gas tax is here to stay, here is what to expect:

On average, Sacramento County will receive around \$25 million yearly to help with maintenance of the roads. But while this may seem like a lot of money, the reality is that Sacramento County needs around \$50 million yearly to just keep up with the deterioration of the roads, and we would need even more than that to start trimming down our \$700 million backlog of needed road repairs. More investments will need to be made if we want our roads to be at an acceptable level, either in the form of switching our spending priorities, or more taxes. If you have followed my past articles, you will know that I support switching priorities without raising taxes.

#### HOLIDAY HAZARDS FOR PETS

Whether you are celebrating Hanukkah, Kwanza, or Christmas, the holiday season brings us many reasons to be cheerful and happy. Unfortunately, they can also put your furry companions at risk. Holidays don't have to be hazardous though, and with a little awareness and prevention you both can enjoy the season without hitting these toxic traps.

Ribbon/tinsel is fantastic for holiday décor, but if eaten can create an accordion-like bunching of the intestines causing an emergent blockage. Be very cautious with these beautiful but problematic Antifreeze adornments. (ethylene glycol) is VERY toxic to ALL furry friends. While it's great at keeping our cars in winter-condition, it is fatal to pets unless treatment is IMMEDIATELY. initiated Staggering gait, vomiting and drooling will eventually progress to kidney failure. Purchase the children/pet safe product, propylene glycol instead. Electrical cords are necessary for powering holiday decorations, but chewing on cords can cause electrocution. While the burns in the mouth can look bad, the fluid accumulation in their lungs is worse.

Even a small amount of grapes or raisins can cause kidney failure in some dogs. While not all dogs are susceptible to such toxicity, it's better to be safe than sorry. Xylitol is an artificial sweetener used in many sugar-free products. It can ultimately cause a fatal hypoglycemia & liver failure if not treated. Chocolate and rich, greasy foods should also be avoided.

While Lily's are beautiful, these are HIGHLY toxic to cats. Even the smallest amount ingested (leaves, flower, stem) can cause severe kidney damage, sometimes leading to kidney failure. Christmas tree water itself is not bad, but watch out if you have additives to keep that tree hydrated and fresh. These additives can cause vomiting and diarrhea. Holly has caffeine like substances in them as well as bitter tasting proteins that can lead to GI upset. While usually not fatal, this can still cause unpleasant tummy distress. Mistletoe is a romantic but toxic addition to the holiday season. It can cause vomiting & diarrhea, heart disorders, difficulty breathing, and erratic behavior. Keep tied up high and away from the family pets. Poinsettia is a known toxic plant to most households, but is actually not as severe or fatal as Lily plants or Sago Palms. If you have any questions or concerns about what your pet may have gotten into, seek immediate veterinarv assistance or contact the SPCA Poison Control at (888) 426-4435. #### HEADS UP, IT'S TICK SEASON!

In fact, it is always tick season, especially in California. Ticks are technically not insects but arachnids, which means they have 8 pairs of legs and are closely related to mites. There are three mobile stages of ticks, larvae, nymph and adult, that all need to feed on a host to survive.

While spring and summer may be the time for the most aggressive tick behavior, fall and winter still have their fair share of tick activity. In fact, the adult Western blacklegged (deer) ticks are most active in the winter months. They live in the wooded areas along the coastlines and are the only tick species in the west that can transmit Lyme disease.

In addition, the Brown dog tick is a tick species that lives mainly indoors, inside homes and kennels where dogs call home. They tend to crawl up walls and curtains and can be found in some false ceilings as well. This tick is cold and drought tolerant, which makes it particularly suited for life in almost any climate.

Unlike fleas, ticks spend most of their time in the environment and only attach to "hosts" to feed. They drop off after each feeding to molt to their next stage and then wait patiently to find another unlucky host. They are

also patient opportunists, that sit at the top of vegetation (grasses, shrubbery) and hope to catch a ride. They don't jump, but just stick their legs out and climb on when something comes close enough. Fortunately, we live in a time where a plethora of veterinarian approved tick preventatives are on the market in the form of topical spot-ons, oral tablets and collars. By keeping your pet on yearround tick prevention, the risk of tick-borne diseases transmitted to you and your pets is dramatically reduced. The Companion Animal Parasite Council website petsandparasites. org provides detailed information on ticks, tickborne diseases and ways to combat tick exposure.


