

UNSUPPORTED DEATH VALLEY CROSSING TO SUPPORT HOMELESS CHILDREN

Starting December 14, 2018, Roland Banas will walk across Death Valley, from the southernmost to the northernmost point, about 145 miles away. He will cross salt flats, sandy dunes, rocky dry-river beds and mountain washouts. Off-trail and unsupported, he will carry all the food, water and equipment required for the 8-day journey in a 90lbs+ backpack. Just like carrying both his young sons... all day! This journey has been successfully done only once (in the reverse direction) by Louis-Philippe Loncke, a Belgian explorer. A few others have tried, all have failed.

Roland is not an extreme explorer or adventurer like Louis-Philippe. He is a regular Orangevale dad and a local childcare owner (The Lil' School) who loves the outdoors. But he welcomes a



I LOVE CHRISTMAS

I love Christmas. I love all that it truly stands for. However, our tinseled trappings and traditions frequently give us the illusion of joy rather than the real thing.

Often, the modern American Christmas can be a commercialized and sentimental escape from reality into fantasyland. We think and dream of life as how it should be, ought to be, and what we want it to be. We often forget that for many people Christmas doesn't end happily ever after.

Let me illustrate... We sing "I'll be home for Christmas" or "Home for the holidays." This sounds great if your home isn't broken through divorce or abuse, or you are not mourning the death of a loved one. Going "home" for a cameo appearance at Christmas seems shallow when underlying rifts need to be reconciled but one or both parties is too proud to forgive.

Let me illustrate some more... Some kids grow up thinking that "Frosty the Snowman" is the guy down the street who sells cocaine--a whole new meaning to "White Christmas". Nowadays a youngster might catch mommy doing more than kissing Santa Claus. Grandma would not get run over by a reindeer--more likely it would be an SUV or sports car speeding down Greenback. Gang members and drive-by shootings may even take your neighbor for a "slay" ride. In the midst of all these Christmas songs I saw three ships come sailing in but they were bound for the Persian Gulf, full of real soldiers, armed with real guns. Missiles replaced mistletoe and missals.

I don't want to sound like a Scrooge or scare the dickens out of anyone, but we need to realize that for many, this is really not the most wonderful time of the year. For some it is dreadful, as the holidays seem to intensify their personal pain. Broken promises like broken toys are discarded to the closets of broken homes. Many feel displaced and "homeless" even though they have houses. For them, "home alone" is more than a movie: it's the lonely reality. Commercial concerns and fantasies of family have much more to do with Christmas than we like to admit.

Christmas cheer finds enduring reality when we realize that in the middle of the tragedies of life, there is eternal hope; that in Jesus, Emmanuel, God is with usand if God is with us, who can stand against us? Our giving finds real meaning as we keep God's gift in clear view.

The first Christmas wreath was a crown of thorns, a barbed garland of grace for all who would bow to Him as King. We take the wraps off of Christmas daily when we relish the reality that the Christ-child was born to die that we may live forgiven.

It seems that our Christmas lights look dim when compared to the One who was named by one historian as "The Light of the World." We not only celebrate that the season has come, we celebrate that The Savior is born! Christ, not mere Christmas candles or carols, brings joy to our world.

The greatest miracle of Christmas was not on 34th Street but in the little town of Bethlehem. The Virgin Mary delivered Christmas presence as God's Love arrived in this "special delivery." Unexpectedly, God made a way in a manger. He displayed the Hallmark of His love, as God was the Original who cared enough to send the very best.

The miracle of Christmas continues daily as we humbly offer ourselves as vessels of God's love to a hurting world, just as God did that first Christmas. As we live our lives in the light of

"We've got this down to a science," said Caroline Easton, Pastoral Care Minister. "Last year we provided Christmas


baskets for over 85 families, this year it's closer to 80. It changes every year," she added.

Families receive gifts for the children, Christmas dinner and additional food for the holiday season as well as some essential household items for the adults. All is done with great care and donated anonymously.

"You never know what these people are going through," reflected Caroline. "It's touching seeing them leave with tears in their eves."

Another on-going and "ongrowing" ministry is the weekly free dinner program provided on Thursday nights at Divine Savior. Anyone in need of a hot, free meal is invited. On average 75 to 115 plates are served with "comfort, stick to your ribs type food". It's also a great opportunity to socialize with others. All are welcome.
