

TEXTING MUST BE TAX FREE

TEXTING MUST BE TAX FREE by Assemblyman Kevin Kiley

In December, the California Public Utilities Commission's (CPUC) proposed the first ever tax on text messages. Texting is integral to modern communication. with Americans sending 1.77 trillion texts every year. It is surely for that reason that the state bureaucrats behind the plan saw texting as such a ripe target, even contemplating applying the tax retroactively to your texts from the last 5 years.

This comes on the heels of perhaps the most tax-heavy session of the Legislature in California history. After passing the largest ever gas tax, legislators attempted to tax water, fireworks, and cell phones -- despite record state revenues. The text tax proposal is vet another example of the state choosing to prioritize the growth of government over affordability for California residents. Projections pegged the cost of a retroactive text tax at \$220 million in the first year and \$45 million annually moving forward, hitting low-income families hardest of all.



To ensure that this misguided proposal cannot be revived, I have introduced Assembly Bill 162 to prohibit the state bureaucracy from taxing text messages now or in the future. While a recent ruling by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) limited the CPUC's regulatory authority over text messages, proponents of the tax are arguing that it can nonetheless still be brought back.

With historical super majorities in the Legislature and a new tenant in the Governor's mansion, it is clear that more tax proposals are on the horizon. Already in the works are efforts to water down Proposition 13 property tax protections and extend the state sales tax to services. This is despite California already having the nation's highest income tax rates and second highest gas taxes -- producing a record \$209 billion budget this year.

And what have Californians received in return? We consistently rank near the bottom nationally in education, infrastructure quality, housing costs, and business climate. It's no wonder that more people have left the once Golden State annually than moved here for 15 consecutive years.

As I begin my second term in the Legislature, I will continue fighting to make our state more affordable and our state government more effective. And that starts with passing Assembly Bill 162 to keep texting tax-free.





DASH INTO THE NEW YEAR ! HOW TO PREPARE FOR THE BIGGEST WALK OF THE YEAR!

Doggy Dash is right around the corner and now is the perfect time for you and your dog to prepare for the big day! Follow our training tips below to make sure this is the best Dash yet!

Start small!

Just like most people don't wake up one day to run a marathon, if your dog is more of a 'couch potato' than a 'dasher,' you'll need to start practicing! A 2K or 5K walk is longer than it seems, especially for a dog who hasn't had much exercise. So start small! A short walk around the neighborhood every morning or evening is a wonderful way to reacquaint your dog with an active lifestyle. Start with a block or two, then work up to a few more, and so on. Think of it as a "Dog Bed to 5K" plan for your dog.

The Doggy Dash is not a timed event or race, so for most of our participants, the "Dash" is more of a leisurely stroll. If you are hoping to train your dog to run the 2K or 5K, follow some of the tips located here!

Things to consider:

require certain precautions. It's just for fun: The Doggy Dash is meant to be a fun event! If your dog is a runner, that's great! If your dog poops out and can't finish, that's fine! No one will judge you, we are
