What started months ago with a Rotary Club member's tour of the Orangevale Food Bank led to a volunteer project completed last week that will pay for half of the facility's electricity bills for decades.

Rotarian Nick Broad said he was astonished during his food bank tour by the amount and quality of food made available to those in need. He also quickly envisioned how the Rotary Clubs of Orangevale and Fair Oaks could spearhead a solar panel installation project to help power the operation's extensive refrigeration and freezer units that keep food fresh.

"He started putting it together in his head within minutes," recalled food bank Executive Director Keith Wright, who in late February celebrated completion of the solar installation.

It's nice to be able to help, Broad said modestly. "I saw the need and I knew who needed to come together to get it done," he said. "They all came together fairly easily."

"This project is unique," said Wright. "I can get grants and people are okay ects that are 'one and done.' But I can't write grants to pay the bills and we cannot operate without paying the bills. This project is going to pay for half of our electricity costs for the next 25 years...helping us out in this way makes what we do possible."



members. "I was thrilled to find out that SMUD and Rotary teamed up to bring this amazing project to the Food Bank," Frost said. "This will make it much easier for the food bank to focus on its core mission of providing food and resources to families in need."

"We really enjoy helping out like this," said Orangevale Rotary President Bobby Peno. "It's good for the food bank, it's good for the volunteers, and it's really a nice thing to be involved with." The two Rotary Clubs, with matching funds from their national organization, raised \$16,000 for the project, and SMUD provided another \$10,000 to complete the

funding. All installation labor was done by local Rotary members following directions from Grid Alternatives, a non-profit organization founded to assist other nonprofits with alternative energy opportunities.

The Orangevale Food Bank distributes food to over 400 families and 1,000 individuals per month, in many cases providing the only food available to its patrons and their children.

GETTING HOMELESS INTO JOBS

From Theory to Reality: Getting Homeless into Jobs By Sacramento County Supervisor Sue Frost

Exactly a year ago, I wrote an article in the Orangevale View outlining why I thought Sacramento County was in need of a work program for people who are homeless. Since then, I worked to help craft a plan that would not only employ people who are homeless, but also work to beautify Sacramento County at the same time. I am thrilled to announce to you that the plan was formally adopted at the end of January, and will begin to be implemented in March. I want to take this opportunity to explain the program to you, and share with you why I believe it will work.

Ten homeless people will be identified who are both willing to work and get clean. They will meet four days a week at a central location, and then be driven to the American River Parkway to get paid minimum wage to do cleanup work. The American River Parkway has been completely trashed in many sections due chiefly homeless encampments and negligent teenagers, so this work is much needed.

In the afternoon, they will then be driven downtown to go through a job training program. This job program is aimed to get them various certifications in the construction industry. With the surge in construction in this region, there is a lack of construction workers, and this is the perfect field for them to get entry level work in.

After ten weeks of working and going through the classes, they will have graduated

out, and a new group of ten will start the program. After leaving the program they will then get help in finding employment by getting introduced to employers, receiving job interview training, getting help creating a resume, and getting help obtaining job-appropriate clothing. This is also coupled with trying to find them a permanent housing solution.

I take great issue with new government programs that are started and turn out to be ineffective, yet get funded for eternity. With that in mind, this will be a trial program that will last for 40 weeks. After those 40 weeks, we will evaluate the program to see if it's working, whether changes need to be made, or whether we need to end the program entirely.

To get this job done, the County (with major help from Sacramento Regional Sanitation District) decided to contract with PRIDE industries, a nonprofit headquartered in Roseville. Their primary mission is to help people who have disabilities overcome employment obstacles, and empower them to lead productive, independent lives as contributing members of our community. It seemed to me to be a perfect fit to have them work with people who are homeless, as many of their challenges are similar to people who have disabilities, such as regaining a sense of selfworth and finding reliable transportation.

I'm excited about this program because I believe finding jobs for people who are homeless is an important piece to this overall problem that we are not looking close enough at. I like the idea of giving them training in a field that sorely needs jobs, and I like the idea of teaching them what it is like again to feel accomplished for earning a paycheck by putting in a hard day's work.

I know this is a drop in the bucket in terms of solving this overall problem, but I am hopeful that we might be onto something really great here, that over time and careful development we can end up putting to work far more than just 40 people.

STOP THE WATER TAX

Stop the Water Tax By Assemblyman Kevin Kiley

Our state's water challenges are significant and require innovative solutions. Unfortunately, the current leadership in Sacramento would prefer to solve these problems with new taxes and more laws rather than common sense policies.

In his recent budget proposal, Governor Newsom identified a serious problem: as many as 1 million Californians, mostly in rural and disadvantaged communities, lack consistent access to safe drinking water. His solution to this problem is a new tax on the drinking water of every resident in our state, a proposal that would cost local water agencies more to administer than it would collect in revenue statewide. I helped defeat this very same proposal in the Legislature last year.

Instead of asking even more of taxpayers, the Legislature would be wise to once again reject the Governor's proposal and utilize existing revenues, including the state's projected \$21 billion budget surplus, to upgrade water treatment facilities. These additional funds would complement the state and federal funds that are already available for this purpose.

In the weeks and months ahead, I will be fighting to not only defeat the water tax, but to move our state away from the centralized, command-and-control, top-down approach to water policy that it epitomizes. The current political leadership in Sacramento contends that the only way to meaningfully secure our water future is by

controlling our citizens' water use. That means forcing people to conserve through water usage caps while empowering the unelected State Water Resources Control Board to impose draconian fines.

Last year, over my objections, the Legislature passed an incredible law limiting Californians to 55 gallons of water per day of indoor use. That cap goes down to 50 gallons per day by the year 2030. In the event that a local water agency exceeds its usage allowance, the water board is empowered to fine the water district \$1,000 per day, a cost that is paid by ratepayers. After 2030, the water board is even empowered to increase water usage restrictions unilaterally.

Such heavy-handed rationing is not the answer. Instead, we should increase our supply of available water by investing in our water infrastructure. That means building new reservoirs and expanding our capacity to efficiently use the water that we store. Amazingly, no new water storage capacity has been built since the 1970s -- and we have failed to adequately invest in our drainage systems. As a result, an average of 200 billion gallons of stormwater that could be captured each year instead flows into the Pacific Ocean.

Our state's water challenges will not be solved with higher taxes and punitive regulations. That's why I am fighting for common sense policies that increase water storage and maximize existing resources to provide clean water for all Californians.







response to the fires in Northern California. The Goodwill network raised over \$270,000 in donations, provided clothing, living supplies, and gift cards to fire victims.

"We are not just a store; we are part of the community," said Wickland. As families suffered great losses in the fires this past fall. Goodwill came to the rescue issuing over 3,500 vouchers and today we are still helping those who have yet to get back on their feet.

Down on your luck? Need a job? Goodwill is always hiring. "This is the safest place to re-enter the workforce especially anyone historically excluded from the workplace," said Wickland, "We can train anyone to do a job, but are always looking for someone kind and compassionate with a strong desire to work."

The Orangevale store currently has 42 employees and is looking to hire more. Volunteers are also welcome and it's not unusual for them to become "hooked on the mission" and join the organization like Orangevale Store Manager, Zara Tahi.

If you are lucky enough to have a job, not down on your luck but love a bargain, then this place is worth checking out! Just like its grand opening in January 2018, the store is clean, organized and well maintained with a great staff ready to serve.

"It's a treasure hunt on any given day," said Manager Tahi. "Some things like fur coats, guitars and high end vintage items are so valuable that they go on our Goodwill. com website auction. For example, a gold piece recently sold for \$4,000!

All donations go through five filters of sorting and evaluating before it hits the floor. "Our staff carefully checks for quality and price accuracy," said Tahi. "Items are constantly moving and nothing is usually out on the floor for more than seven days."

Items that don't get sold, get moved on to the Goodwill outlet where shoppers can purchase by the pound.

It's like Black Friday everyday but on a sale day you can get 50 percent off most items, Tahi added.

"We see people every day that need help and we are here for them," said Tahi. "And it's not uncommon for someone to come in a get a change of clothes. Our mission is to serve and that's what we do."

If you haven't been into the local Goodwill vet, come check it out. Tahi and the Orangevale staff will welcome you with open arms. The Orangevale Goodwill store is open seven days a week!
