Earlier this year, Governor Newsom announced that he was going to make housing his top priority, and called for 3.5 million new homes to be built in California within six years. I believe this is a laudable top priority, and have previously written about the great need in our region for more housing. To start with, Governor Newsom wisely announced \$500 million in awards to cities and counties that meet new. short-term housing goals. I believe the enticement of these funds can propel real change, and I hope Sacramento County will win some of this money.

Unfortunately, Governor Newsom coupled this "carrot" with an extremely dangerous "stick", in the form of withholding gas tax money from cities and counties that don't meet the regional housing targets set by the state. This has shaken virtually the entire state, as 97% of California cities and counties (including Sacramento County) are not hitting their housing targets.

This plan has a fundamental flaw in logic because it ties gas tax money to production goals, when counties are only accountable for planning. We should, and do, encourage housing through the land use process, but the decision whether to build more housing comes largely from factors outside our control. We cannot force builders to build, nor can we force financial institutions to lend the builders money.

Even when projects have been approved, lately we are seeing production slowed down because the builders cannot find enough carpenters, plumbers, electricians, etc. to do the work, in part because the state has seemingly abandoned vocational education. Too few schools have a "shop class", and too many children have been told that college was the only route to success, when in reality jobs working in the trades can often pay more than jobs that require a college education.

Beyond that, I believe it's wrong to threaten our gas tax road funding,

especially after voters went to the polls last November and voted to keep the gas tax. I'm not sure the

gas tax repeal would have failed, had voters known the funding could be taken away for something entirely out of their control.

Our roads cannot bear even a small reduction in funding. As I wrote about earlier this year, even with the gas tax in place, the County needs an additional \$15-20 million yearly just to maintain the roads at the current level, or an additional \$50 million yearly to get them to a standard people would describe as "good".

If Governor Newsom is serious about wanting to build 3.5 million new homes in California, beyond incentives he needs to look at the high cost of construction. It is extremely expensive for a builder in California to conform to the unique regulations contained within the California Environmental Quality Act, and the enormous California Building Code grows larger each year. These regulations are part of the reason that a home in California is 2.4 times more expensive than a comparable home in Texas.

There are potential solutions to this housing crisis, but threatening counties like Sacramento for a problem out of our control ignores the root of the problem, and is ultimately doomed to fail.



GREAT FAMILY BREAK-FAST RECIPE

Ingredients calculated per person: 2 eggs (whisk until yolk and white are combined)

2 strips of bacon, chopped 2 slices of bread (her preference is plain ol' white bread, because it absorbs the egg the best, but use whatever works for you), cubed

In large frying pan, cook bacon until it's crisp to your preference, over medium heat.

Drain off 1/2 of the grease from the pan. Spread the bacon around.

Add cubed bread to the pan. Let the bread cook a little in the grease to crisp it up and then toss it until it's cooked evenly. Be careful not to over-cook your bacon.

Spread everything around the pan evenly.

Add eggs, after 1 min, scrape and mix the eggs and bread mixture. Cook until it's cooked through, it can be a little on the softer side. Salt and pepper to taste.

Notes:

We always had it with a glass of orange juice. This is a great recipe for camping! I hope your readers enjoy this recipe.







SCHOOL SAFETY AND MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

April marked 20 years since the horrific school shooting at Columbine High School in Colorado. The comprehensive school shooting database created by the Center for Homeland Defense and Security, finds in the 20 years following Columbine, 349 persons have been killed and 674 have been injured on our nation's campuses. Only five months into 2019 we have already witnessed the tragic deaths of three students at the University of North Carolina and Highland Ranch STEM School iust a few miles away from Columbine.

In response, policy makers have weighed in with a number of policies to ensure our schools are ready to respond once shots are fired, including adding school resources officers and implementing active shooter drills. While these are worthwhile efforts, they are also reactive. There has been much less emphasis placed on identifying the warning signs and assessing threats before something happens. Appallingly, in many school shooting attacks, information known to school officials, law enforcement, counselors, friends and neighbors reasonably should have been used to prevent the attack.

To make matters worse, California also ranks at or near the bottom nationally for student access to mental health services. This has manifested itself in growing youth suicide rates, which are rising nearly every year in California and are now at their highest levels since 1996. So even when we are able to identify warning signs, our schools are not always prepared to offer the necessary services to help counteract them.

To address these issues, I introduced Assembly Bills 1546 and 1722 this year in partnership with school officials, mental health professionals, and law enforcement groups.

AB 1722 would facilitate the development of school-based vio-

lence prevention plans and multidisciplinary threat assessment teams made up teachers, counselors, law enforcement officers, and mental health professionals. These proven methods of stopping violence before it happens are based on national standards recommended by the Secret Service and are already saving lives in a number of other states.

AB 1546 seeks to capture more federal dollars for mental health services by making it easier for California school districts to access money that is available for this purpose. With growing budgetary pressures for schools across the state, it is critical that we ensure mental health services are not on the chopping block.

Both of these bills have received strong bipartisan support and I intend to advocate for them until they are signed into law.

Virginia and Florida became the first states to mandate a multidisciplinary threat management approach, but only after horrific mass shootings occurred. Ultimately, ABs 1722 and 1546 would encourage California to buck the trend by adopting policies before another preventable mass killing occurs.
