



FIRE CAMP LETS KIDS BE FIREFIGHTERS FOR A WEEK



SHUT DOWN THE SECRET DMV

Shut Down the Secret DMV by Assemblyman Kevin Kilev

Anyone who has been to their local DMV office lately knows what a frustrating and time-consuming experience it can be. But what many Californians may not know is that one particular group of people gets to avoid this experience: Members of the State Legislature.

This is because a Secret DMV office has existed for many years across from the State Capitol that is only available for use by legislators and Capitol insiders. At a time when the DMV is failing to adequately serve Californians, it is unconscionable that lawmakers tasked with keeping the department accountable are not required to endure the same experience as the people they represent. That's why I have introduced AB 862, a bill to prohibit the DMV from operating an office that is only open to a select few political insiders.

It will be interesting to see how quickly the Legislature works to reform the beleaguered DMV once legislators have to wait in line at the DMV like everyone else. There can be no doubt that serious reform is needed. Multiple news reports and audits in recent months have highlighted a number of the department's deficiencies.

Many locations have had lines with over six hour wait times in some locations, much of which stemmed from the DMV's failure to properly prepare for the rollout of federal Real ID laws. In fact, the Department of Homeland Security sent a letter to Governor Gavin Newsom this week confirming that over 3 million Californians who have already obtained their Real IDs will be required to return to the DMV to show another valid form of identification after the DMV failed to meet requirements that have



been in federal law for 14 years.

Furthermore, since the passage of California's Motor Voter law, the DMV has also been responsible for mishandling over 100,000 voter registrations, including allowing at least 1,500 ineligible voters to register. Most recently, an audit by the Department of Finance uncovered a number of concerning findings at the DMV including an outdated organizational structure, poor performing IT systems, and a failure to properly train employees to meet the needs of customers.

Our system was designed to be a government of the people, by the people, and for the people. State representatives should not enjoy privileges that aren't available to the people they represent. It's time to put an end to the Secret DMV. And it's time to fix the DMV for all Californians.

Assemblyman Kevin Kiley represents the 6th Assembly District, which includes parts of El Dorado, Placer, and Sacramento counties. 



I received a wonderful surprise in the mail the other day! It was a recipe from my neighbor Rhonda Asbenson who sent in a recipe for a dessert that I had a dream about! I seriously had a dream about flan! Her mother, Betty Ryan, is of Irish decent, but her recipe for Mexican Flan is delicious! When an Orangevale friend of hers, Missy Herguth, began International Dinner Nights with friends, she signed up to bring her mom's flan. She hadn't made it in years, but the rave reviews helped her remember why it always was a favorite. We are always looking for new recipes, so if you would like to share a favorite recipe, please send a copy to Suzanne Feblowitz at the Orangevale View (editor@ovview.com). Be sure to include your phone number or email with your recipe in case we need to contact you. If you wish to remain anonymous, just let us know and we will omit your name.

Betty Ryan's Mexican Flan 6 eggs

- 1- 14 oz can sweetened, condensed milk
- 1 12 oz can evaporated milk
- 1 tsp vanilla

3/4 cup white sugar

1 tsp ground cinnamon

1/2 to 3/4 cup brown sugar (vour preference for sweetness)

Beat eggs. Add condensed and evaporated milks, vanilla, and white sugar and mix well. Mix brown sugar and cinnamon together and sprinkle onto bottom of loaf pan. Pour mixture over brown sugar. Put a bit less that 1/2 inches of hot water into a separate baking pan. Place the loaf pan with ingredients into the baking pan (the goal is to have the loaf pan sitting in a 1/2 inch of hot water in the baking pan).

Bake at 350 F for 1 hour. Insert knife into the center: it should come out clean. Remove the loaf pan from the baking pan, cool until it is cool to the touch, and store in the loaf pan in the refrigerator until vou will serve it. (Making it the day before is best for the flavor, but it is good whatever the timing!) When ready to serve, flip the flan out of the pan and drizzle the remaining caramelized brown sugar/cinnamon mixture over the top. Slice into 1/2 inch slabs of deliciousness.




52ND ANNUAL SPRING ARTS AND CRAFTS FAIR IN HISTORIC FOLSOM

Little Free Libraries are a global phenomenon. The small. front yard book exchanges number 36,000 around the world in 70 countries — from Iceland to Tasmania to Pakistan. Through Little Free Libraries, millions of books are exchanged each year, profoundly increasing access to books for readers of all ages and backgrounds. Now, a new Little Free Library installed outside of Claire's Montessori International Academy in Orangevale will join the movement to share books, bring people together and create communities of readers.

The Upper Elementary students have been leading this community service project the past seven months from project planning to fundraising to a school-wide book donation drive. After two successful bake sales and with the generous support of an Orangevale Rotary Partnership In Education grant, students raised \$1000 to cover all the costs to install and maintain the library. On April 12 these resourceful students will host a small Ribbon Cutting Ceremony to celebrate their achievement and mark the opening of Orangevale's newest Free Little Library.

"Our Little Free Library doesn't just belong to us, it belongs to our community," says parent volunteer Candy Judson. The students shared "It's our hope that this Little Free Library will bring a little more joy and a whole lot more books to our community."


