In 1993, a group of moms at the fledgling Divine Savior Catholic Church, located in the Fair Oaks Bingo Hall, recognized a need for inexpensive children's clothing. Donations were solicited and sales were successful. Each year, more items were added, and a larger venue was found until it burgeoned into the area's largest rummage sale — the 26th Annual Treasure Fest!

This event is the church's largest fundraiser. Unsold items are donated to non-profit agencies which assist newly arrived refugees to furnish apartments, women entering the workforce for the first time, etc; and contributions to Loaves and Fishes, Laundry Love (laundry services for the homeless), and others. Supported Parish programs include the Community Meal, St. Vincent de Paul Clothes Closet, Christmas Basket Program for area families, and more. Meeting/event space is provided for Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Narcotics Anonymous, Senior Care Solutions, and the recent "Big Day of Service" community wide event.

The Treasure Fest offers gently used shoes and clothing, 2 full rooms of toys and books, fashion accessories, housewares, home décor and seasonal decorations, furniture, antiques and collectibles, electronics, linens, sporting goods, camping equipment, framed art, and tools; too much to list! The merchandise is displayed in a 17,000 square foot air- conditioned gym and ½ acre parking lot.

Donations of gently used items are gratefully accepted. "Drop Off Days" beginning on July 9th are Tuesdays/Thursdays, 9 AM to noon, and Saturday July 13 & 20th from 9 AM to 1 PM, in the parking lot located behind the gym. 





TOWING AWAY LOCAL CONTROL

TOWING AWAY LOCAL CONTROL

One of the more common reasons that people from Orangevale call my office is to plead for help in getting junky/abandoned vehicles removed from the neighborhood. People will purchase cars/RVs in horrible condition for extremely cheap, run them into the ground, then leave them to rot on a residential street. Many decide to use that broken-down vehicle as their home. They know the County cannot legally tow a vehicle unless it has been stationary for over 72 hours, so they drive the vehicle (or tow if non-operational) a few feet down the road to restart the 72 hours. This is a practice that angers residents, reduces available parking spaces, and greatly adds to the amount of blight.

So imagine my surprise when I found out recently that there is a bill (AB 516) swiftly moving through the California Legislature that would eliminate the enforcement tools Sacramento County uses to address these motorists who disregard basic laws designed to benefit Orangevale as a whole. Specifically, it removes our ability to tow a vehicle for being stationary for 72+ hours, in addition to removing our ability to tow for having 5+ parking tickets or registration that has been expired for 6+ months.

If passed, this will allow people to live in front of homes and businesses in our neighborhood, in unregistered vehicles with unpaid tickets and expired registration, for as long as they want. I am staunchly opposed to this proposal, and will be doing everything in my power to

stop it.

I have heard from some constituents who tell me they believe the 72-hour window is a bit too short, and unsuspecting residents may be getting unfairly penalized. But the 72-hour parking enforcement notice is almost always triggered by a complaint from a local resident or business when cars appear abandoned or haven't moved for an extended period of time. By the time the County responds and issues the 72hour notice, the vehicle has already been abandoned there for days, if not weeks.

I do recognize that this bill would provide some financial relief to an individual who chronically ignores parking violations, but I strongly feel that benefit is far outweighed by the cost it has to the greater good of the Orangevale community. It is extremely frustrating to get a ticket or have your car impounded, but it is also frustrating for communities when they have to deal with increased blight.

I am also upset with the message this law would send, as it rewards people who fail to adhere to reasonable policies aimed at keeping our communities clean and safe.

This is a worrying trend that is happening in California, where we seem to be rewarding bad behavior. I not only find this morally wrong, but I also believe it encourages more of this type of behavior in the future, greatly exacerbating the problem.

The AB 516 has already passed through the Assembly, but still has to be passed in the Senate, where I think it has a much harder time getting passed. I am working at getting Sacramento County to formally oppose the bill, and will be speaking with the Senators who overlap with my district about why they should oppose the bill as well. I will keep you updated later in the year when I have more information.

PRESERVING LIBERTY

PRESERVING LIBERTY THROUGH CIVICS EDUCATION

This month we celebrate the 243 year of our great nation's independence. Our forefathers embarked on a grand experiment that has since inspired individuals and countries across the globe to aspire to freedom. Liberty, however, is not something that is guaranteed. On the contrary, it is something that Thomas Jefferson once said would require "eternal vigilance" to preserve.

One of the best ways we can preserve liberty is through civics education and engagement. For California, there is certainly room for improvement in this regard. A report by the California Task Force on K-12 Civic Learning highlights a number of concerning trends, including:

- •The United States ranks 139 in voter participation of 172 democracies around the world
- •Just 13% of high school seniors in California show a solid understanding of U.S. history
- •Less than half of 2,366 high school seniors surveyed in California view being actively involved in state and local issues as their responsibility

Compounding these statistics is the lack of robust civics education in our high schools. This has become a major focus of mine in the Legislature as I look to form a bipartisan coalition of lawmakers committed to placing a greater emphasis on civic learn-

This year I introduced a bill to require a mastery of civics education before receiving the California State Seal Merit Diploma. The legislation, Assembly Bill 1787, was numbered to match the year the United States Constitution was signed.

In 2017, I supported legislation (AB 24) to create the State Seal of Civic Engagement, which are awarded to pupils that demonstrate excellence in civics education and participation and have demonstrated an understanding of the United States Constitution, the California Constitution, and the democratic system of government.

As we pursue advances in civics education, it is important that we are framing the discussion correctly. The National Center for Learning and Civic Education lays out a number of proven practices for effective civic learning.

One important aspect is providing high quality instruction in government, history, law, and democracy. Research demonstrates that young people who know more about government are more likely to vote, discuss politics, contact their government officials, and take part in other civic activities more than their less knowledgeable counterparts.

Another key factor is incorporating discussion of current local, national, and international issues and events in the classroom. Planned, moderated discussions of controversial issues teach essential skills for participating in a democracy and prepare students for the real world.

Finally, it is important that schools offer extracurricular activities that provide opportunities for young people to get involved in their schools or communities. This involvement early in life can translate into greater participation as an adult.

But while the Legislature and our education system continues to find ways to improve civics education. we as individuals cannot forget our role and responsibility to participate. Whether it be through community service casting a ballot, we must never forget the "eternal vigilance" that is required to preserve liberty. Participation gives us a stake in the democratic process that no one can ever take awav.







Summer is in full swing and maybe you might need a quick recipe that everyone will enjoy! My friend, Dana Wurster, served this at our Stamping event recently and everyone enjoyed it so much they asked for the recipe. Afterwards, I made it for my family and all of them enjoyed it. You can add or subtract ingredients to suit the likes of your family! CHICKEN SALAD

4 cups shredded chicken- Here's the key: use the rotisserie chicken from Costco (Make sure to check the refrigerated case, because sometimes they have cut up halves to use!)

- 1 stalk celery, cut in half and then slice
- 4 green onions, thinly sliced or ¼ red onion, chopped
- 1 ½ tsp finely chopped fresh tarragon or dill

2 TBSP finely chopped parsley 34 cup mayonnaise

2 tsp freshly squeezed lemon

1 tsp Dijon mustard or yellow mustard

2 tsp kosher salt Freshy ground pepper

Toss together the chicken, celery, onion, dill (or tarragon) and parsley in a large bowl.

In a separate bowl, whisk together the mayonnaise, lemon juice, mustard, salt and pepper (to taste).

Add to the chicken and mix together. Refrigerate until ready to use.

Serve on a bed of lettuce or sliced bread or croissant rolls. Enjoy!

Notes from Dana: I used basil because I didn't have dill. I used balsamic vinegar in place of the lemon juice. I also added a sprinkle or 2 of garlic powder. Notes from Suzanne: seems to be a very versatile recipe. The rotisserie chicken gives so much flavor, so not much seasoning is needed! Season to taste. Also, I didn't have fresh dill, so I used dried dill.


