About Kidz

In 2008 a small group from New Life Church in Fair Oaks had a vision to help underserved kids get a good send off to the new school year. After the seeds were planted and the wheels started turning, enough donations were gathered to help over 100 kids. Since then, the vision has blossomed into a full fledged, non-profit organization dedicated to helping kids year round called "About Kidz". To their great joy, this years donations have flourished into helping a record 1000 + kids!

"The people at New Life have serving others in their DNA," said About Kidz Executive Director, Jeff Pitnikoff. "It's pretty amazing to see this all come together."

The back to school program called "First Day" is one of three major programs "About Kidz" focuses on providing support to kids and their families throughout the year.

"About Kidz' has become a steady, tangible resource for many," Jeff explained. "It never gets old helping these families."

Part of the organization's success is in forming key partnerships in the community like the San Juan Unified School District who target schools in the district with kids in the greatest need. With their help, applications are



distributed and collected by the end of the school year. Once the applications are in, that's when About Kidz staff get busy.

"Once we get the kids registered, we go to work figuring out what grade, what supplies and what size clothing and shoes they need," said Jeff. "Then we go to work collecting those supplies."

Over the years About Kidz has also partnered with Walmart to conduct one-day supply drives. This year they expanded that one-day drive to 10 Walmarts resulting in donations covering nearly 70% of the items needed. Other businesses like Apple jumped in to help by sponsoring 80 children completely. Where there were gaps in supplies, other groups filled in, organizing more supply drives.

The good fruits from About Kidz doesn't stop with their "First Day" program but has branched into "Grad Day" a free two-day a week tutoring program for kids needing some extra help in the classroom. About Kidz partners with local high school AVID students who

earn community service hours and if they complete the required amount of hours tutoring, earn a scholarship towards their own future education. A win win!

Speaking of winning, "Game Day" is another About Kidz program for kids who wouldn't normally have the funds or the support to play in youth after school sports.

"We take care of everything," Jeff beamed. "From forming teams, to organizing the coaches to buying uniforms to feeding them. We want them to feel special like VIPS."

Special is what it feels like seeing the preparations come together for the festivities of the big "pick up" day. About Kidz wants everyone to remember the day as being extra special.

This years recipients can look forward to personalized backpacks, supplies and clothing for each child registered (siblings included) and fun-filled festivities including 15 bounce houses, train rides, Texas Roundhouse BBQ, and 15 Great Clips hair stylists on hand all put together by over 150 volunteers who love to serve.

"It's our hope that they come to enjoy the day and remember how they feel," Jeff shared. "We want them to have a very special experience."





Emmeline Elizabeth Rice passed away peacefully in Fair Oaks, CA on July 23, 2019. Emmeline was born in Loyalton, CA on November 13, 1924.

As a young girl on the farm owned by her aunt and uncle she cooked for the farm crews, cleaned, and provided child care. As a young adult she worked at a small café in Rogue River, OR as a cook. In 1941, she married John E. Rice in Reno, NV. Emmeline and John moved to Sacramento in 1952 where she went to work for McClellan Air Force Base in the instrument department. Emmeline earned her high school equivalent degree and later advanced to a clerical position where she worked until 1980. During their retirement years Emmeline and her husband John were emergency foster parents. Many of the parents would come back and bring their children to visit them.

All those who knew "Bea," a result of her childhood nickname "Beetles." knew that she loved and cherished the Lord and the church, her family, friends, children and animals. Over the years she had many cats and dogs and loved them all. She also fed the birds and put food out for stray cats or dogs and in one case for a pair of mallard ducks that arrived each spring. Sometimes she even caught sight of a raccoon couple who soon brought their young to feed on the offerings. There was also a skunk or opossum dropping by occasionally to check things out and have a bite of food too! All were welcome! When Gramma wasn't caring for children or animals, she could be found square dancing with John or attending Grace Baptist Church, where she was a member for 44 years.

Emmeline was preceded in death by her husband, John E. Rice who passed away July 6, 2008. She is survived by her two sons John E. Rice and Darrol L. Rice, and daughter in



laws Sheila and Katie, her eight grandchildren, sixteen great grandchildren, and twelve great great grandchildren. As Bea became a grandmother, she was most often known as "Gramma" or "Gramma Rice." Her memory will be cherished by all those whose lives she touched.

If you receive this type of call you are urged to HANG UP immediately. DO NOT press the number or button requested to learn more information. Do not engage a caller as your voice may be recorded.

SCHOOL YEAR 2019-2020 FREE AND REDUCED-PRICE MEALS

The San Juan Unified School District's Nutrition Services Department is announcing its policy for providing free and reduced-price meals for children served under the National School Lunch Program and/or School Breakfast Program. Each school and/or the district's central office/Nutrition Services has a copy of the policy, which may be reviewed by any interested party on request.

Meal applications will be available to all households that do not receive a direct certification notification. To apply, complete one application for all children in the household and submit to the school cafeteria or Nutrition Services for processing. Copies are available in the school office, cafeteria or you may apply online at https://mealapps.sanjuan. edu. Households may submit an application at any time during the school year. Information provided on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and may be verified at any time during the school year by the San Juan Nutrition Services Department. Information for parents or guardians of the availability of free and reduced-price meals is available in the San Juan Unified School District Family Handbook as well as the San Juan Unified School District Public Website, Nutrition Services page.

Children are eligible for free or reduced-price meals if their house-

Monthly = 12 pays/per year

hold income is less than or equal to the Income Eligibility Guidelines identified below, which will be used to determine eligibility for meal benefits. These guidelines are effective July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020.

San Juan Unified School District Nutrition Services will notify the household of their children's eligibility for free meals if any household member receives CalFresh, California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (Cal-WORKs) or Food Distribution Program Indian Reservations (FDPIR) benefits. Households will also be notified of any child's eligibility for free meals if the individual child is categorized as foster, homeless, migrant, runaway, enrolled in an eligible Head Start, or enrolled in an eligible pre-kindergarten class. An Application is not required if a household receives the eligibility notice from the San Juan Nutrition Services Department. Households should contact the Nutrition Services Department at 916-971-7035 immediately regarding any child in the household not included on the eligibility notice. The household must notify the San Juan Nutrition Services Department if they choose to decline meal benefits.

Households that did not receive the eligibility notice from the San Juan Nutrition Services Department and would like to apply for meal benefits must submit a complete free and reduced-price application for Nutrition Services to determine a child's eligibility.

Households receiving CalFresh, CalWORKs or FDPIR benefits must include the following on their meal application:

1.Names of all enrolled children
2.One case number from any household member

3. Signature of an adult household member

Households with foster, homeless, migrant, or runaway children must include:

1.Names of all enrolled children 2.Indication of individual child's categorical eligibility status 3.Signature of an adult household member

Foster children are eligible for free meals and may be included as a household member of a foster family if the foster family chooses to also apply for the non-foster children. Including foster children as a household member may help the non-foster children in the household qualify for free or reduced-price meal benefits. If the foster family is not eligible for meal benefits, this does not prevent foster children from receiving free meal benefits.

Children in households participating in Women, Infants and Children (WIC) may be eligible for free or reduced-price meals. Contact the San Juan Nutrition Services Department for further information or complete an application for processing.

Under the provisions of SJUSD Nutrition Services Free and Reduced-Price Meal Policy Statement, the designated determining official(s) will review meal Applications and determine eligibility. Parents or guardians dissatisfied with the eligibility determination may discuss the decision with the determining official on an informal basis. Parents or guardians may also make a formal request for an appeal hearing of the decision and may do so orally or in writing with Sneh Nair of the San Juan Unified School District Nutrition Services. Contact the hearing official at (916) 971-7026 for information regarding the hearing procedures.

If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size changes, the family should complete a new meal application. Such changes may make the household eligible for free or reduced-price meals if the household income falls at or below the levels shown above.

For up to 30 operating days into the new school year, eligibility from the previous school year will continue within the same school/agency. When the carry-over period ends, unless the household is notified that their children are directly certified or the household submits an application that is approved, the children must pay full price for school meals and the school will not send a reminder or a notice of expired eligibility.






WORLD CLASS MMA OV GIRLS DOMINATE IN COM-PETITION!



TO BAN OR NOT TO BAN?

SHOULD SACRAMENTO COUNTY BAN FLAVORED TOBACCO?

Earlier this year, in an attempt to curb teen smoking, the City of Sacramento voted to ban the sale of flavored tobacco products (including flavored e-cigarette cartridges), and soon the County of Sacramento will be facing a decision on whether or not to follow suit. Since this is a controversial issue that would directly impact Orangevale, I wanted to take the opportunity to explain to you my initial concerns with such a ban.

I want to say at the beginning that I am completely in agreement with the proponents of flavored tobacco bans in the goal of reducing teen smoking. We should be doing everything we can do keep teens from smoking, and educating them so that when they turn 21 they fully know the dangers associated with smoking. I recognize that teens are illegally obtaining and using flavored tobacco products in greater volume, and in many cases transitioning to traditional cigarettes.

But Sacramento County doesn't have a wall built around it, and anyone who wants to buy flavored tobacco products can easily obtain them from other nearby areas that have not banned them. Here in Orangevale. you won't have to travel far until you reach Citrus Heights, Folsom, or Placer County, which defeats much of the purpose. A statewide ban could be far more effective for an area like Sacramento, but even then, the widespread proliferation of marijuana prior to its legalization in California proves that even national bans can be largely ineffective.

The ban also doesn't come free. When the City of Sacramento enacted their ban, they expected that they would lose a couple million in yearly tax revenue as a result. And in the week following the city's decision, one of Sacramento's oldest tobacco shops had already announced they would be closing their doors due to the expected impact to their sales. While this may be manageable for the city, Sacramento County is struggling financially. This past budget we were forced to make reductions in services due to budgetary struggles (primarily brought on by a few large lawsuits against the County), and next year we will likely be doing the same.

I have also heard from many adults who legally use flavored tobacco products both because they recreationally enjoy it, and because they use it as an alternative to smoking. While these adults will still be able to access them in other communities, it will make it more difficult for them to access something that is legal to use.

Instead of a ban, we could instead solve this problem by increasing the penalty for selling tobacco products to a minor from the current maximum of \$7,500, to a new minimum of \$7,500, accompanied by a ramped up undercover shopper program. This increase in penalties could potentially fully offset the cost of an improved undercover shopper program, but at the very least be substantially less than the loss in revenue we will now be facing under the ban.

Leading up to my vote on this issue, I will be meeting with stakeholders on both sides of the issue to understand their perspectives in more detail. But more than anything, I want to hear what you have to say. Please e-mail me your thoughts at Supervisor-Frost@saccounty.net. Thank you for reading!







Are you looking for a healthy meal that the whole family will enjoy? Well, I was listening to the radio a few weeks ago and this person mentioned that her favorite recipe for the summer was an Indonesian dish called Gado Gado. I went on the internet and searched for the recipe that I thought sounded the best. I really liked the Minimalist Baker's Recipe, so I started with that. The best part of this recipe is that the vegetables can include any favorites or in season. This is just a base to what you can do. Also, I was thinking, if you want to add meat to it, you could add some left over chicken or steak or even grill some shrimp! Without the meat, it is a vegan recipe! GADO GADO

Crispy Tofu (recipe follows) 34 cup quinoa -rinsed and drained

1 ½ cup water

1 ½ cup green beans-trimmed medium bell pepper-sliced

1 cup bean sprouts or micro greens

1 cup cabbage- thinly sliced or shredded

1 cucumber -sliced

3 whole carrots-cut into 4 inch thin strips

Any other favorite vegetable

SPICY PEANUT SAUCE -½ cup creamy peanut butter

2 Tbsp soy sauce

1 Tbsp maple syrup

4 Tbsp lime juice

2 tsp chili garlic sauce

2-5 Tbsp water to thin- add

Lime wedges and cilantro for serving

First prepare the tofu, then start on rest of recipe.

Crispy Tofu

16 ounces firm tofu 1 pinch sea salt

Dash of sov sauce

1 Tbsp oil (grapeseed or coconut is best)

Preheat oven to 375 degrees and wrap the tofu in paper towel to absorb the excess water. Put something on top that is heavy to help get the water out. Do this for 5 minutes. Then unwrap and cut the tofu into small squares. Put the tofu into a bowl and add salt and soy sauce and mix gently. Preheat a pan with the oil. Make sure it is hot before adding the tofu so it will brown on all side. Saute gently. Once mostly browned on all sides, add to a pan lined with parchment paper and bake for 15 minutes. After 15 minutes, turn off oven and leave in the oven until the rest of the

While the tofu is cooking:

meal is ready.

1. Heat a small saucepan over medium heat and add the rinsed, drained quinoa and cook for 4 minutes until water is absorbed and quinoa develops a nutty flavor, then add the water. Let it come to a low boil and then cover and turn down to simmer and cook for 18-20 minutes or until all liquid is absorbed. Fluff with a fork and remove cover and set aside.

2. While the quinoa is cooking, steam the green beans until just tender.

3. Make the peanut sauce by whisking all ingredients except the water. Add water to thin so it is pourable. Adjust the seasonings to your taste.

4. To serve, set all veggies and tofu out on a large serving tray. Serve each person a bed of quinoa and they add the items they want over the quinoa. Then top with peanut sauce, lime and cilantro. 5. This serves approximately 4 people. Left-overs keep well. Separate the veggies

from the quinoa and tofu.

employers attracted people to the area. Many of the homes and businesses in our town were built in this time, and Orangevale was thriving. Fast forward 40 years, and there are several other communities surrounding us that have advanced more quickly and are now vibrant like Orangevale once was.

There is a natural cycle for communities to grow, then decline, and ultimately change and grow again. I believe Orangevale is positioned for another season of healthy growth. And growth doesn't necessary mean in size. We can grow in quality by having more new local businesses set up shop, residents who are engaged in community events, a thriving Chamber of Commerce, and an overall positive sentiment about our town.

With that, I want to encourage our community to be open to change and be supportive when developers want to make large-scale investments into our

business district. As it stands, driving down Greenback Lane leaves much to be desired as there are numerous vacancies, and several properties that are very run down. This is a result of lack of investment and attention. We need to make our commercial district a more desirable place to own property and do business.

Having new investors and developers show an interest in our commercial district is a good thing. And it is likely to be a catalyst for other improvements and investments in the area along Greenback Lane.

Whether or not a gas station is the best use of that corner is certainly a good conversation. There is certainly a long list of pros and cons. However, that property was for sale for some time without any other development proposals. The proposed gas station is a nice, new, fresh design that will indeed look better than an old, vacant building. And with the millions of dollars being invested into that corner and into Orangevale's business district, we should expect to see additional attention and investment into the area.

While this has been a big conversation in our town, I hope that we can look at the big picture here and see that investment into Orangevale is positive & promising. Growth and change is a good thing. Ultimately, we all share the desire of a healthy, thriving community. None of us enjoy vacant, run-down commercial buildings that become transient hotbeds. So let's embrace what is here in front of us, and hope that it will lead to additional developments & improvements for our town.
