One of the things I appreciate most about our community are the amazing individuals, nonprofits, and small businesses that make it great. It is their contributions that make me proud to represent the Sixth Assembly District. Every year I try to highlight a handful of these individuals and organizations that have had a significant impact on the lives of our residents here. Here is our list of honorees for 2019:

#### WOMAN OF THE YEAR -KRIS WYATT

Kris Wyatt is a resident of Lincoln and a member of the Western Placer Unified School District School Board. She has been involved in a number of community organizations for many years and has dedicated her career to improving



the lives of students and families in the community. When Paradise was ravaged by wildfire last year, Kris worked quickly to coordinate the Lincoln Community Thanksgiving Dinner for victims and first responders of the Camp Fire. She rallied the city together to provide 150 turkeys along with enough side dishes and desserts to serve over 300 evacuees who lost everything in the fire.

SMALL BUSINESS OF THE YEAR MANDARIN HILL ORCHARDS In 1947 Frank and Bernice Aguilar started their 50-acre farming operation in Penryn, California. At that time, Placer County was known as the Fruit Basket of the Nation, and the farm consisted of plum, pear, and peach trees along with a few mandarin trees that had been planted back in the 1880s by Welsh settlers. Today Mandarin Hill Orchards is run by their son, Tom Aguilar, who continues the over 100-year tradition of growing and selling fruit in Placer County.

### FOOTHILLS K9 ASSOCIATION

Since 2005 the Foothills K9 Association has worked to support the training, safety, and health of law enforcement K9s that help keep our community safe. Over the past five years they have paid out over \$54,000 for K9 veterinary care and provided funding for items that are not otherwise available due to departmental budget constraints. The Foothills K9 Association also raises money for the purchase of new K9 partners for law enforcement officers in Placer, Sacramento, and surrounding counties.

#### VETERAN OF THE YEAR MARCUS HANEY

Marcus Haney received the Purple Heart after being injured in Afghanistan during his service in the United States Marines. Today he runs Haney Enterprises, Inc. and is working with several partners to launch a platform in the Sacramento region that will engage



Halloween season starts for Costume Junction

Dawn Cornsilk, owner of Costume Junction, a family-owned, family-operated business at 8215-B Auburn Blvd. in Citrus Heights is gearing up for what should be a very busy Halloween costume season. New fall hours began this week.

"We're going through our racks and placing many of our adult costumes and garments up for sale," she said. "These would be pieces that we might not be renting on a regular basis, and it helps make room for much more inventory."

Costume reservations have been coming in steadily since early August, she said. "This year we've also made many of our children's costumes available for sale," she said. Freeing up floor space will help make Costume Junction shift from largely rental to retail sale.

Cornsilk said by freeing up floor space, she hopes to bring in more costumes and accessories, like wigs and hats, that will be available for purchase.

"Considering I started out of my home just over eight years ago, our business has been a huge success," she said. "Most of the profit I've made has gone back into the business to build the collection."

The store's diverse collection includes costumes for all occasions, typically of higher theatrical quality. On occasion, she still takes in high-quality vintage and/or historic apparel for purchase or store credit.

"If you choose to purchase a costume online, odds are high that it might not fit, or it might not arrive on time," she said. "At Costume Junction you can rent a complete costume you've put together yourself that is custom-fitted for a specific look."

"Do I have a catalog? No, it's in my head," Cornsilk said. Whether it's the tackiest leisure suit or the craziest shirt you can think of, or the right pair of shoes, odds are you'll find it at Costume Junction. Need a set of authentic winter U.S. Navy dress blues? You'll find one.

Cornsilk opened her store in October 2015 and is delighted to look back on a journey that began with a homebased hobby business.

"Our store is perfect for serving residents throughout Placer and Sacramento counties. We're very well-known to customers in Citrus Heights, Fair Oaks, Carmichael and Orangevale," she

Costumes are also available for rental for all occasions including holidays, theme parties and birthday parties. "We have thousands of garments and accessories, and we can mix and match pieces specific to your character and size," she said. Cornsilk said there are almost no duplicate items in her store's overall inventory.

"If people call in with something in mind, I will ask their size, and sometimes offer to send them some photos. I also make available samples of many of our costumes on our website." she said.

Rental rates start at \$15 for a child's school theme costume up to \$50 for an adult. Pricing varies per what each clothing items customer may need. If a customer is looking for an ensemble to dress up for a murder-mystery themed party and calls in advance, she will pull together several different choices for them to consider and choose from, she said.

Costume Junction also offers affordable quality rentals for single day events or multi-day occasions. Inventory includes handmade, one of a kind, and vintage pieces. If you need a costume for a school event, theater production, theme party or special event, you'll find it at Costume Junction.

Cornsilk said her Citrus Heights store is nearly at capacity and in looking to the future, is hoping to expand to a larger location. "We're almost out of room here."

As the school year begins, Cornsilk reminds local parents that Costume Junction continues to serve schoolage students who participate in historical programs each school year.

Before opening Costume Junction, Cornsilk was considered a "go to" costumer for school programs in the Placer County area. She's outfitted thousands of area students participating in history-themed programs at the Bernhard Museum, Sutter's Fort, a Walk-Through California, a Walk Through the American Revolution, as well as students dressing up for famous person reports. Adult customers routinely shop Costume Junction for Renaissance-themed apparel, she said.

Cornsilk said she has always had a love of sewing costumes. She grew up watching her mother and grandmother sew and she always made her children's Halloween costumes. When her daughter was in third grade, she helped with a student field trip to Bernhard Museum in Auburn. The Living History program allows children to dress up in 1889 attire and participate in activities reminiscent of that time period.

When her daughter was in fifth grade, she started making colonial style dresses for the "Walk Through the American Revolution" program. After sewing many costumes, Cornsilk had a nice inventory built up and she started offering the rentals to neighboring schools. Those colorful colonial-style dresses remain a cornerstone of her store inventory today. Fall hours are Monday through Friday from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m., and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. No appointment is necessary, but advance fitting reservations are encouraged. ### ANNOUNCING THE CLO-SURE OF ADOPTABLE GOODS BY YEAR'S END

Since 1977, the Adoptable Goods SPCA Thrift Store has played an integral role in furthering the Sacramento SPCA's mission to help animals and people in our community, contributing more than \$3.2 million towards shelter programs, building improvements and most importantly, the building and remodeling of the Sacramento SPCA's Spay/Neuter Clinic, which performs more than 18,000 life-changing surgeries every year.

Unfortunately, the sharp decline in the overall retail environment coupled with rising operating costs and an aging building has made it increasingly challenging to operate a profitable store. Because of this, I am letting you know of our plans to commence a wind-down of Adoptable Goods operations, including the closure of the store at 1517 E Street by year's end.

I am so grateful to the volunteers of the Sacramento SPCA Women's Guild, who many years ago recognized an opportunity to collect and sell gently-used goods donated by the community to help animals in need. Their original vision has succeeded beyond anyone's wildest dreams and the Sacramento SPCA will continue to honor that gift by using the funds from the sale of the property to fund programs and initiatives to help more animals.

I recognize that Adoptable Goods has provided a meaningful channel for you and other members of our community to support the Sacramento SPCA. We will continue to explore other opportunities for our caring supporters to donate their treasured goods to benefit the animals. In addition to our annual book sale — also started by the Women's Guild — we will look at holding other annual events such as another online auction like the recent one hosted by Witherell's, where 62 donated

collectibles raised more than \$10,000 for the animals.

Adoptable Goods will remain open for the rest of the year; however, we will no longer be accepting donations of goods. We have more than enough items given by the community to keep the store stocked through the coming months.

Of course, we will continue to accept book donations and items needed at the shelter. For a complete list of ongoing shelter needs and other ways to give, visit sspca.org/giving. These items should be brought to our facility at 6201 Florin Perkins Rd., not to the thrift store.




