Celebrate "National Cinnamon Roll Day" at Orangevale's The Paisley Café

Ditch your diet and pause to observe National Cinnamon Roll Day Friday, October 4th at Orangevale's Paisley Café on 9372 Madison Avenue #1 where trays of its of its homemade, oversized and blissfully decadent rolls, each lovingly made from premium Korintje cinnamon and rich creamery butter will be devoured either in house or taken home.

Orangevale's newest dining tradition, open for breakfast and lunch, will be in for one of its busiest working days an hour earlier at 7:30 a.m. to satisfy likely customer demand. Advance orders are welcome and gluten-free cinnamon rolls are available.

"It's our first observance of the national celebration," said chef Ozzie Chavez who opened the café and bakery last winter. Give credit to the Swedes for originating National Cinnamon Roll Day 19 years ago for celebrating the sweet treat.



"We're expecting to make between 100 to 200 cinnamon rolls," she said. The signature treat is offered in boys' or girls' versions (with or without nuts) for \$4.25 each.

Chavez was born in Israel of Jewish parents, raised in England by her grandmother (a chef), is

married to a Mexican-American and has lived on both U.S. coasts. The Paisley Café is strictly a family affair, with many of Chavez's nine of her children working by her side at the café. Bakery treats include a variety of jumbo-sized, high-domed muffins for \$2.95. A selection of oversized and delicious cookies, also available in vegan and gluten-free options are featured in its front bakery display case.

Vegan and gluten-free muffin options are also available for \$2.95. A thick-cut slice of their moist, delectable coffee cake is \$3.95. Ask for the frittata of the day, a savory quiche without the crust for \$4.95.

If you're feeling properly British and wish to have a pot of flavorful hot tea served in colorful knitted tea cozy, enjoy a homemade scone for \$3.50 which is served with a generous dollop of Paisley Café's house-made preserves.

The Paisley Café is a warm and inviting café which makes you feel welcome and at home. All breads are made in-house and there are plenty of daily specials from which to choose. A new fall menu starts on October 1st. Homemade honey, jams and jellies are available for sale in their barista corner in the back of the café.

My guest and I stopped by the Paisley Café for breakfast for the very first time recently. My guest enjoyed her Very Veggie omelet (\$12.95) a generous three-egg omelet with mushrooms, spinach, onion, bell pepper medley and Swiss cheese, served with O'Brien potatoes and toast. Simply delicious!

Intrigued by the title, and as a U.S. Navy veteran, I opted for "Big-Arsed Biscuits & Gravy" for \$11.95 which included two large buttery biscuits smothered in country sausage gravy. If you're in a "half-arsed" mood, a smaller portion is available for \$8.25.

Other breakfast choices include corned beef hash (\$13.95), a breakfast burrito (\$11.95), avocado toast (\$8.95), lox and eggs (\$12.95) or a biscuit sandwich including scrambled eggs, cheddar cheese, chives and house made sausage, served with O'Brien potatoes (\$9.50).

If you're in an especially "cheeky" mood, don't miss "The Cheeky Monkey", featuring almond butter, sliced banana, and a drizzle of local honey topped with chia seeds on toast for \$5.95.

You can tell that Chef Ozzie has a playful way with the menu she and her family have created. She was raised by her grandmother in England, who was also a chef. As a little girl, she spent hours in the kitchen with her Nana, learning how to prep, cook and bake. As an adult, Ozzie worked in the food industry, and later, learned to fine tune her skills by attending and earning a degree in the Culinary Arts Program at American River College, in Sacramento.

"We're always trying new ideas in the kitchen," she said. "The business is difficult at times, but very rewarding when I see our customers enjoying what we've created for them."

The café had done a brisk breakfast business that morning as the morning crowd gave way to customers stopping for lunch. Full, but not full enough to order two cinnamon rolls and two muffins to go for later, I look forward to returning to The Paisley Café soon for lunch.

The café's playful use of sandwich titles also piqued my appetite. Why wouldn't you try a sandwich named "Let's Talk Turkey", "Melty, Melty Tuna", or a "Wicked Good Melted Cheddah"?

All lunch sandwiches come with a choice of a cup of soup, side salad, fruit cup or French fries. Bread choices include challah, whole wheat or focaccia bread. The luncheon soup of the day can be paired with a seasonal side salad. The frittata of the day is also served with a seasonal side salad and a classic Cobb salad is also offered. House-made salad dressings include buttermilk ranch, blue cheese, strawberry balsamic vinaigrette, honey mustard and poppy seed.

The Paisley Café serves freshly roasted beans from the familyowned Coffeol Roasting Company of Watsonville, CA. Popular



fresh-brewed coffees and Two Leaves and a Bud Paisley Label Tea are featured. Bottled drinks include artisan soda, sparkling water, juice, or lemonade.





The membership of the Fair Oaks American Legion Auxiliary Unit 383 have recognized senior Bella Vista High School student Kate Schlenker with one of its highest national awards for personal heroism.

Schlenker was one of four young women selected earlier this spring to participate earlier this summer in California Girls' State, a week-long leadership program of the American Legion Auxiliary designed to increase awareness and knowledge of governmental processes while learning about the duties, privileges, rights and responsibilities of citizenship.

"During our interviewing process at Bella Vista High school we had the honor of meeting junior Kate Schlenker. It was apparent to all of us that Kate was special," said Fair Oaks Auxiliary unit president Suzanne Winters.

"She mentioned that in

the fall of 2018 she helped saved her horse trainer's life. While unloading a horse from the trailer the horse double-kicked her trainer, fracturing both her legs," Winters said. The trainer continues to recover.

Schlenker maintained control over the horse and got medical help for her injured trainer. "It was the right thing to do, and I did it," she said modestly.

Her act of valor couldn't go unnoticed by Legion Auxiliary members while she was attending Girls' State. Up on her return, Schlenker learned the Fair Oaks Auxiliary membership had submitted her name for a hero's award from the national veteran's organization.

The medal for valor was presented on August 27th at the Fair Oaks Veterans of Foreign Wars Post off Kruitoff Way in Fair Oaks. Schlenker also received a special certificate of recognition from California State Assembly for her heroic and invaluable public service to the community.





She calls it her State Fair Salsa because she got the recipe from the guy selling the hand cranked salsa maker at the State Fair! She bought 3 and the salesman gave her the recipe! For those who don't have the salsa maker, you can use the food processor, but carefully pulse the ingredients so you do not puree ingredients! The salsa is good on everything...tortilla chips, tacos, eggs.

#### LYNNE'S STATE FAIR SALSA

- 3 cloves garlic, peeled
- 6 sprigs fresh cilantro

- •1/2-1 jalapeño, seeded and roughly chopped
- 1/2 med. onion, roughly chopped
- 1/4 green bell pepper, roughly chopped
- 4-6 plum tomatoes, roughly chopped
- 1/2 lime, juiced
- 1/4-1/2 tsp salt to taste

#### Steps

- 1. Add garlic, cilantro and jalapeño to manual processor. Turn handle to chop into small pieces.
- 2. Occasionally, turn handle in opposite direction a couple times to stir salsa between add ins.
- 3. Next add onion and bell pepper. Turn handle to chop to size desired. About 1/2 inch in size.
- 4. Add 4 chopped tomatoes. Turn handle to chop to size desired. Decide if you want more tomato depending on original size of tomatoes. If it looks too green I add more tomato.
- 5. Add lime juice and salt. Stir and taste. Add more lime juice and salt if desired. 6. If salsa doesn't taste delightful vou need either more

cilantro, lime juice or salt. Maybe all three. Use a tortilla chip and taste until it's fantastic.

You can use a food processor instead of the chopper, but make sure to pulse only!





On a toasty Tuesday afternoon I had the pleasure to sit down and meet an amazing Patriot, Mehrdad Dezyanian, aka "Dezy" of Dezy's Market, located at 8700 Greenback Lane in Orangevale. From the moment I walked in the door, I was greeted with warm and welcoming hospitality, like an old friend coming to visit. Within minutes we were sipping delicious Persian tea, and I quickly learned the proper way to sweeten my tea by using a slow dissolving sugar cube placed strategically under my tongue! Along with that, some tea cookies and an espresso were brought out to help me through my afternoon slump. I knew this was



going to be a fun and interesting interview!

Dezy, a World Class Champion Jiu Jit Su fighter back in the day, immigrated from Iran in 2007 to America, the land of opportunity "for the same reason everyone does". He initially thought he might teach fighting or continue to compete, but the medical clearances proved too costly so he found himself looking for work.



As luck would have it, prior to coming to America, Dezy served as head of security at the Swiss Embassy for the US interest in Tehran. He made many lasting connections, one being a friend who found Dezy looking for work and asked him if he was interested in joining the Army. Without hesitation, Dezy said "ves"! He took the placement exams, aced them, and before he knew it, was enlisted in the US Army. Within five months, his life was forever changed as he became a full-fledged American citizen.

Dezy was deployed to Germany as part of an Army unit ready to spring into action anywhere in the world within five hours. One day, Dezy's Colonel contacted another Colonel from the Department of Defense. His strong work ethic, loyalty and his ability to speak five languages poised him perfectly for a job with the Department. He took the job and became a trainer of the immersion program teaching language and culture. He also served as an Education Specialist for the Department of Veteran Affairs. During that time Dezy earned both his bachelor's and master's degree in public administration and has his

eyes set on earning his PhD in the future. His career is marked with many honorable recognitions.


Dezy fondly recalled how his Colonel recommended him to another.

In 2016, Dezv's PTSD forced a career change for him.

"I was sleeping like 3 hours a day," he said. "I knew I had to make a change. Within a week, I made a business plan and here I am. The system here is designed so you can't lose if you try hard."

So far so good. Dezy's Market, which sells imported goods from Turkev is known mostly for its unique "Sangak" flatbread, baked daily and is the only one of its kind in Northern California. It's made with the best ingredients and is hard to stop nibbling on once you start!

For only \$3.50 a loaf, everyone should give it a try. And to make it even better, ask for the Greek yogurt dip to go with it! Along with the food side of the business, Dezy is also importing and selling Turkish furniture, high end Persian rugs and custom cabinets for builders! Go figure!

"The main thing I'd like people to know about is my bread," Dezy said. "I think everyone should try it. They won't stop eating it," he promised. And he's right!

Dezy's Market is open Tuesday -Friday, 11 am - 8 pm, Saturday 10 am - 8 pm, & Sunday 9 am - 7 pm. They are closed on Monday.


