Model train enthusiasts shouldn't miss the 43rd annual International Railfair on Saturday, November 9 and Sunday, Nov. 10 at The Grounds, at Placer County Fairgrounds at 800 All America City Boulevard in Roseville.

Open to the public, the West's premier model railroad show will be held between 10 am and 5 p.m. on Saturday and 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Sunday, and features American and European operating layouts, hobby clinics, vendors and a Trainmart consignment store for hobbyists who may want to sell items in their personal railroad inventory.

VETERANS DAY

The eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month 1918 - an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities, was declared between the Allied nations and Germany in the First World War. Since no one knew that there would be a sequel in 20 years, it was known as "the Great War" or the war to end all wars but didn't have a number. Commemorated as Armistice Day beginning the following year, November 11th became a legal federal holiday in the United States in 1938. In the aftermath of World War II and the Korean War, Armistice Day became Veterans Day, a holiday dedicated to American veterans. Unlike Memorial Day, it was not intended to just remember those that fell in battle. Instead it was a day to recognize all those men and women that have served over the course of 241 years of this nation's existence. Whether the service was in war time or peace time or in foreign countries or at home, the Veteran would be recognized on this day. The veteran knows not what the situation will be when they sign the bottom line and raise their right hand and



promise to support and defend the constitution. Peace time quickly can become war time.

Every year, Sylvan Cemetery in Citrus Heights honors those that gave that served in the defense of their county. This year the Veterans Day service will be held on Monday, November 11,

2019, at Sylvan Cemetery, 7401 Auburn Blvd., Citrus Heights. The ceremony begins at 10:30 with a march through the historical section of the cemetery, stopping briefly at each flag station to read a prayer and salute the flag. The men marching include the American Legion and American Legion Auxiliary, VFW, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, Sons of the American Revolution, Boys Scout troop 228, Police Officers of the Citrus Heights Police Department and all others that wish to march. This march will last about 30 minutes. The march will conclude at the gazebo were there will be a one hour ceremony. Many of the men marching will be in uniform - past and present - from American Revolution to modern day.

INTERNATIONAL RAIL-FAIR CELEBRATES 43 YEARS OF MODEL RAIL-ROADING

Kids love model railroads. And so do adult kids! Be sure to bring your cameras and plan to spend a day full of fun. an operating sawmill and other action scenes, many with sound.

Don't miss the Sacramento Modular Railroaders double-track HO scale layout which features an operating turntable and steam facilities at one end. Many buildings in the yard and on modules are lighted. In operation, the group regularly



Four model railroad clubs and organizations: Sacramento Modular Railroaders, Roseville Roundhouse Model Railroad Club, European Train Enthusiasts, and the Sierra Division of the National Model Railroad Association put on International Raifair each year.

Explore three buildings at the Placer County Fairgrounds in Roseville which will be filled with operating model railroads of many different scales, and vendors who sell model railroad and railfan products. Explore model train layouts in narrow gauge, Lionel, HO, N, Z, O, S, G and live steam in action.

Three sponsors of International Railfair, the Roseville Roundhouse Model Railroad Club, the European Train Enthusiasts and the Sacramento Modular Railroaders, will be operating their large club model railroads at this year's show.

The Sacramento Valley Garden Railway Club will display their G scale modular garden layout that features runs long trains of 75 cars or more, many which are soundequipped.

Another family favorite is the two children's starter layouts, designed and set up so children attending the show can earn a junior engineer badge as they operate a model train on a finished model railroad on their own. The two layouts are set up in separate buildings on the fairgrounds (Jones Hall and Johnson Hall) and both layouts are HO Scale. Junior Engineer trains will be rolling throughout both Saturday and Sunday.

Hot food and drinks will be available at the snack bars and seating will be available in both Jones and Johnson Hall.

Cash only admission cost is \$10 for adults. Children under 12 years of age are free. Fairgrounds parking at the Placer County Fairgrounds is \$10. A Sunday family admission special for parents and children is \$15. For more information visit: www.internationalrailfair.com



lake and did some bass fishing this month. I was very surprised at the water level as it normally is on a very fast fall this time of year. It can make for a more challenging trip to find bass as they roam more freely with the higher water. Adding to the challenge, the water was really warm, about 73 degrees. Enough of the excuses right, as we all make them. I started in the south trout activity so I focused my fishing there. Two Cormorants showed up and they really had their feed bags on. I watched as they cornered Shad and started gorging them. With each dive of only about 5 seconds they'd surface with a 3" glittering shad in their beak. Dive after dive they showed how extremely efficient they were at fishing. I on the other hand wasn't doing well at catching bass because of their activity and finally moved on to try a deeper water channel in a bend I like. A massive ball of shad showed on my graph and I dropped my spoon right away. I hooked up with a really nice size Spotted Bass and then a Sacramento Pike that bit also. Folsom lake has a lot of shad again this year so the bass are really going to benefit. It will probably be on a 5mph soon and with the coming of rain the A Rig bite will pick up which I really like. Stay tuned it's going to be a fun winter. Have fun and stay safe! Danny Miller



OCTOBER IS FIRE PREVENTION MONTH

OCTOBER IS METRO FIRE'S PREVENTION MONTH

Mather, CA - October is prevention month at Metro Fire and we have several programs to help keep our communities safe. In an effort to combine both Fire Prevention Week (FPW), our Cancer Awareness Program, and wildfire preparedness as the regions enters what is becoming our season with the most critical fire weather, we have several programs aimed at helping those in the Sacramento Region stay safe from all fires and help support our efforts to promote not simply cancer awareness but to support prevention, screening, and treatment programs.

Fire Prevention Week began October 6 and we have embraced the National Fire Protection Associations (NFPA) 2019 campaign that "Not Every Hero Wears a Cape: Plan and Practice Your Escape." Daily topics will be posted on Metro Fire's social media including Facebook (@MetroFireofSacramento), Instagram (@metro_fire_sacramento), and Twitter (@metrofirepio).

While these NFPA FPW messages were designed for a national audience focusing on structure fire readiness, many of the concepts also apply to those living in the wildland urban interface (WUI). With the upcoming Red Flag weather we want those in our communities to also prepare correctly. Most notable, open flames present a fire hazard and should be avoided in both settings and whether escaping a structure fire or wildland fire everyone should have at least two preplanned exit routes and have practiced these with their

families.

As our kickoff, we are requesting our community to visit https://www.nfpa. org/.../Safety.../FPW19EscapePlanningTips.ashx for an evacuation planning checklist.

We are also rolling out a new burn prevention program targeted towards elementary school aged children. Called "Milo and Moxie" this program has been adapted in collaboration with the Arizona Burn Foundation specifically for Metro Fire. Schools and educational facilities who would like to request this program can contact Metro Fire's Community Services Division at (916) 859-4330 or www.metrofire. ca.gov for scheduling information and requests.

In 2014, Metro Fire made Cancer Awareness a priority during the month of October focusing on Breast Cancer. After a few years we expanded our program to include Men's Health in November by adding a "blue" side to our pink wrapped fire engine, and this year are excited to announce a new components to help make our efforts more visible in the community. We added an option for Metro Fire personnel to wear a themed pink and blue patch on our uniforms to support #AllCancersAllPeople, and placed pink and blue District logos on all of our apparatus during October and November to support of all those with cancer who have affected us directly and indirectly.




