

FORCING CONSEQUENCES

By County Supervisor Sue Frost

I voted against the proposed emergency ordinance that would have blocked landlords from legally evicting tenants - and I wanted you to know why.

I voted against the ban on "no fault eviction" because it's a false promise that does nothing to address the core problem and actually might make it worse.

The problem is simple - we don't have enough housing, and scarcity drives up costs and reduces options.

The situation has received a lot of media attention about the emotion involved - and I do not diminish the stress a person who needs to find a new place to live must feel. But the coverage hasn't done an outstanding job of explaining the facts.

What they are terming "no fault eviction" is actually when a property owner doesn't offer a renewal at the end of a tenant's lease. Typically the property owners give tenants two months' notice - and most of the time, the tenant chooses to leave and find a new place to live. But sometimes they refuse to move out, and the owner is forced to evict them.

So why is there so much fervor? Because one apartment complex decided not to renew lessees for a large group of tenants that were on month-to-month leases.

I have great sympathy and compassion for the renters who were impacted by this isolated situation, and I do not condone the actions of this particular apartment owner. After this incident happened, financial assistance was negotiated for the tenants who received termination notices. These tenants will receive \$2,500 in relocation or rent assistance plus the return of their full security deposit from the current owners. In addition, several tenants with Housing Choice Vouchers may be able to stay at the property after its

sale to the new owners.

This proposal, as well as statewide Rent Control that is coming January 1st, both suffer from the same misguided notion that renters will be better off with government controls on rent. Nothing is further from the truth.

Economists across the world, as well as everyone with basic knowledge of economics, understand that this is simply not the case. While price controls do hold down costs in the short-run for current tenants, in the longrun, it decreases rent inventory and affordability and creates blight in the surrounding neighborhood. In short, it increases housing costs, discourages construction of more affordable units, and reduces housing options

Laws like rent control and bans on "no-fault evictions" are barriers to building the housing and apartments we desperately need. They create economic pressure for landlords to convert their properties to different uses entirely.

My supervisorial colleague, who has been so publicly critical of my vote, should review the results of similar policies in areas like San Francisco and Los Angeles. Then he needs to ask himself if he would consider either of those cities affordable.

In 2019 the National Apartment Association conducted a survey of firms that build multifamily housing. The results showed that the Sacramento metropolitan area is one of the hardest places to build multifamily housing in the entire country. Nationally, our region ranked 56 out of 58 for the most barriers to building multifamily housing. Meaning it is more difficult to build apartments in the Sacramento area than the surrounding areas of Honolulu, New York, or San Diego.

This is unacceptable to me - and for anyone who honestly wants to deal with the housing shortage and price inflation. We have to do better. That's why I will hold a series of meetings with county staff, apartment owners, builders, and tenants' rights groups. Together, we will find out what can actually be done to solve the problem and reduce barriers preventing us from building new multifamily and affordable housing in our County.

I want real solutions, like offering tax incentives to property owners who keep rent low and build new units. Or allowing housing projects to get the same incentives and environmental exemptions sports facilities get.

I do not have all the answers; however, it is clear to me that we cannot continue to pass halfbaked policies that feel good but in reality, make the situation significantly worse.



Every year my mother-in-law would make dozens of cinnamon rolls for the family. My sister-inlaw took up the duty for several years, but now it is up to each of us to make our own. I am sharing the recipe so that you can start the tradition in your family. One batch is enough for a regular size family. Read through the recipe and plan for the time. It takes a bit of time to complete, but the results are amazingly delicious! Hopefully, this will be a new tradition in your family! EDNA'S CINNAMON ROLLS

2- 9 x 12 or 9 x 13 pans- makes 24 cinnamon rolls total

- 2 Packages yeast- if using bulk, then 1 pkg=2 ¼ tsp yeast (for a total of 4 ½ tsp yeast)
- ½ cup water (110 degrees)
- 1 ½ cup milk, lukewarm
- ½ cup shortening
- ¾ cup granulated sugar
- 2 tsp salt

2 eggs, well beaten 5-7 cups sifted flour

½ cup flour to work with, if kneading by hand

Make the Dough first. When it has almost doubled in size, then get the pans and filling ready.

Filling: ½ cube softened butter, ½ cup granulated sugar and 2 tsp cinnamon- you will divide butter and sugar mixture in half for each

In bottom of pans: 1/2 cube softened butter, ½ cup brown sugar, a few tbsp granulated sugar and 2 tsp cinnamon (may need to add more sugar mixture to make sure pans are covered)- this is divided in half for each pan.

Note: If you feel the need to add more butter, then do so sparingly. It doesn't make them better, but you might need more to cover the pan or spread on the dough.

DOUGH:

- 1. Combine yeast with water. In mixer or another bowl, combine milk, shortening, sugar, and salt
- 2. Add yeast and eggs
- 3. Stir in 2 cups flour, then add enough flour until easy to handle. Turn out onto lightly floured board or use mixer to knead.

If using mixer, knead until dough sticks to dough hook

- 4. Place in greased (oiled) bowl, turn dough over so all gets oiled
- 5. Cover with a towel and let rise until doubled- about 1 ½ to 2 hours. It is done when impression in dough remains.
- 6. Punch dough down and divide in
- 7. Roll each half into a rectangle 15 x 9 inches
- 8. Spread softened butter over each rectangle, then sprinkle all over with cinnamon sugar
- 9. Roll starting with narrow edge, seal end by pinching along length of roll.
- 10. Cut into 12 slices. I usually cut in half and then half each half and
- 11. Spread softened butter in pans and sprinkle with brown sugar mixture -be sure all is covered
- 12. Cover and let rise until doubledabout 30 minutes
- 13. Bake in a 375 degree oven for 25 to 30 minutes.
- 14. Immediately turn over onto foil so that all the sugar and butter that was on the bottom is now at the top. Let cool. Then wrap in foil and freeze or eat. Enjoy!



Usually the lights come down with the old year's calendar. These, however, were a gentle admonition to keep the celebration alive in my heart.

Whoever you were with your Christmas lights still aglow, thank you for the blessed reminder that Christmas is not just for December. It's for January, and all year. For far too many, however, Christmas is over (that is, until next year's day after Thanksgiving sales).

Often times our lives are like the Christmas Day in WWI when soldiers who trying to kill each other laid down their arms and sang Christmas carols. The next morning, the carnage began again, with machine guns and bayonet fighting. Everything was back to normal.

One of the reasons I like Christmas so much is that people start acting better. We work together to feed others. We are

more aware of the poor, the lonely and the elderly. We give. Neighbors who have been too busy to talk are now sharing cookies with each other. Families who have been apart are reunited.

Even though December 25th will come and go, the question still before us today is this: Will this last Christmas be a way of life or a temporary lapse in our material mindset? Does the celebration of Jesus' arrival really change anything besides our waistline or retail habits? I'm not trying to be cynical, just asking the question that many of us are afraid to ask. Let me state it a different way. Will the religion you embrace at the Christmas Eve service make a difference on how you behave on New Year's Eve? Tragically, Christmas has become an event, rather than a way of life.

Nietzsche, the atheist, said something we should all ponder, "Show me that you are redeemed, and I will believe in your Redeemer" There are many Nietzsches today who need some persuading that religion is more than an opiate for the masses. Our behavior in August will go far to demonstrate that Christmas is still alive, that God is with us and, that He didn't take a vacation until His Birthday party next year!

Let us hear and take to heart the words of the late Mother Theresa, "It is Christmas every time you let God love others through you...yes, it is Christmas every time you smile at your brother/sister and offer him your hand."

Let us not wait until next year to get together and offer a dinner for the needy or lonely. Don't wait until next December to contribute to the Orangevale Food Bank or give a gift to someone who needs one. Why wait until next year to send a card to an old friend?

We can all take a cue from Charles Dickens, lest we miss the point of the classic Christmas Carol. After he looked at his own neglected tombstone, Ebeneezer Scrooge uttered these profound words, "I will honor Christmas in my heart, and try to keep it all the year." The grave reality of the shortness of this life converted him to live for something bigger than himself. That same revelation could also bring about our salvation.

In closing, Dickens also states, "It was always said of him [Scrooge], that he knew how to keep Christmas well." The unspoken question layered in the subtext is this: How about us? Do we know how to keep Christmas well? The answer to this question will separate the men from the toys.

Will we merely make a Christmas list or can we make Christmas last? Our friends, neighbors, and coworkers will have all year to find out if we do. The seekers of this world still need stars to point the way to Christ. The Cratchit family awaits. Let's not leave them disappointed. Each of us can start today, one person at a time.

And just in case you forgot, Easter is only three months away. Only then do we remember anew why we ever had Christmas in the first place and why we can have a truly happy and hopeful New Year.
