My son Robbie just finished his Eagle scout project this weekend with his Boy Scout troop (Troop 215) and someone suggested I should send you the details to see if you'd be interested in running an article on it. His project has been on facebook a few times and certainly had a lot of people commenting on it. His project consisted of removing an old destroyed car from a streambed in the bottom of a ravine in Snipes Pershing park near Snowberry Way in Orangevale. The car had been there for over 20 years and trees had grown up around it so the Troop had to roll the car over, cut it up and haul it out of the ravine piece by piece to a trailer 100 yards away. After that, the streambed was repaired and remediated in preparation for the rains that are coming in today. The work was done this last Saturday and Sunday; on Monday, the car was brought to a metal recycler.

To do the project, Robbie worked with Environmental Scientists and archaeologists from the Gold Fields district of the California State Parks, fish & game and Army corps of engineers. It took a lot of planning on his part to make sure the project went well. He put flyers on the porches of nearby homes to let residents know what was going on and several of them stopped by to express their appreciation for the work. The project was sponsored by the Friends of Lakes Folsom and Natoma (FOLFAN).

We've hiked these trails for years and Robbie was only 8 when he stated he wanted to remove the car someday because it was ugly and didn't belong in a state park. We have lots of photos showing the car in the streambed, the



work as it was performed, and the car pieces being hauled off. If you're interested, let me know and we can provide more details and photos. If not, no worries.

Enjoy grilled sausage, barbecue chicken, Cajun chicken, smoked brisket, pulled pork, prime rib or O'Connor's signature tri-tip in lunch or dinner-size portions.

"The key is getting good product, taking the right amount of time to season, smoke and barbecue it to perfection," Dougherty said. "Consistency in each dish we serve and a high quality of friendly customer service go together."



Guests can also relax by O'Connor's river rock fireplace or sit at its full bar to watch the latest NFL game or the MLB post-season baseball playoffs on one of their four big-screen televisions. On warmer nights, enjoy your dinner meal in their outdoor seating area.

In addition to their dinner menu, O'Connor's family-style dinners allow guests to build their own feast with a variety of tasty side dishes. Choices of tri-tip, beef brisket, pulled pork, spareribs, whole or half oak

grilled chicken in multiple combinations can feed up to six hungry appetites.

O'Connor's Wood Fire Grill & Bar also continues to grow its catering business. For groups fewer than 25 people, the restaurant offers its family menu. For groups larger than 25, O'Connor's can completely customize a special menu to work for any event.





# rangevale Cooks

A friend served this at a gathering and after not being able to stop eating it, I decided to make it for myself. It was a simple recipe and it came out perfectly (except for the melting of the chocolate). Just remember to heat the white chocolate very slowly.

#### WHITE CHOCOLATE CARAMEL CORN WITH ALMONDS

- •12 cups popped popcorn (from 1/2 cup kernels)
- •1 to 1 1/2 cups chopped almonds
- •1 stick plus 2 tablespoons unsalted butter (I used salted butter and it was
- 1/3 cup light corn syrup
- •1 1/4 cups packed lightbrown sugar
- •1 1/2 teaspoons salt, divided
- 1/4 teaspoon baking soda
- •5 ounces white chocolate. chopped (white chocolate chips work fine, too)
- 1. Preheat oven to 250 degrees. Place popcorn and nuts in a large bowl. Melt butter in a heavy-bottomed saucepan over medium heat. Stir in corn syrup, sugar, and 1/2 teaspoon salt, and cook until sugar dissolves, stirring once or twice. Raise heat to high. and bring to a boil (do not stir). Boil, without stirring, until a candy thermometer registers 248 degrees, 2 to 4 minutes. Remove from heat,

and stir in baking soda.

2..Pour caramel popcorn mixture, stirring to coat thoroughly. Transfer to 2 rimmed baking sheets, spreading in a single layer. (I used parchment paper to line my pans.)

Bake 45 minutes, stirring twice. Test doneness by removing a few pieces of popcorn from oven: if they crisp within 1 minute, popcorn is ready. Remove from oven, and immediately sprinkle with remaining salt (optional). Let cool completely.

3. Place chocolate in a heat proof bowl set over a pan of barely simmering water or a double boiler. Stir until melted and completely smooth. Fill a small resealable plastic bag with chocolate, and snip a tiny hole in 1 corner. Drizzle chocolate over caramel corn. Refrigerate until chocolate is set, about 10 minutes. before breaking up.

Notes:

• White chocolate chips are the most difficult to melt. Too much heat will make this type of chocolate seize (hard and lumpy). If you use a double boiler, make sure the water is simmering and not boiling. If you use the microwave, then just do 30 seconds at a time until mostly melted and then stir until chunks are melted.

·Caramel corn can be stored in an airtight container up to 1 week.

•Trv milk or semi-sweet chocolate instead or with the white chocolate for a more decorative look and a different flavor.


