Sarah-Ann Goller passed away peacefully Thanksgiving Day, November 28, 2019. She grew up in Fair Oaks, CA. She was the most caring person anyone could know. Sarah-Ann was a talented woman who gardened, canned her own food, a fabulous cook, made flower arrangements for her church and wedding cakes. She was an artist/painter and writer. Sarah-Ann had a 'Green Thumb' developing and maintaining beautiful landscaping at her Fair Oaks home. She was a member of the Fair Oaks Historical Society and made many donations over the years from the Vincent Ranch (lovingly referred to as Rancho Confusion) to the Historical Society. She wrote a book, "Up Sunset Avenue" in which she wrote delightful family stories of growing up, farming and ranching in the early days of Fair Oaks. She also participated in family gath-

erings of the Oregon Trail in McMinnville, Oregon. Her ancestral history was rich with ancestors who came on the Mayflower, Scotch-Irish who fought in the Revolutionary War and came across on the Oregon Trail to settle the West.

Sarah-Ann is survived by her husband of 51 years, Allan D Goller of Ohio, her three children, Michelle Ann Hancock, husband Steve, Lauryl Jean Frame, husband Darren, and Marcus Robins McKenny Goller and wife Amy. Sarah has five grandchildren: Kristin Frame Emmitt, Emily Frame, Casey Frame, Spencer Goller and Macy Goller. She is also survived by her sister, Katherine Odom, brother In-law, Gary Odom, niece Erin Odom Singh, her two young sons Fox and Forest, nephews Howard Fox and Barry Lee Morey, as well as brother-in-law Tom Lawrence, nephews John Lawrence, Craig Lawrence and niece Tammy Eastham. She was preceded in death by her mother and father, Wanda Kennedy and Walter Vincent of Fair Oaks, her first husband Captain Michael Robins McKenny, her sister-in-law, Marianne McKenny Lawrence and other early settlers of Fair Oaks: Grandparents, Frank Wilson Vincent and his wife Elizabeth Mary Carpenter, and William Whitney Kennedy and his wife Laura Wanda Hewitt, and her Uncle Earl Vincent who had a fruit ranch in Orangevale. Sarah-Ann will be greatly missed by her family and friends. She had a Christian burial in the Fair Oaks Cemetery on Monday December 9th among many members of the Kennedy, Vincent and McKenny families who came before as early settlers.

**Anita
(Norma Paniagua)
Nelson**

March 6, 1919 – Dec. 29, 2019

Local actress and longtime Folsom resident Anita Nelson died in her sleep on Dec. 29 after a brief illness. She was also known as Norma Paniagua for many years. Anita Nelson was her stage name, which she eventually adopted permanently. She was 100 years old.

She was born Norma Feliciano in San Francisco to Richard Feliciano and his wife, Louisa (née Rivera) Feliciano, both immigrants from Puerto Rico, on March 6, 1919. When her mother divorced and remarried, she took the surname of her stepfather, Carl Emil Witt.

In the 1930s, she married Henry Perez Paniagua, who was employed as a baker. The couple moved to Sacramento and had two children, Thomas and Norman.

In 1947, she and Henry opened Hank's Bike and Hobby Sho, on Franklin Blvd. in South Sacramento. They also built the physical building for the Schwinn bicycle shop with their own hands. During the 1950s, Norma opened her own arts and craft shop in the Oak Park district of Sacramento.

After divorcing Henry in the 1950s, Norma worked as a hair stylist in Sacramento and Fair Oaks. She was briefly married to Jerry Nelson.

Beginning in the 1950s, she performed in regional theater throughout the Sacramento area, San Francisco, and Nevada. Her stage name was name Anita Nelson, which she adopted permanently in later years. She was a regular performer at The Sutter Gaslighter Theater, which was located at The Sutter Club in Folsom's Historic District. She performed there throughout the 1960s and the 1970s. Her regional acting career extended into the 2000s, when she participated in senior theater.

Anita was a Folsom resident for over forty years.

Anita's passion for the performing arts and dance continued throughout her life. She wrote songs that are copyrighted in the Library of Congress. She taught dance lessons and acting skills to young people.


In her 80s, she bought an RV and

traveled throughout the U.S., Canada, and Mexico. She was known to teach dance lessons at RV camps to other adventurous travelers.

Anita is survived by her sons, Tom Paniagua of Folsom, and Norm Paniagua of Camarillo; twelve grandchildren; three great-grandchildren; and one great-great grandchild, and Lynda Slagle who was like her daughter.

A celebration of Life Service is planned for Jan. 25, from 1p.m. to 3 p.m. at Christ Community Church, 5025 Manzanita Ave., Room M1, in Carmichael.



**I Hate These Blurred
Jurisdictional Lines**

From 2017 to 2019, the county’s homeless population grew by a staggering 19%. If we did not have the formal count to tell us the homeless problem was getting worse, many of us could have guessed just based on what we see happening throughout our communities. I know that because I hear about it from every single community in my district. Not just the unincorporated portions but the cities as well. When I hear from constituents about this problem, a lot of them want to know why county and cities are not working together to fix this major issue. It was a good question.

Starting in 2020, Sacramento County will start working with every single city in the county (Citrus Heights, Elk Grove, Folsom, Galt, Isleton, Rancho Cordova, and Sacramento) to start coordinating solutions. The growing home-

less population is not the problem of just one jurisdiction in the county – it is a regional issue that may benefit from a regional approach. The Sacramento Homeless Policy Council will have representatives from the Board of Supervisors, each city within the County, the Sacramento Continuum of Care Chair and the Board Chair of Sacramento Steps Forward.

This Homeless Policy Council will serve as an opportunity for leaders in the region to start having a regional discussion around homelessness. Up to this point, it seems like the only consistent policy among the jurisdictions is that the problem stops at the border. Now, we can work with the cities to make sure that best practices for real solutions are shared and adopted throughout the county. And instead of being surprised about the opening of a shelter or change in policy, county leaders will all be privy to those conversations beforehand.

When this issue first came before me for consideration earlier in the year, I was excited but a bit surprised. I had heard nothing about it until just days before I was supposed to vote on creating it, so I decided to do my “homework” and called the city managers for the suburban cities to get their thoughts. It upset me to learn that some cities still had lingering concerns, and other cities had not even been contacted. It felt to me like a subverted attempt to get the outlying suburban areas to go along with what-

ever downtown Sacramento wanted to do. In response, I worked to slow down the process to ensure that everyone impacted would have a real seat at the table – and am pleased that we are finally there.

Like many of you, I am sure, I wish this council had happened sooner. The problem has been

growing in front of our eyes for years and it is hard to think of a time when sharing good ideas has been a bad idea. My hope is that The Sacramento Homeless Policy Council will address the approach of just moving the problem from one area to another. Finding meaningful solutions to the homeless situation is good for businesses, families, and most importantly, homeless people themselves. The possibilities for helping the people of Sacramento County through this new council are many, and I am excited Sacramento County is a part of it.

PROTECTING THE RIGHT TO EARN A LIVING

Assemblyman Kevin Kiley
Announces
Constitutional Amendment
Protecting the Right to
Earn a Living

SACRAMENTO – Today, Assemblyman Kevin Kiley (R-Rocklin) announced legislation to enshrine the Right to Earn a Living in the California Constitution. This legislation, to be formally introduced in January as an Assembly Constitutional Amendment, will nullify all conflicting laws and regulations, including Assembly Bill 5's restrictions on independent contracting.

"Rarely has a single bill caused so much harm to so many people so quickly," Assemblyman Kiley said of AB 5, which has already prompted massive layoffs of writers, artists, musicians, and photographers, among many others. "But even before Assembly Bill 5, California's laws were more hostile to workers than any state in the nation, with arbitrary restrictions on vocational freedom and working conditions. With this Constitutional Amendment, California workers will finally be treated respectfully by their government."

The Right to Earn a Living will include the right to be independent and pursue contractual employment opportunities, along with the right to practice one's vocation without unreasonable occupational licensing restrictions. According to a 2018 report, California "is the most broadly and

onerously licensed state in the nation" and the "worst licensing environment for workers in lower-income occupations."

The Constitutional Amendment will also enable flexible work arrangements that are currently forbidden or heavily restricted

by California's rigid labor laws.

"The future of work in a rapidly changing economy requires creative thinking and serious solutions," Kiley said. "AB 5 and other anti-worker legislation move us in the wrong direction. Recognizing the Right to Earn a Living will help prepare California for a new era of economic opportunity."

Orangevale Cooks

It's been 1 year since I received an Instant Pot and it's been 1 year that my husband has taken over making most meals with the Instant Pot! He even shares recipes with the other guys at work! It is an amazing kitchen tool in many ways! One of my favorite meals is his beef stroganoff. It makes enough for leftovers and lunch!

BEEF STROGANOFF

2 Tbsp. oil
½ onion, diced
2 tsp. salt, divided
2 lbs. beef stew meat, cut into 1 inch cubes
(We like to cut our own stew meat and so we buy a top sirloin steak)
1 tsp. freshly ground black pepper
3 cloves garlic, minced

½ tsp. dried thyme
2 Tbsp. soy sauce
3 cups chopped mushrooms
2 Tbsp. all-purpose flour
3 cups chicken broth
16 ounces wide egg noodles
(The packages are 12 ounces, so you will need 1 ½ packages.)
¼ cup sour cream, or to taste

1. Turn on a multi-cooker (Instant Pot) and select sauté function. Heat oil for 1 minute. Add onion and ½ tsp. salt; cook and stir until onion begins to soften, 3-4 minutes.

2. Season beef with 1 tsp. salt and pepper. Add to the pot. Cook and stir until browned evenly on all sides, about 2 minutes. Add garlic and thyme; cook until fragrant, about 30 seconds. Pour in soy sauce.

3. Stir mushrooms in to the pot. Stir in flour until evenly incorporated. Pour in chicken broth and remaining ½ tsp. salt. Close and lock the lid. Set timer for 10 minutes. Set to high pressure according to manufacturer's instructions, 10-15 minutes.

4. Release pressure carefully using the quick-release method. Open pressure cooker; add egg noodles. Seal and bring to

high pressure again, about 5 minutes.

5. Release pressure again naturally according to manufacturer's instruction for 5 minutes. Release remaining pressure using the quick-release method. Open pressure cooker; stir in sour cream.



•**MORE SMALL FARMS.** Attract in new small farm businesses and leverage our large residential parcels for new small farm initiatives.

On the horizon for 2020 are several exciting developments and key advancements for Orangevale. The Orangevale Parks District has spent many years working through a community-based master planning process to paint a picture of the future of Orangevale parks. In 2019, they also acquired a brand new property just north of the community center now providing the opportunity to revise a community center master plan utilizing this new space. Kicking off in 2020 will be two key efforts - one to organize input from the community on a revised master plan for this site, and most importantly, an effort to put a bond measure on the 2020 ballot to raise funds to implement what has been master planned over the past many years. This bond would raise \$15-20MM by way of a modest property tax increase affecting each Orangevale home owner by estimated \$50-100 per year. Some of the key improvements will likely include a new skate park, BMX pump track, expansion of event space, a proposed senior center, a new youth center, and a facility/restroom improvements at every park in Orangevale. The next step will be a few meetings in early 2020 to gather community input on how these new funds would

be best utilized to improve our parks and invest in the future of Orangevale.

Several key commercial properties along Greenback Lane are in the process of being redeveloped or sold to local investors with the intention of cleaning them up. Along with the planned 7-11 development at Greenback & Main, Orangevale's main commercial corridor will undoubtedly look & function better in a year than it does today. SACOG and County have provided a small grant to hire an outside consultant for the purposes of bringing together commercial owners to develop a fresh vision for our Greenback corridor. We have a long road ahead, but these are key building blocks on which we can build a better platform for business in Orangevale.

The Chamber's role in the community is to be a Catalyst for business growth, a Convener of leaders & influencers to get things, and a Champion for a thriving community. In 2020, we will continue doing what has been working well and add a few new things to the mix that building around our Grow Orangevale initiative. By 2021, we hope to see more new residents engaged in civic activities, Chamber membership growing to at least 175, member's businesses growing & healthy, new investments into commercial properties, commercial vacancies being filled, and a general sense of unity, optimism and pride among the community in Orangevale.
