## SACRAMENTO PUBLIC LIBRARY SET TO EXPAND ORANGEVALE LOCATION



Sacramento, Calif. (Jan. 27, 2020) — An expansion of the Orangevale Library is planned to begin in 2020 as a result of the cumulative efforts by Sacramento Public Library, the County of Sacramento, Sacramento County Board Supervisor Sue Frost’s Office and the Orangevale community. This will be the second expansion of the library which has been located at 8820 Greenback Lane since 2001.

Currently operating with 4,320 square feet, the facility houses a collection of approximately 13,000 items while providing public-access computers, photocopiers, printers, early-learning stations, high-speed gigabit internet access, and other services commensurate with Sacramento Public Library ser-

vice offerings. The expansion will modify the space to 7,920 square feet. Notable additions to the expanded site will include a community room, study rooms, dedicated programming space, and teen and children’s areas.

The Sacramento Public Library Authority is governed by a Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement between the County of Sacramento and the Cities of Citrus Heights, Galt, Isleton, Elk Grove, Rancho Cordova, and Sacramento.

Orangevale Library is part of the 28-library Sacramento Public Library system and has been serving the Orangevale community since 1912.

## MARJORIE ANN GRANT 1931-2020

Marjorie Ann Grant, age 88, passed away January 9, 2020 in Longmont, Colorado. Marjorie was born October 4, 1931, in Orangevale, California to Harley D. Paul and Jon Colter (formerly known as Mary Shackleton). She grew up in rural, agricultural Orangevale, on what was part of the original Shackleton ranch. After graduating from Portola Junior/Senior High School in 1949, she attended San Jose State College, graduating with distinction in 1953 with a B.A. in Commercial Art. She pursued graduate work in Fine Arts at UC Berkeley working towards a master's degree in Fine Arts.

In 1963 Marjorie married Robert L. Kiner. Together they canoed, backpacked and enjoyed pristine country in Alaska and Wyoming. A daughter, Jody Ann Kiner, was born to them in 1972, but she died as an infant. They divorced in 1973. Later, on November 23, 1979, Marjorie married Thomas G. (Tom) Grant, who was a Forest Engineer with the Forest Service in Jackson, Wyoming where they met. After retiring, they moved east to Westfield, to the Green Mountains of Vermont.

Marjorie worked for many years variously as a cartographic or engineering draftsman for federal agencies including Geological Survey, Bureau of Reclamation, Bureau of Land Management, Soil Conservation Service, Federal Aviation Administration and Forest Service. She retired

in 1987 from the Forest Service. She was blessed to have lived and worked in beautiful places such as Oregon, Alaska, Vermont, Wyoming, Montana and Colorado. Marjorie moved to Longmont, Colorado following Tom's death in 2005. She became reacquainted with a former fellow worker from Jackson, Wyoming, Don Fritch, eventually becoming Partners in Life in 2011. Don passed away on July 6, 2018.

The outdoors and all of its inhabitants, as well as books, rocks, music, family and friends, were very important to Marjorie. Her life long love of nature found expression in many conservation and animal welfare organizations such as The Nature Conservancy, Defenders of Wildlife, The Sierra Club and the Humane Society of the US.



## COMMON SENSE NEEDED TO FIX OUR ROADS

**Common Sense Needed to  
Fix Our Roads**

Our roads are crumbling. That is not hyperbole, they are literally crumbling. And we don't have the money or a realistic plan to fix them.

Recent reports show California roads are the 3rd worst in the entire country. NHTSA data notes that Highway 99 is now the 7th most dangerous freeway in America. And a study by national non-profit transportation research group TRIP estimates that 70% of Sacramento County's roads and highways are in poor shape - 41% dangerously so.

The public is well aware of the problem - I hear about it from my constituents almost every day.

We need to get something done.

But instead of focusing on the immediate and urgent problem - fixing our roads - the Sacramento Transportation Authority (STA) is putting together a multi-Billion dollar shopping list of projects in the form of a countywide sales tax increase.

Sacramento County residents drive more than 965,955 cars on 5,200 miles of roads, which comprises about 85% of all travel. Compare that to just 97 buses and 42 miles of Light Rail tracks, which comprises about 1% of all travel. An overwhelming majority of people in Sacramento County use roads to get to

work, take kids to school, shop for food; and go movies, restaurants, and basketball games. Even public transit relies on those roads - buses travel on roads and many RT users drive to stations to board light-rail.

Yet, surprisingly, the \$3 Billion tax increase currently under consideration will devote only 28% to road repairs and 10% for freeway improvements, while dedicating as much as 50% to buses and public transit. Asking voters to raise taxes on themselves to pay for transportation projects that impact the fewest people isn't a recipe for success.

It just doesn't make sense. Worse yet, it could derail any chance of real action to fix our roads.

The majority of voters live outside the City of Sacramento in suburban cities like Folsom, Rancho Cordova, Elk Grove, Gold River, and Citrus Heights; or in unincorporated communities like Arden-Arcade, Fair Oaks and Orangevale. Residents in these communities are the most impacted by the poor condition of our roads, and they would be paying the biggest share of the proposed increase.

They are also the voters needed to pass a tax increase. Four years ago, these same voters opposed Measure B because it included too much spending on transit and trolleys. Yet some STA members have convinced themselves these voters would support a new measure that nearly doubles spending on those projects.

Sacramento residents are currently paying a 1/2 Sales Tax passed in 2004 with the promise to fix our roads. We will continue paying that tax for two more decades. We are also paying billions more at the gas pump as a result of the gas tax increase the Legislature imposed with SB1. Each time, voters were promised that the new revenue would fix our roads and highways. Some projects have been done - but the condition of most of our roads hasn't improved. And some of the money has been siphoned off for other purposes - something that is sure to be on voters' minds.

STA's own polling shows that while the public may be willing to support another tax for road repair and improvement, support from every community (including Sacramento City) falls off when it comes to RT or other projects. Measure B failed in 2016 because proponents cobbled together a wish list from interest groups instead of focusing on the issue voters cared about most. We cannot afford to repeat the same mistake.

I recognize that more revenue is required to make the improvements we need and tackle the volume of repairs we face. I believe voters are willing to pony-up more tax-dollars to get the job done. But clearly they are not willing to pay to fund more under-performing and money-losing public transit. And they are justifiably wary of more broken promises.

Fixing and improving our roads is imperative. It's the most effective way we can reduce daily commutes, cut traffic snarls, and improve safety.

That is why I want STA to consider a stand-alone proposal that focuses primarily on fixing and improving our roads and highways - and include real public oversight to give voters confidence that the money will go where it is supposed to go.

I do not love the idea of raising taxes, but we have to fix our roads - and we have to do it now. I think the current proposal will make that harder, if not impossible.

Let's focus first on fixing our roads. It's the right thing to do. It's also the smart thing to do.

# THE 2020 CENUS IS COMING

The 2020 Census is coming. By law, anyone living in the United States must fill out a Census Questionnaire. For more information, go to [www.2020census.gov](http://www.2020census.gov)

The following information is shared by me, as a private citizen, not a spokesperson for the Census Bureau. Being an Ancestry.com member and family tree maker, I am looking forward to the release by the U.S. Archives of the 1950 Census Data. You may notice I mentioned the U.S. Archives. Once a Census is completed and the data used for its intended purposes; i.e. redistricting, and demographic information, the personal information is transferred to Archives and is held back from public use for 70 YEARS! The personal information my Grandfather gave to the Census Bureau in 1950 has not been seen by anyone since then. I was never able to ask him about this time of his life, where he lived? How he lived? Was he still a farmer or had he moved into town? Personal information about him, his family, his situation in life, and that of his neighbors were entered on those sheets of the Census forms. After a bit of searching ( his last name was incorrectly spelled by the enumerator ) the 1940 Census, I finally found him. Scanning the pages adjacent to the page were he was listed, I saw names of other family members, Aunts and Uncles who lived nearby, as well as the names of in-law families. And the tree continues to grow.

Having worked as a Census Enumerator during the 2000 Census, and finding the work worthwhile, I applied for work with the Bureau of Census again. Over this last Summer, my efforts were to update and correct residential mailing addresses, to ensure that every household receives in the mail, an invitation to respond to the 2020 Census. Currently I am a Recruiting Assistant, helping persons apply for work with the Census Bureau. I was very surprised to learn Sacramento County is seeking thousands of applicants, some 8,500 of them, nationwide over 500,000 will be hired. The goal is to find qualified applicants in every neighborhood in the County, train them as Enumerators to follow up with the Non-responsive households. Applicants can only apply via the internet, at [www.2020census.gov/jobs](http://www.2020census.gov/jobs) Applications are still being accepted. In Sacramento County, Enumerators will be paid \$21 an hour, plus .58 cents reimbursement for mileage. Training is paid as well. The hours are flexible, after work, weekends, are usual times for working. 10 to 40 hours a week. 18 years of age, minimum at the time of application. Males born after Dec 31, 1959 need to be registered with the Selective Service system. A very good part time, temporary job to add some money to your bank account.

April 1st is Census Day for 2020. Historically, Governments have found it necessary to count their people for a variety of reasons. At the formation of the United States, being a Representative Republic, the founders included in the Constitution, Article 1, Section 2, the requirement of conducting a Census of the people. 1790 being the first one, and every 10 years since. This will be our 23rd National Census.

At first, it was just that, a simple counting, Federal Marshals were charged with the task. From house to house, farm to farm, they wrote down the name of the head of household and the marked on a tally sheet the number of members of the household in their respective age brackets, male and female. The purpose of which was to ensure equal representation in the House of Representatives. A simple process then; count the people, divide by the then authorized number of members of the house, find the average, redraw the district lines to reflect an approximate equal number of persons per House District. The basic idea still holds today, however the process by which we count the people and the collect the data over the 230 years has changed with the times.

It was soon realized that other valuable statistical data could be collected while this counting was being done, thus obtaining a snapshot of the United States. In the Mid-1800's Names of not only the head of households, but also that of others in the household, their names,

ages, sex, place of birth, place of parent's birth, education level, literacy, spoken languages, ownership of property, income, occupation, etc were fields on the Census form to be filled in as needed. Additional questions and columns dealing with livestock, production of crops etc, were added over time and the Dept. of Commerce was designated to conduct future Census. The maps and graphs in our textbooks, we studied as schoolchildren were based largely on data obtained by conducting the Decennial Census.

Over the years, as States were added to the Union, the number of authorized Representatives were increased to reflect those changes, which now stand at 435 Representatives. After each Census, State officials use the results to redraw the boundaries of their Congressional and State legislative Districts, adapting to population shifts. As you can imagine, as populations ebb and flow, the Federal Congressional Districts of some States added seats and some States lost seats in Congress. California, since it's admission to the Union has only ever gained seats. For the first time, California may actually lose a seat in Congress.

What is at Stake for California as a result of the 2020 Census? Whether we keep the number of seats in the House of Representatives or lose one or more is important to us obviously, as a voting block, California holds some power in directing policy and in lawmaking. Next is the matter of Federal Funding. Approximately \$675 Billion in Federal Funds were distributed via Federal Spending programs and projects to California in FY 2016, at various State, Local and Community Levels. Some of those funds are static block grant amounts, other programs are funded based on the POPULATION of a State. It is estimated that for every person California fails to count, ( under count ) a loss of \$1000 to \$1500 in those population based funds will result. The list is too long of Federal Programs to include, but can be found online.

In Mid-March, households will begin receiving official Census Bureau

mail with detailed information on how to respond to the 2020 Census. The 2020 Census will be easier than ever to complete, for the first time, the public is being invited to respond to the Census using the internet and their electronic devices! Computer, Tablet, phone or even paper!

You can fill out your Census form prior to April 1st, but the questions are based on Census Day, April 1st. For example, "Where were you living and sleeping on that date?" The goal is to count people once and only once, and in the right place according to where they live on Census day. Keeping this goal in mind, this question is asked to ensure individuals are not included at multiple addresses. A Relationship question is asked. Who is the head of the household, and how are the other people living there related to that person? Relationship data is used in planning and funding government programs that provide funds and services for families, people living or raising children alone, grandparents living with grandchildren or other households that

qualify for additional assistance.

The questions are simple and straightforward, and should only take about 10 to 15 minutes to answer. Asked questions are "Who lives here?" we ask for names to ensure everyone in the house is counted. For each member of the household a series of questions will follow, The sex of each member, age and date of birth. These questions are asked and the answers given are used in planning and funding of government programs, and policies geared toward the demographic make up of a community. i.e. A large population children under 5 might indicate an elementary school might need to be built soon.

Ethnic and Racial questions are asked for demographic uses and to ensure compliance with anti-discrimination provisions at the Federal levels.

Asked also, are you a renter or home owner? You will be asked for a phone number, in case there is a need for a follow up on a question. Your number will not be shared

and you will only be contacted if needed, for a Official Census Bureau business.

What you won't be asked! The Census Bureau will NEVER ask for: Your Social Security Number, for money or donations, bank or credit card numbers, or anything on behalf of a political party.

Over this last Summer, efforts were made by the Census Bureau to update and correct all residential mailing addresses, at least 99% of the Nation is now listed.

For various reasons, some people will not respond online to the Census, by late April 2020, the Census Bureau's database will know the addresses of those non-responders, and beginning in May, Enumerators, ( Census Takers ) will begin calling on those addresses in person to assist the residents in completing the Census. They will only be going to residences that have not responded with a completed Census questionnaire.

**YOUR ANSWERS ARE CONFIDENTIAL** - They are not shared with ANY OTHER FEDERAL OR STATE AGENCY OR DEPARTMENT.

The U.S. Census Bureau is required by law to protect your information ( Title 13, U.S. Code, Section 9) The Census Bureau is not permitted to publicly release your responses in a way that could identify your or your household. We are conducting the 2020 Census under the Authority of Title 13, U.S. Code, Sections 141, 193, and 221. By Law, the Census Bureau can only use your responses to produce statistics.

When filling out your Census form online, you will see a notice that includes the above sentences and a complete explanation of protections and punishments for violations of confidentiality.



In the winter it is nice to have comfort food every now and then, so I thought you would enjoy this recipe for bread pudding. Originally, I would avoid bread pudding because it really didn't sound appetizing, but in the past few years, I have tasted the most wonderful bread puddings. One was at a restaurant and the other was from a teacher. The teacher's recipe was so delicious that I asked for the recipe and received it! I love when people share.

**Yummy Bread Pudding**

3 tablespoons butter, softened  
1 loaf French or Italian bread – the one they sell warm at the check-out is best.

¾ cup raisins, golden are a nice alternative, but use what you have

3 large eggs  
4 cups whole milk  
2 cups sugar  
2 tablespoons vanilla  
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

Spread butter over the bottom of a 13x9 inch baking dish-glass is best. Cut bread into ½- 1 inch slices. Mine were more like 1 inch slices. Arrange slices in tightly spaced rows in the dish. Tuck the raisins between the slices. Whisk the remaining ingredients in a bowl until frothy. Pour the liquid over the bread and let stand for 1 hour, pressing down now and then with a spatula to wet the tops of the slices. Preheat the oven to 375°. Bake the pudding until the top is puffed and lightly browned, about 1 hour. Cover with Hot Brown Sugar Sauce. Let cool on a rack for 30-60 minutes, then cut into squares and serve. (Hint from my husband: serve with whipped cream to make even more delicious.) Store remainder in refrigerator.

**Hot Brown Sugar Sauce**

½ cup (1 stick) butter  
1 cup brown sugar, packed  
1/3 cup water  
¼ teaspoon ground nutmeg  
1/8 teaspoon salt  
1 tablespoon vanilla

Melt butter in a saucepan over low heat. Stir in the sugar, water, nutmeg and salt. Cook, stirring until the sugar is dissolved. Remove from heat and stir in the vanilla.






