



Editor,

You probably did not read the angry diatribe from the editorial board of one of our local papers, so I'll sum it up for you: they are buzzing mad at me because I wouldn't answer their questions in the way they wanted me to answer them.

Some might be angry over such an attack, but honestly, I had to laugh at the angry bleating from an increasingly irrelevant source - and saddened at how far a once-proud publication has fallen. A free and unbiased press is vital to democracy, another angry voice with a political ax to grind is not.

I was, however, touched by the many messages of support I received (along with a few checks!) — and I was impressed by the creative use of colorful, if unprintable, metaphors used to describe the political attack.

I don't spend much time worrying about the opinions of self-proclaimed elites - so instead of wasting time buzzing with empty words or lecturing the public, I will continue to focus on listening to the people I represent and pushing for real, common-sense solutions.

So, I want to talk about solving problems.

Homelessness is one of the biggest problems our community faces, but my research on the issue leads me to believe California is on the wrong track. Right now, we are neither helping get people out of homelessness nor reducing the impact it has on our neighborhoods. We are spending billions of taxpayer dollars on programs that just don't work. We need to demand results, and we need to question the policies that have failed for a decade. Virtually everyone on the front lines tells us that much of the problem is the result of mental illness and drug addiction - yet political activists continue to mischaracterize the problem as nothing more than a housing issue. Make no mistake, we could build a shelter for every homeless person in Sacramento County and the problem would continue to grow.

We do have a Housing crisis - but rent control is not the answer. In fact, rent control will make the problem worse. We have dozens of examples that show us that rent control results in less housing - look no further than San Francisco. We need more housing and more options — you can't regulate the problem away; the answer is to build more housing and more housing options.

Our roads are a mess. I wrote about this last week. Nearly 70 percent of roads need repair, and 40% are in dangerously poor condition. Taxpayers have been crystal clear — they are willing to pay to fix roads and congestion, but not to fund money-losing transportation systems that are used by a very small minority of the population. Instead of focusing on fixing roads and ensuring our current tax dollars are used wisely, politicians are holding road repairs hostage to push another tax increase to pay for pet projects - which will almost certainly doom any ballot measure put before taxpayers. We must repair and improve our roads, demand our fair share of funds, and be realistic about our road maintenance budgets. Only then can we look to expand a public transportation system that better serves students, seniors, and the overall region.

Perhaps no issue has received more ink than public safety. I'll be clear: I support our Sheriff and the Deputies that put their lives on the line every day to keep us safe. Polling shows that most voters do too. Neither I, nor the Sheriff, are opposed to oversight, but neither of us wants to see deputies put in danger and neighborhood safety compromised for petty political purposes.

I will never apologize for standing on principle, nor putting common-sense solutions ahead of fancy speeches or pretty but empty rhetoric. Nor will I ever bow to bullies who try to use intimidation to push their radical agenda.

As always, I will listen to voters in my district and I look forward to talking with you again soon.



THE INCALCULABLE HUMAN COST OF AB 5

THE INCALCULABLE HUMAN COST OF AB 5

On Tuesday over 300 independent professionals from across the state gathered at the California State Capitol to fight for their Right to Earn a Living in California.

Last year the State Legislature passed and Governor Newsom signed Assembly Bill 5, a bill that banned most forms of independent contracting in California. The result was devastating. Many freelancers, gig workers, entrepreneurs, and other independent professionals can no longer get paid for their work. With a single stroke of his pen, Governor Gavin Newsom rendered countless Californians, spanning at least a hundred professions, unable to earn a living in our state.

No law in recent memory has shattered the lives of so many people so quickly. Even Governor Newsom’s own former deputy chief of staff, Yassar Ali, has called AB 5 “one of the most destructive pieces of legislation in the last 20 years.”

The stories of those impacted by AB 5 are heartbreaking. Consider Esther, who describes herself as a proud, independent, and self-sufficient senior, and helps people who don’t speak English communicate with medical providers. She writes, “AB 5 leaves me out of work. It takes away my pride. It leaves me, and those I serve, completely unprotected and isolated.”

Or consider John, a guest orchestral conductor, who just lost a job because of the bill: “\$9,000 that would have put a dent in my student loans, or helped pay my insurance, or paid for food and shelter is now gone – all because of AB 5.”

Or Kathryn, who offers transcription services: “AB 5 has

devastated my life. I don’t know how I will be able to pay my bills now.” Or Lisa, a dance teacher and choreographer: “AB 5 will kill my livelihood of more than 30 years.” Or Michelle, a nail technician and widow who lost her home in the Camp Fire: “I am my sole provider and this bill will put me out of business.” Or Zenab, a mother and Arabic interpreter of 19 years: “I am no longer able to do what I love and no longer able to provide for myself and my family in California.”

I am collecting these stories and sharing them with other lawmakers – stories of con-

stituents who can no longer do what they love, offer a skill they have cultivated, and carry on their life’s work.

Among the law’s many victims are the most vulnerable members of our society: seniors, single mothers, those with health issues, caregivers, students, reformed convicts, people with disabilities – all of whom rely on the flexibility of independent contracting to tailor the demands of their chosen profession to the uniqueness of their personal circumstances.

Assembly Bill 5 is an affront to humanist values, and Governor Newsom cannot deny its incalculable human costs. I am offering him a chance to make things right, with urgency legislation to repeal the law immediately and restore the Right to Earn a Living. The next few weeks will reveal whether our Governor has the humility and courage to do the rarest thing in politics: admit he made a mistake.

It seems like many people are using the Instant Pot these days and I have received a few recipes recently, so please keep sending them in so my husband can try them out! One of my neighbors recently saw the Beef Stroganoff recipe and has sent in a dessert recipe for us to try. The husband in this household is in charge of the Instant Pot, too!

KHEER- A CREAMY RICE PUDDING

- ¼ cup basmati rice, soaked for 15-30 minutes
- ½ cup water
- 3 cups whole milk or full-fat coconut milk
- ½ cup sugar, adjust to taste
- ½ tsp ground cardamom, ad-

just to taste

- 1 pinch saffron (optional)
 - ¼ cup crushed nuts (pistachios, almonds or cashews)
 - ¼ cup golden raisins (optional)
- INSTANT POT

1. Soak the rice in cold water for 15-30 minutes. Drain, rinse and set aside

2. Press the sauté button and add ½ cup water to the pot. Once the water begins to steam, pour the milk into the pot. If you make sure the water is steaming, then you avoid the milk from burning at the bottom of the pot. Add the rice and stir.

3. Secure the lid, close the pressure valve and cook for 20 minutes at high pressure

4. Naturally release pressure
5. Press sauté. Add the sugar and spices to the pot. Stir until combined. The kheer will thicken as it cools. If you prefer a thicker pudding, press sauté and stir until desired thickness.

6. Serve this dessert hot, warm, cold or at room temperature. Top with nuts and raisins before serving.

Front Street Animal Shelter Harnesses the Power of Facebook to Save More Animal Lives Than Ever Before

Front Street successfully uses Facebook to mobilize the local community

Front Street Animal Shelter has seen incredible success by engaging the Sacramento community online to help save more animals. Since adopting the use of Facebook over six years ago, the local animal welfare organization has seen an astounding increase in the number of animals they've been able to save, going from a 20% animal save rate to 85% in 2019.

With over 198,000 followers, Front Street credits this success to their

The shelter has been able to share creative photos, videos and back-

ground stories of their animals with their followers. Several of the shelter's adoption campaigns have seen viral success, reaching millions of views and drawing fast attention to their mission of saving animal lives and placing dogs and cats in forever homes.

Logan, a three-legged dog who was struggling to be adopted, finally found his forever home thanks to one of Front Street's viral Facebook videos. Amazingly, Quinn, a teenage cancer survivor who also had his leg

amputated, was sent the video by a family friend. The next day, Quinn's family travelled to Sacramento and brought Logan back to his new forever home, bringing one of Front



Street's most magical stories full circle. Logan and Quinn's video has also helped the shelter win a \$100,000 grant.

"Facebook is a vital life saving tool for our shelter. When we're full, our adoption promotions are shared far and wide, resulting in lines of hundreds of adopters. When we have an animal with special needs that isn't getting adopted, Facebook helps show them to the world so they can find a loving home like all the other pets," Hinderman continued. "It also helps us raise critical funds, without which we couldn't save the number of animals that we do."



Ever heard of California confused cuisine? You will, if you stop by and discover Love at First Bite Café in Fair Oaks at 7405 Winding Way, where the atmosphere is friendly and warm, and the menu is chock full of favorites and inviting specials.

New owner Isaac Altamirano sold his catering company in Redwood City to purchase the name and the original recipes of Love at First Bite Café from its previous owner last April.

"I felt the restaurant's Fair Oaks

location was perfect, and the restaurant name, Love at First Bite fully reflects the restaurant that I wanted to create," he said.

Love at First Bite Café opened in 2015, but at the time of purchase in 2019, its daily breakfast and lunch foot traffic had tapered off.

Altamirano worked with chef Vincent Ruiz, another Bay Area veteran, and an executive chef for over 25 years, to raise the quality of the restaurant's original recipes to a higher standard and place a stronger emphasis on customer satisfaction. Ruiz drew from his culinary experience in Mexico, Japan, Italy and California in creating his dishes and refreshing popular favorites.

"Chef Ruiz and I want our menu to be distinctive, and the general atmosphere of our restaurant to

always be friendly and inviting," he said.

The pair also cut back visual clutter inside the restaurant and decided to feature work by local artists from nearby ACAI Gallery and Studios 7425 Winding Way which are available for purchase.

The café's overall business turnaround has been crisp and breakfast traffic has since grown by 20 percent since the summer. Key changes included the elimination of patio seating outside the restaurant and a reduction in staff which its owner said was a need to increase its speed of customer service.

"Our staff now has a much better line of sight so we're better able to greet each of our customers when they walk in, promptly seat them, and better attend to their needs."

"I also coach our serving staff one-on-one to fully describe to our customers all of the many distinctive dishes we offer," he said.

Altamirano was born in McAllen, Texas. He is married to wife Mayra, has four children, and lives in Citrus Heights.

Table service is supplemented by new large digital menu display boards which feature breakfast, lunch, specials and a full beverage menu.

Buttermilk hotcakes, a breakfast burrito, fresh corned beef hash, country biscuits and gravy and our "Fantastic French Toast" are top sellers. Breakfast guests can also create their own plate with a fritata of the day, a "build your own omelet" option, or lighter fare.

"Our traditional buttermilk hotcakes and biscuits are made from scratch each day. We don't believe in using pre-processed or pre-packaged food, so we keep them off your plate."

A negative Yelp review, concerning the generous size of Love at First Bite's breakfast French Toast which the customer said they were unable to finish, has actually helped sell a lot more of the item daily, thanks to a folding sign posted outside.

"Our customers wanted to see for themselves just how large the portion of French toast actually was. They weren't disappointed."

Reasonably priced gourmet lunch sandwiches starting at \$7.95 on sourdough, whole grain, rye or a

house roll are served with a choice of French fries, fruit, soup or a small salad. Lunch salads are offered in addition to a children's menu. Gluten-free options include honey white or seven-grain.

Popular sandwiches include the "Aggressive Grilled Cheese", "BLAT" - Bacon Lettuce Avocado Tomato, the "California Confused Club", chicken salad, chicken Caesar wrap, "The Greedy Cow", a Ham and Swiss crepe or a veggie wrap. Burger lovers can wrap their chins around a half-pound burger or two quarter-pound sliders of premium ground chuck for \$14.95.

The restaurant's menu also includes a variety of breakfast and lunch choices for vegan, vegetarian, and gluten-free preferences. Featured gluten-free soups are made fresh daily and include lentil, chicken vegetable and rice or


