DOVEWOOD OR NO DOVEWOOD?

Dovewood Court residents recently met with County representatives to discuss the upcoming Christmas season and lighting of the street. Like everyone we are trying to grapple with what it means to exist and operate in a Corona virus world. We understand how important what we do is for the community, from the thousands of dollars of food and donations collected for Food For Families and our local food banks, to the joy the lights and displays on our street has brought to generations of residents in our area. Today these feelings of joy and civic pride are juxtaposed with the heavy responsibility we feel to be responsible neighbors and not contribute the deadliest plague of our generation. To borrow a phrase from a long time Dovewood Court resident, "This is our gift to the community". None of us want it to be the gift of COVID-19. As such, the Dovewood Court Christmas lights will be significantly scaled back for the 2020 Christmas Season and we are asking for your help in implementing some procedures this year to help keep our amazing community safe.

First, some houses will not be decorated, and the decorations of most others significantly scaled back. Our homeowners feel very strongly about their responsibilities to the community to both decorate and not decorate given the circumstances. There are valid reasons on both sides of this argument. Ultimately it is up to each of the homeowners on our street to do what they feel is in the best interest of their family and community. I assure you that all of us love Christmas and wouldn't live here if we didn't. None of us took the decision we made lightly, so please be respectful of those who

have decided to limit decorations. Second, the canned food drive for Food for Families will continue, however there will be no volunteers to help place food in the cans or collect cash for donations. If you would like to contribute you can bring canned food with you, donate to Food for Families when you check out at Raley's, or take donations directly to the Orangevale and Twin Lakes food banks. Third, if you would still like to have your holiday tradition of visiting Dovewood Court, please drive through instead of walk. Most of the other streets that are doing Christmas light shows this year will be drive through and we want to follow suit. The parking lots at the Grange Hall and Christ the King Church will be closed this season and parking on side streets around Dovewood is limited. Lastly, no one likes to sit in traffic and as normal we expect fairly heavy traffic this year with all the people driving through. Traditionally the highest volume times for visitors are Friday-Sunday 7:30-9:30 and pretty much every day the week before Christmas from 7:30-9:30. Christmas eve is typically the most crowded day and is normally very busy open to close. To avoid sitting in traffic for hours, come early in the season, Monday-Thursday pretty much anytime, and before 7:30 on the weekends. Thank you for your understanding, and we hope to be back in 2021 bigger and better than ever. Dovewood Court will follow the traditional start and end dates and times for the lighting season. Attached is a scanned copy of the front and back of the mailer I got, which explains the proposed Solid Waste rate increase, as well as, how to send in a Protest Letter, and date and time of the Public Hearing.

I received this mailer last Thursday, October 15th. The deadline and hearing date is December 8th.

Sacramento County Department of Waste Management and Recycling has partnered together with SacGreen Team, (a left wing conservation group) to launch a direct attack on Sacramento County residents in an attempt to pick the pockets of its customers.

Sacramento County Department of Waste Management and Recycling is raising rates when most small family businesses are shut down, people are out of work, and kids are not in school. It's a time when their own customers are struggling to pay mortgages and other utilities. Now, these Board of Supervisor jokers want to add even more of a burden on homeowners and reach into our pockets for more money!

What you can do about this:
Individually, you can make yourself heard. It's like casting a vote! All you have to do is send them a Protest letter.

Sacramento County Department of Waste Management and Recycling is actually giving its customers the opportunity to protest this new rate increase. In fact, they recently sent out a mailer which said, "If enough written protests are submitted by a majority of customers, the rate increase will not be implemented."

The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors will also be holding a public hearing on the proposed rate increase. If you would like to voice your opinion on this matter, you may send a written comment to BoardClerk@sac-county.net or call 916-875-2500 to make a verbal comment during the hearing on: December 8, 2020 at 2:00 pm. Sacramento County Administration Center, Board Chambers, 700 H Street, Sacramento, CA 95841.

If you oppose the proposed rate increase, your protest letter must be submitted in writing to be considered, even if you plan to participate in the public hearing.

Protest letters must include the customer's name and service address. Protest letters must be submitted by the property owner or a customer of record of the Sacramento County Department of Waste Management and Recycling. Sacramento County Board of

Supervisors requires protests to be submitted in writing. E-mail, faxed, or photocopied letters will not be acceptable. (evidently they don't want photocopies because they don't want one person in a neighborhood printing a letter and bringing it around to everyone in the neighborhood, so all you would need to do is put your name, address on it.) You see, they're counting on you being lazy and not submitting a protest letter.

It makes you wonder, how can they defend or justify their proposed rate increase, when they say, "If enough written protest letters are submitted by a majority of customers, the proposed rate increase will not be implemented." If it's so important, how come they're willing to just scrap it if enough customers complain? Sounds more like the proposed rate increase is something they're trying to get away with. In fact, they think we're so stupid, that they think

they can just demand a rate hike and take our money. But, if enough people do complain, they will be more like, "whoa, so many people complained! Wow, they must be smarter than we thought, so we better wait for a while and try again later."

Yeah, they must really think their customers are stupid morons. Everyone already knows we let the County Waste Management get away with getting paid on both ends for our recyclables. We, stupid people, actually pay the County to collect our recyclable glass, aluminum and plastic and then, the County gets paid again when they turn in our recyclables and collect the Redemption Fee that we already paid, at the store, at the time of purchase. SOLID WASTE LIFELINE RATE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

We understand that rate increases can be challenging for our customers on fixed incomes. By law, we must charge all our customers the same rate for the same service. However, we are able to offer our low-income customers monthly rebates through our Solid Waste Lifeline Rate Assistance Program.

HOW TO PROTEST THIS RATE INCREASE

If you oppose the proposed rate increase, your protest must be submitted in writing to be considered, even if you plan to participate in the public hearing.

If written protests are submitted by a majority of customers, the proposed rate increase will not be implemented. Your written protest must be received by the December 8th public hearing.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RATE INCREASE AND PUBLIC HEARING DATE

The Sacramento County Department of Waste Management and Recycling is proposing a solid waste rate increase for residential customers. You are receiving this notice in compliance with Proposition 218, which requires the County to inform property owners and the customer of record that a proposed rate increase is being considered; the amount of the proposed rate increase; the reasons for the proposed increase; and, the basis on which the proposed rates were calculated.

The County is committed to providing reliable service at the lowest possible rates. The County currently provides the following services, all of which are considered the standard level of service:

- Weekly curbside collection of residential garbage
- Bi-weekly collection of green waste and recyclables, with weekly green and food waste collection starting on January 1, 2022
- Weekly curbside collection of used motor oil, used oil filters, and used cooking oil
- Once per calendar year pickup of bulky waste by appointment
- Monthly street sweeping
- Collection of illegal dumping
- Household Hazardous Waste drop-off service

HOW YOUR RATES COMPARE

CITY OF SACRAMENTO	\$42.59
COUNTY OF SACRAMENTO (PROPOSED)	\$36.96
CITY OF FOLSOM	\$30.00

The rates above compare the rate charged for one 60-gallon garbage cart serviced weekly, including green waste and recycling service, to rates currently charged for similar service in other jurisdictions.

Since July 2010, the County has not raised its residential solid waste curbside collection rates. However, inflation has increased 30 percent, new services have been added to the County's operations, the cost to divert our recycling has increased, and new State legislation has significantly increased the County's current and future operating costs and capital project needs.

HOW RATES WERE CALCULATED

An independent, third party expert conducted a comprehensive rate study of the residential solid waste curbside collection services provided by the County. The study analyzed the County's solid waste costs and corresponding service levels based on fiscal year 2020 data and developed a cost of service model to determine a fair-share allocation of costs to customers. Using this baseline model, projected future costs were allocated to develop rates that will generate the revenue needed to fund the delivery of safe, reliable, and high quality residential curbside collection services. PROPOSED RATE INCREASE

The following table sets forth the proposed adjustments to the County's monthly residential solid waste rates for the standard level of service. This includes one recycling cart and one green waste cart.

IF APPROVED, THE PROPOSED RATE INCREASE WILL:

- Offset the cost to process recyclables and green waste collected curbside.
- Cover costs to collect residential food waste with green waste weekly, beginning January 1, 2022, as mandated by State law.
- Offset rising costs for labor, services and supplies, and equipment maintenance.

Tree Care

FALL IS HERE

So with the ever-changing color of leaves, there comes an exceptional time of the year to assess much of your tree care needs. As the weather cools most deciduous trees begin to store energy for the upcoming winter, it makes for ideal conditions for some much needed pruning, as well as a great time to plant new trees. If you choose to trim make sure you hire an experienced and qualified arborist, preferably an ISA Certified Arborist. If you're ready to plant, you can do that either as saplings or as small trees. Be sure to bury at a depth appropriate for the root flare, but more important, is to dig out a diameter 2-3 times as wide in order to allow the new roots to spread and anchor themselves. Be sure to loosen up the roots from the root ball before you set it into the soil, if you



choose to use to mulch be sure to set it at least 4 inches away from the root stalk and have it 4-6 inches thick. Make sure to use a water soil tester to ensure the perfect amount of moisture in your soil.

Specifically for children, playing outdoors in the rain involves the use of gross motor skills, such as jumping, climbing, and running. Moving about on wet surfaces takes more concentration and strength. As children play in the rain, they're developing their bodies and are

able to grow more confident in their movements. This results in better balance, coordination, and agility. Children whom play outside regularly, in all types of environments, also tend to get sick less often. Playing outside increases one's level of Vitamin D, even on cloudy and rainy days. Children whom play outdoors are also more likely to use their imaginations and often play with others; increasing their social skills and interactions with other children. For adults and children being out in nature helps one be more aware of their surroundings and may increase reasoning and observation skills; a key stepping stone to building areas of development. saves them from spending their life merely tolerating 'bad' days in favor of a handful of 'good' ones - a life of endless expectations & conditions where happiness hinges on sunshine."

Prairie Chicken & Dumpling Stew

Ingredients:

3 cups of Chicken Breast, diced

1/2 cup of butter
2 cups diced onions
2 cups sliced celery
1/2 cup flour
1-quart chicken stock
2 cups sliced carrots
2 cups diced potatoes
2 cups biscuit mix (Bisquick mix)
1 tsp salt
1 tsp black pepper

Note: Prepare 2 cups of biscuit mix such as Bisquick, according to package directions. Once biscuit dough is formed, place in a bowl, cover with clear wrap and set aside.

In a 7- quart cast iron Dutch oven, (or a stewing pot), melt butter over me-

dium- high heat. Add diced chicken and sauté 5 - 10 minutes until cooked and lightly browned. Add diced onions and sliced celery. Sauté until vegetables are wilted, approximately 3 - 5 minutes. Sprinkle in flour, and blend well into the vegetable mixture. Add chicken stock, bit by bit, until all is incorporated. Bring mixture to a rolling boil and reduce heat to simmer. Add carrots and potatoes. Continue to cook 10 - 15 minutes. Season mixture to taste with salt and pepper. Spoon the biscuit mix into the pot in the shape of dumplings. Cover and cook approximately 1 hour. Ready to Serve in a soup bowl.

Makes approximately 8 servings

7. Pile that turkey sandwich with slices of bacon, tomatoes, lettuce for a great BLT.

8. Make frittatas with leftover green beans or other veggies, cheese and sausage. But up squares for next day brunch, or freeze for later.

9. Add leftover mashed sweet potatoes to your favorite brownies.

10 Toss diced leftover turkey with tomatillo salsa, cannellini beans and protein pasta. Add greens such as cooked swiss chard for a one dish meal.

11. Portobello mushrooms become a meal when filled with leftover stuffing mixed with additional ingredients like turkey, potatoes, cheese.....pesto, anyone?




