The first restaurant that we are featuring is Lupita's Mexican Restaurant, 9353 Greenback Lane.

We spoke with Lupita, the owner. She has been at the current location since 1996, 25 years! She originally wanted to be a singer but with 8 kids, that wasn't going to pay the bills, and cooking is what she loves to do. Lupita started cooking in the Eastern and Arcade area before moving to her present location on Greenback. Everything at Lupita's is homemade, the way her mother and grandmother did and which is why it is so good. When asked what her restaurant is known for, she talked about how people say they ate somewhere else and it wasn't as good as hers and she asks "why would you eat there when you can eat here?"

When asked about how business has been throughout the pandemic, she replied that she is down about 95% but is keeping a very positive outlook. Lupita's closed down for the first 3 months of the pandemic and then reopened for a week. She ended up having a gas leak that again closed her down for the next 4-5 months. Lupita's is back open and the kitchen back together. The restaurant right now is open for takeout only, Tuesday thru Sunday 4:00-9:00 p.m., closed Mondays. But beginning January 29th, she will be



open for lunch from 11:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. Lupita wants to thank the Orangevale Community for all the support and love that she has experienced from our Community. Please give her a call, (916) 988-0888, and order some fabulous Mexican food and support one of our longtime businesses. I highly recommend the Chili Rellenos! Lupita's will be offering an amazing Welcome Back



In the comfort of his home, Bernard "Ben" Casalegno passed away on January 1, 2021 at the age of 100 from Congestive Heart Failure.

Ben graduated from Santa Cruz High School and later went to work at McClellan Air Force Base as a civilian employee. CONSISTENTLY INCONSISTENT

CONSISTENTLY INCONSISTENT: Sacramento Region Returns to Purple Tier

Like me, I am sure many of you are eagerly awaiting the day that I have something to write about other than the COVID-19 pandemic. Something happened just the other day that makes me feel the need to highlight the inconsistency in practices and what we should keep in mind should we ever find ourselves back in a pandemic situation. We all know the story so far. In March of last year, we went into a full stay-at-home order. Then, counties were placed on watch lists, and then the blueprint for a safer economy determined which tier of reopening we could enter. Then, in response to concerns that ICU capacities were dwindling, the state grouped counties and regions and declared that any region with less than 15% ICU capacity would go into a full shutdown for a minimum of three weeks.

The Greater Sacramento Region, consisting of 13 different counties, was ordered into the regional stay-at-home order on December 9th. We were anticipating remaining in the shutdown far beyond the minimum three-week requirement. On the morning of January 12th, our Public Health officials were briefing the Board of Supervisors on the status of the County's response to the pandemic. That briefing included that the regional ICU capacity remained at 9.4%, far below what was needed to reopen. Then, miraculously, our Public Health officials received a call from the state that the Sacramento region would be exiting

the stay-at-home order and returning to the purple tier of reopening, effective immediately.

I was elated to hear the news. It is no secret that I have been a strong advocate for safely reopening our economy. I have advocated for the zip code based system so that Orangevale does not see all of its customers flock to businesses in Roseville when they open first. I have consistently asked for contact tracing data that justifies the closing of various businesses without success. Much of my frustration and the frustration I hear from local business owners comes from the perspective that the state just seems to be making up the rules as they go along. This recent move to reopen the Greater Sacramento region, while a positive move, shows just how subjective the rules continue to be. The reason the Greater Sacramento region was able to return to the purple tier was based on a four-week projection that our ICU capacity would reach approximately 19%. As far as I know, reopening based on a projection of ICU capacity was never a metric we were told could be used to reopen.

Again, I am thrilled that we are taking positive steps in the direction of reopening our businesses. Our case rate appears to be hitting a plateau, and, obviously, our ICUs are starting to free up more space. The data around COVID-19 cases and deaths is essential, and it should be used to guide how we react to the pandemic. I can also accept that we continue to learn more about the virus and our own capacities to control it every day. That is why I am so opposed to knee-jerk reactions of the state every time they realize their plans aren't working. For more than a month, businesses that had been acting in good faith to comply with public health guidance invested their time and money and brought back the employees they care about were told to shut down completely, again. The time for the state to flex emergency powers to appear in control is over. We now need to focus on keeping businesses safely open and getting the vaccine to as many people as are willing to take it. The sooner we get back to normal, the sooner we can get back to fixing the 99 other problems we already had on our plate before the pandemic hit.





1/3 cup lemon juice 2 cups powdered sugar

Make while the cake is baking. Mix together thoroughly.

Crust:

34 cup butter 1/3 cup powdered sugar 1 ½ cup flour

Mix together until crumbly. Pat into a 13 x 9-inch pan. (I previously used a glass pan, but the bars cook more evenly in a metal pan!) Bake in a 350° oven for 15 minutes.

Topping:
4 large eggs, slightly beaten
2 cups sugar
4 TBSP lemon juice
Zest of 2 lemons
1/4 cup flour

Mix ingredients together and pour over hot crust. Bake 25 minutes or more until topping is firm. Sift powdered sugar over top while still warm. Cool overnight or in refrigerator. Cut into small squares when cool. Store in the refrigerator.

Moving quickly to survey the damage, a of group 600 coaches formed the Golden State Coaches Community, and decided to get some real data on the impact the sports ban has had on our children. After surveying 105 football programs from their region, these are the alarming results they found:

- ·1087 ruled ineligible (below required grade point average)
- •253 dropped out
- •64 incarcerated



- ·85 joined gangs
- •38 new fathers

Not to mention climbing statistics on youth suicide, depression and other unreported consequences to our youth.




