Imagine building a Victorian mansion for \$7500.00. Well, the Orangevale History Project has discovered that's exactly what William and Mary Alice Calder did in 1895. The Calders learned of Orange Vale when William was managing a theatrical production that passed through Sacramento. The grand mansion named the Palms sat at 8994 Greenback Lane behind a grand circular drive and quite a few palm trees. The mansion stood three stories high and was filled with the most beautiful woodwork and windows along with its beautiful furnishings. Behind the mansion were 30 acres of citrus orchards owned by the Calders. Sadly, the mansion was torn down with little fanfare in 1963 and replaced by a gas station. The Orbit Station now sits in WHAT WAS THE FRONT YARD. A FEW PALM TREES ON PECAN AVE HAVE SURVIVED.

What a change it must have been to move to Orangevale after being involved in the theatrical world in major cities of England and the US. But the Calders settled in and became involved in the newly thriving community of Orange Vale while running the orchard and a packing company. Their lives were **CONTINUED ON PAGE 2**

filled with citrus growing, community development and service and elegant parties. On one occasion Mr. Calder organized a theatrical production, pre-sented it in Folsom and used the proceeds to pay off the debt of the Orangevale Presbyterian church.

By 1907, they built their retirement home across the street and continued their community work. Mary Alice and several other prominent ladies were the founders of the Orangevale Woman's Club which still survives today to serve the community.

This house still stands at 8999 Greenback Lane. and is often called the Calder Mansion. The house was owned by the Calders until 1930 when it was sold to the W.L. Williams Family. After William Calder died in 1928, at the age of 82 years, Mary moved to San Francisco to live with her daughter. Records show the house was owned by the Williams, Dennis, Irwin, Speck, Todd and Rountree families until the mid 1970's. The ensuing years saw a succession of owners using it as boarding houses or restaurants. Fortunately for Orangevale, the house is





ROBERT LEE WILSON 1929-2021

Robert Lee Wilson left this world for a new home in heaven on December 17, 2021, one month after his 92nd birthday. His journey home was peaceful, surrounded by loving family who cared tenderly for him in the last months of life; during the time when he said that his main job was keeping his chair warm. In heaven, he joins Ruth Aliene, wife of 70 years, his father Azzie (Ted), mother Minnie, brother Ted, sister Mary, and his baby daughter, Sandy.

Bob, affectionately known as R.L., was born in Sayre, Oklahoma in 1929. His family left Oklahoma during the Dust Bowl and eventually settled in Healdsburg, California. In his later years, he would recall a childhood busy with hard work: milking cows, hauling prune boxes, going to

school, feeding livestock and doing it all over again every day. "That's just the way it was back then" he would often say

He joined the Marines at age 18. We recently learned that Sergeant Robert L. Wilson was one of the courageous Marines who fought at Chosin. When he left the military, he became a successful builder in the Sacramento area. Bob was a devoted husband, loving father and grandfather. OVparks Receives \$250,009 in COVID Relief Funding

The Orangevale Recreation & Park District announced it has received \$250,009 in funding to help offset expenses and lost revenue the district experienced during the COVID-19 pandemic. This funding is much welcomed as OVparks is now planning repairs and upgrades to our community swimming pool as well as improvements to new parkland we acquired in 2019. The funding is made available from a \$100 million allocation provided by the State Legislature and Governor Gavin Newsom in the 2021-2022 State Budget.

In response to the news of this funding, OVparks District Administrator Barry Ross stated, "We estimate that the pandemic has cost our district nearly \$400,000. This relief funding goes a long way to help us bridge that gap. Like every other business and service agency, we look forward to the

day when COVID is no longer interfering with our service to the community. At this point we're extremely grateful to the State of California for this support. As parks and recreation professionals, one of our primary purposes is to bring people together through fun, social, healthy, and cultural activities such as sports, camps, classes, social gatherings, and special events. The COVID pandemic has greatly impeded our ability to provide these services in our traditional sense. We have provided scaled back programming in a safe and responsible way, but with budgetary consequences."

This funding arrives after special districts across California experienced budget and staff cuts necessitated as a result of the COVID pandemic. Throughout 2020 and 2021, California's special districts provided essential services to their local communities, maintained a large portion of the state's critical infrastructure, and employed thousands of front-line workers, but initially received none of the COVID relief funding available to cities and counties.

"Special districts are addressing our biggest statewide challenges, all at the local level." said Neil McCormick, CEO of the California Special Districts Association (CSDA). We applaud Governor Newsom and our Legislature for recognizing this and responding to our requests for partnership. Special districts make a difference throughout California and this funding will make a difference in the communities special districts serve."

More than 2,000 independent special districts across the state serve the needs of all 40 million Californians at some level, and more than 60 percent of these local agencies provide specialized services to a disadvantaged community.

- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- •1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- •1 cup (8 ounces) sour cream

HOMELESS ASSISTANCE RESOURCE TEAM (HART) REVIEW

Carmichael and Fair Oaks/Orangevale (FO/OV) HARTs are nonprofit organizations currently engaged in providing programs for our local homeless citizens. FO/ OV HART is the newest team in the county. They are currently trying to identify their homeless population and then plan on doing an outreach program for them. Carmichael HART was organized five years ago. They have a fourfold program including a student program, two transitional houses, a weekly lunch and shower outreach and a winter respite.

The student program is partnered with a McKinney Vento program in the San Juan Unified School District. McKinney Vento is a national program assisting students and their families who are in transition. This can include living with family members, couch surfing, living in a shelter or living on the streets. Carmichael HART has participated in backpack drives for McKinney Vento and in a student buddy/mentor program. The team also has two transitional houses, one for women and a new one for men, which will open soon. These homes provide an opportunity for people experiencing homelessness to be housed at no cost while they find housing.

In April, Carmichael HART began an ongoing outreach program. This program includes lunch delivery on Thursdays and showers on Saturdays. Forty lunches are delivered each week. Sixteen showers are offered each Saturday. Carmichael Presbyterian Church food locker provides food for the lunches. Hygiene items, hats, socks, underwear and other various supplies are donated by generous supporters. Carmichael Presbyterian Church also hosts

the showers on Saturdays. Volunteers make lunches, deliver lunches and supervise the showers.

This January and February 2022, Carmichael HART will provide a winter respite three mornings a week. The respite will offer hot breakfasts, sack lunches, phone charging, showers, rest from the elements, hair cuts, nursing assistance, socks, hats,

and some clothing. The respite will be at Carmichael Presbyterian Church on 5645 Marconi Ave. Hosting churches include Crossroads Church, St John the Evangelist Catholic Church, St Michael's Episcopal Church and the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The respite will be from 9:00am to 1:00pm every Saturday, Monday and Wednesday. For more information see the website: carmichaelhart.org. Information about all the HARTS in the county can be found on hartstogether.org.



GET THE MASKS OUT

GET MASKS OUT OF CLASSROOMS

On the heels of a new statewide mask mandate and the continued declaration of a COVID-19 state of emergency, it feels necessary to once again advocate for a population left seemingly voiceless throughout this saga. After a year of being forced out of the classroom, California children have returned only under the condition that they wear masks. Regardless of your perspective on the pandemic and experiences thus far, I think we all need to take a step back and thoroughly evaluate the benefits versus impacts of masking an entire generation during their developmental years. Rather than continue to hinder the ability to verbally and non-verbally communicate, it is long past due that we allow children to remove their masks and provide them with alternatives to protect against the airborne spreading

If we heard it once, we have heard it a million times: follow the science. However, science tells us that the vast majority of children who get COVID have mild symptoms, or no symptoms.. So, the masking of children cannot be about the children at all; instead, it is about preventing them from spreading the virus to adults. By now school staff who fall in an at risk category have been advised to vaccinate or test regularly. In fact, teachers were given priority in the line to get vaccines. Getting teachers back in the classroom was just as crucial as getting kids back, but taking kids from virtual learning to masked learning is not much of an improvement. Children often report symptoms of shortness of breath, headache, nausea, vomiting, syncope, fear, anxiety and depression as a result of masking up. Some children who have extenuating circumstances such as autistic disorder, cerebral palsy, lung disease or hearing disorders, suffer a great trauma from masking. If we genuinely wish to unburden students from the social, mental and physical impacts of the pandemic. we need to let them remove their masks. I am sure we have all had conversations where someone or both people had to pull their masks away from their faces so the other person could understand what was being said. Imagine doing that through an entire school day. Masks make it difficult to hear or understand what someone is saying, but they also cover facial expressions. Children need to see a smile, a frown, or a silly face as part of their social development. They



also need to show their expressions to feel seen and understood. The hindering of their social development has potentially severe long-term consequences. As things like depression and anxiety are already becoming more prevalent in our society, stunting the emotional growth of an entire generation seems like a dangerous decision to make. As we approach two years of this crisis, we need to think about how we may be creating new, potentially worse, problems.

If masks are intended to prevent the spread of the virus, there are alternatives to masking children such as classrooms getting better ventilation and being provided with air filters. The health and safety of children should remain a priority, but that means every aspect of their health. When a child walks into their classroom, they should be entering an environment where they can learn, feel safe, and express themselves meaningfully.

Let adults shoulder the burden of government mandates and states of emergency and leave the children out of it. I sincerely hope that our Governor, our teachers, and all school officials would agree that the well-being of children should be a priority and that we can take on a little extra risk for ourselves to protect them.
