

Cole joined our Lord and Savior on January 14, 2022 at his home with his loving wife Peggy by his side. He has now joined his parents Veryl and Opal, his brothers Kerry Sr., Donald Sr., Edward, and Larry Talburt, and his son Keith.

Coleman was born on March 22, 1938, in Haileyville, Oklahoma. When he was three his parents decided to move to San Jose, CA. His family lived off Coleman Ave in San Jose. Cole graduated from Lincoln High School in 1956 and then joined the National Guard. After the National Guard he attended

San Jose Community College and obtained an Associate Degree. After graduating from college, he proceeded to go to Barber College. Being a Barber was his calling and passion. Cole and Peggy moved to Fair Oaks in 1990.

Cole loved being a Barber, especially his interaction with his customers who even travel long distances just to have him cut their hair. For a ten-year period, he also worked at Ford Aerospace and continued to barber on weekends. He met his wife Peggy on May 13th, 1975 and they married on April 24, 1976. It was that day where

the two families became one. February 1987, his son Keith was hurt very badly in a car accident that left him mute and a quadriplegic. One of Cole's biggest displays of love was when he chose to retire and take care of Keith full time. He took care of Keith until his passing in March of 2004.

Every chance he could, Cole would barber at the local shop in Orangevale, cut hair for the homeless, volunteer to serve food and participate at local community events. He enjoyed nature, fishing, walking along the American River and playing Disc Golf at Shady Oaks Park.

Cole loved life and had a wonderful sense of humor. He was a terrific father and his family meant everything to him. He was loved by all who knew him. He will be missed dearly and remembered always.

Cole is survived by his wife Peggy of 45 years, his son Sergeant First Class Dwayne Talburt Sr. and wife Carol, his daughter Lisa Montes and husband Phill, his grandsons Captain Dwayne Talburt Jr. and wife Elizabeth, Dillon Talburt, Dawson Talburt, granddaughters Vanessa Montes and fiancé Brian Kinch and Anya Dyer and husband Brennan, plus great grandchildren Kayleighann McCormack, Makayla McCormack, Brycen McCormack and Kinsley Dyer, along with all of those who called him Pop, Dad, Uncle, Papa Cole, or Grandpa Cole.

Are you ready for another Instant Pot recipe? Since my husband retired, he has been experimenting with recipes that he finds on the internet for the Instant Pot and usually they are delicious. His most recent find is for Salisbury Steak. Serve it over rice or mashed potatoes with a salad or veggie and you have the perfect comfort food for cold winter nights.

Instant Pot Salisbury Steak

8 oz. mushrooms, sliced ½ onion, sliced

- 1 ½ cups beef broth
- 1 oz package brown gravy mix, dry
- 1 TBSP tomato paste
- 1 TBSP Dijon mustard
- 2 TBSP fresh parsley, chopped
- 1 TBSP Worcestershire sauce 2 TBSP corn starch
- 4 TBSP water

Beef Patties:

1 to $1\frac{1}{2}$ lbs. lean ground beef 1 egg yolk

1/3 cup Panko bread crumbs 3 TBSP milk

Salt and pepper

1.Place sliced onions and mushrooms in the bottom of the pot

2. In a bowl, combine the beef patty ingredients to form 6 patties. Brown over medium heat in a skillet. Cook about 3 minutes per side.

- 3. Layer beef patties over onions and mushrooms. Combine remaining ingredients EXCEPT cornstarch and water. Pour over beef and cook at high pressure, 18 minutes.
- 4. Quick release. Remove patties and set aside.
- 5. Turn the Instant Pot onto sauté. In a small bowl, combine cold water and cornstarch. Mix with your fingers until it is combined. Stir into the broth and cook a few minutes until thickened. Add beef back into the sauce to coat.
- 6. Serve over mashed potatoes or rice.





WHEN TO CALL 9-1-1, BY METRO FIRE

When someone calls 9-1-1, the expectation is that an ambulance shows up quickly, you are assessed, stabilized if necessary, and taken to the nearest emergency department to be seen by a doctor within minutes. However, when someone calls 9-1-1 for a non-life-threatening event, they often times are not seen quickly at the hospital. Sometimes for several hours. This is because a hospital emergency department operates under what is called a "triage" system and not a "first-come, first-served" system like a doctor's office. The more significant the medical

event is, the faster the patient is seen. This is because things like choking, heart attacks, and head injuries require immediate attention to give the patient the best chance of survival.

Metro Fire would like to remind the community about when it is appropriate to call 9-1-1 and when an individual is better served contacting their primary care physician or driving themselves to an urgent care clinic to be seen by a doctor.

Always call 9-1-1 for a lifethreatening emergency. If someone is having difficulty breathing, choking, head injury, loss of consciousness, chest pains, significant bleed-



ing, internal injury, falls from a high distance, or any other injury or illness that is immediately life threatening 9-1-1 is appropriate.

It is recommended that you

contact your physician for issues such as general pain, prescription refills, COVID testing, or an illness or injury that is not an immediate threat to health or life. If you

need to be seen immediately, urgent care clinics can handle most non-life-threatening issues such as prescriptions, routing testing, cold and flu like symptoms, and more!





SACRAMENTO COUNTY CANNOT AFFORD ANOTHER LOCKDOWN

With the rise in COVID cases across the world as a result of the omicron variant, local jurisdictions are struggling with how to properly react. Some areas like Sonoma County have now issued "shelter in place" orders, which means residents can only go to places for essential reasons, such as the grocery store or doctor's office. I strongly believe Sacramento County should not go down this path, and should do everything possible to avoid further shutdowns like the previous failed attempts.

The current rise of COVID is somewhat misleading, as the only thing the media wants to currently report on is the number of COVID cases. And while the omicron variant is extremely contagious, studies have shown that symptoms are less severe than other variants. The whole reason that the shutdowns happened originally were because deaths were on the rise and hospitals were being overrun, and in Sacramento County neither of these two things are happening. Thankfully, COVID related deaths have remained low, and our hospitals are not in danger of exceeding capacity.

Shutdowns do not come free. and should be avoided due to the devastating impacts they have on society. The Wellbeing Trust, a non profit working to de-stigmatize mental health issues, released a study that found 75.000 deaths during the recent national shutdowns were "deaths of despair" which includes suicides and overdoses. And in California, nearly one in three restaurants permanently closed as a result of the most recent shut-

Nowhere are these negative shutdown impacts more evi-

dent than how they have impacted children. The United Nations Children's Fund released a report that showed the current generation of students will lose \$17 trillion in lifetime earnings as a result of the learning losses suffered during the global shutdowns. The United States Department of Education also released a report that showed the pandemic has negatively affected academic growth, has deepened the impact of disparities in access and opportunity, and heightened the risk of sexual harassment, abuse, and violence.

Politicians, the media, and government agents have stoked fears to the highest level, and we cannot blame the public for being afraid. But we must fight to keep our businesses, communities and schools open - while also needing to recognize the importance of respectful debate and compassion.


