MARILYN EDWARDS PRESENTED FIRST HISTORY PERSON OF YEAR AWARD

The Orangevale History Project named Marilyn Edwards as their First History Person of the Year at a recent general meeting. Marilyn was honored for her dedication as Founder of this organization. She took the responsibility in 2019 when meeting with community leaders and they acknowledged the need for a historical society.

The pandemic interfered with meetings and she was not able to start again until the summer of 2021. She undertook recruiting members and was the face of the organization until early 2022. Marilyn encouraged help but represented the Project to all community groups, attended and lead all the planning meetings of the committees she enlisted after developing a blueprint.

With her ability to bring people together, she got a nominating committee formed and a slate of officers were installed in March 2022. The Project celebrates their first year anniversary this month. Marilyn has continued her dedication to the Project serving as Membership Coordinator, and leads the Archives and Curating Team.

She has been active in the recent acquisition of the History Museum through the Orangevale Recreation and Park District and working on many aspects of development.

The plaque serves to remember her as Founder of the Orangevale History Project and will be displayed in the museum in recognition as the first recipient.

1ST ANNUAL SPRING DRIVE-THROUGH FOOD DRIVE

In the wake of growing need, OV OF Foodbank hosts 1st Annual Spring Drive-through Food Drive

Following the successful pattern of the Fall Community Food Drive, volunteers are again rallying community support to fill the Orangevale Fair Oaks Food Bank shelves on March 18 as their stores begin to run thin.

The food bank invites you to participate in the 1st Annual Spring Community Food Drive, run as a drive-through dropoff in front of the Orangevale Fair Oaks Food Bank (6483 Main Ave in Orangevale) on Saturday March 18th from 9:00 a.m. until noon. Cars can line up along Main Ave facing the foodbank, and volunteers will unload vehicles.

"Last year, the fall drive couldn't have come even a week later, and this spring drive feels the same," said Andrea Scollay, OV FO Foodbank Director, as she described the increasing food insecurity and need in our community.

For the past two years, the Fall Community Food Drive has stocked the foodbank shelves until spring, but come spring, the shelves fall short. This year in 2023, even earlier. But, there is hope. When the communities that support the OVFO Foodbank show up, they show up strong.

"It has been unbelievable," says



Jose Zambrano, OV FO Food bank community outreach volunteer, of the fall drives growth since it started three years ago, "to go from one Church, to five churches, now ten plus... wow! But that is only one part of the Community...we have schools, sports teams, clubs, scouts, businesses. This event is an example of a community coming together full of love and compassion. Like our foodbank motto, 'Neighbors Helping Neighbors'."

Inspired by the work done in the fall, volunteers hope to create the same thing annually in the spring. They invite community churches and organizations not involved in the fall to partner in the spring. Filling the gap until the drive in October could keep the food bank full year round. Already accepting that invitation are Oak Avenue Church, Pathways Fellowship, Citrus Heights Seventh Day Adventist

and the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

Hosting a one-day drop-off drive has become a great model for the OV FO Foodbank. Volunteers come together at one time and one place. "It takes what was once done over the course of a month by volunteers going out to grocery stores every weekend and condensed it into a one-day drive," says Scollay.

If there is a model for community success, the Orangevale Fair Oaks Community Food Drive may have found it. When a community member sees a need, as Marcus Arnold did when he began spearheading a fall food drive in 2020, and is willing to step forth and gather others around it, great things Talents, resources happen. and the good vibes of serving together are shared, and grow. Often many see the same need, but it takes the rallying voice.

GROCERY STORES OF ORANGEVALE - PART 1 (1907 - 1961 - 9304 GREENBACK LANE)

In the beginning, groceries arrived by stage. Rev. L. B. Hinman, who started holding religious services at the Orangevale Public School in 1891, began to run his stage from Orangevale twice a week, carrying passengers and freight goods for Orangevale residents. Frank Linnell, an Orangevale tract owner, took over and built the store and a house where the future store was located which is now at 9304 Greenback Lane (CarQuest Auto Parts).

In 1907, R.H. Fry was the proprietor of the now named Orangevale Merchandise Store and had one of the first phones installed which he made available at the store for customers to make calls to Folsom and Sacramento. Then in 1908, Gust Peterson

who had a home in Orangevale for some time, buys the store from Fry, but due to poor health, he sells to Carson Castleman and the name is changed to Orangevale Store in 1912. They obtain the first liquor license in the area and Frank Chesson runs stage from the store to Sacramento for residents who previously had to walk to Folsom to catch a stage ride.

Due to strong protests against liquor licensing in Orangevale, Castleman agrees to give up liquor license in March of 1913 and runs a successful store for many years. At the time, he sold 4 lbs. of rice for 25 cents, cans of corn and peas for 10 cents each and 50 lbs. of flour for \$2.65. The store was also a gathering place for many events, including greeting home the Army boys.

In 1932, Will E. Eddy (Eddy Brothers) purchased the store and made extensive alterations and improvements at the site for the next 13 years before closing in 1943 where the store had operated for the last 50 years at this location.

It is then sold to W.W. Vance in 1945 and became Vance's Market. The store was Orangevale's headquarters for groceries, meats, hardware, feeds, Butane-gas, gasoline, and household appliances. He also started home delivery services to Orangevale, Folsom, Represa and Vicinity. Improvements made during his ownership included a display window, lighting, new paint, vegetable room and restrooms. Bargains included 8 oz. tomato sauce - 6 cents, a dozen Grade "A" large eggs for 70 cents, 1 lb. ground beef 30 cents and cedar fence posts for 40 cents each.

In 1958, W.T. (Bill) Crocker and Scott Tibbit's buy Vance's and have the formal opening in February 1959 under the new name Peter Pan Market. The building

was then the oldest in Orangevale and their remodeling program gave the market over 5,000 feet of floor space, doubling store areas featuring meats, canned and frozen foods and produce. A 40-foot counter devoted entirely to delicatessen items and a new section of household items were added. Parking was also improved to accommodate 40-45 cars.

The store known as Peter Pan Market was short-lived at this location when in less than a full year Bill Carson and Vic Cima purchased the market in September of 1959 and renamed it to Greenback Market. Grand opening prices included 1 lb. C&H sugar for 10 cents, 10 lbs. of potatoes for 39 cents, toilet tissue 5 cents per roll, and pork roast for 39 cents a pound. They even had a shoe basement where white canvas and blue denim tennis shoes could be purchased for \$2.49. Blue Chip Stamps were given at this time too. A filled book of stamps was worth \$5.00 in merchandise at Breuner's.

It is unknown when Greenback Market closed or CarQuest Auto Parts actually opened. Additional articles will be published in the future covering the history of other grocery stores in Orangevale.



Have you tried Havarti cheese? It is such a wonderful mild cheese and it makes great grilled cheese sandwiches. Tonight we wanted a simple meal, so we made grilled cheese sandwiches with sautéed mushrooms. If you prefer a heartier meal, then the Havarti cheese and sautéed mushrooms are wonderful on top of a hamburger! Havarti is just a really nice cheese for anything, so try it and see for yourself.

Grilled Mushroom and Cheese Sandwich

Mushrooms, sliced thinly Havarti cheese, sliced thinly Sourdough bread, sliced Butter Salt and pepper Garlic powder

Put a little butter in a small pan and sauté the mushroom slices, add a little salt. pepper and garlic powder. When mushrooms are tender, remove from heat and set aside. Meanwhile, in another pan, butter one side of bread and place butter side down in pan. Place slices of cheese on one side of bread. When bread is toasted and cheese is melted, add the mushrooms on top of the cheese (use a slotted spoon to drain the mushrooms before placing on the cheese)

and put the top bread on the sandwich. If bread is browning too much, go ahead and place the top on the sandwich, and then flip the sandwich so that it browns evenly and the cheese melts. When the cheese has melted, pull apart the sandwich and then add the mushrooms. Enjoy!

Optional: add some crispy, cooked bacon to the sandwich.

Try this mixture on your next hamburger by adding the sliced Havarti to the burger as it is finishing cooking like you would any other cheeses. Sauté the mushrooms while the hamburger is cooking and add them between the bun and the cheese right before you are ready to eat. Enjoy!






