

INDIAN STONE CORRAL VISIT

Fifteen Orangevale History Project members were led by Sacramento County Regional Park guides on a hiking tour of the Indian Stone Corral which was a village site for the Maidu designated as a historic site. Also, in 1978 Sacramento County obtained ownership and installed fencing to limit access.

The Regional Parks did a 2003 resource study which has been shared with us.

The study reports the site covers 72 acres and there is a private four acre residence that abuts the site. Included is a caretaker's residence which is currently unused and has no water or energy sources at this time.

> This site is known by several names, and one is Robbers Roost. The notorious

and Nisenan Indian tribes. Several granite rocks still show signs of where the tribes ground acorns for food. It is said there are some dimmed petroglyphs in the area, but they were not located.

In the 1970's the Moss Landing Company used the site as a granite quarry and Sierra College studied the cultural resources and performed archaeological surveys. In 1975 it was names tied to the Robbers Roost designation are Dr. Thomas Hodges (aka Tom Bell), Joaquin Murrieta and even Black Bart. This started due to the gold rush and at times a stagecoach line rode through the area. The wild flowers and plants that were in bloom during the hike included: Soap Root, Lupine, Texas Blue Bonnets, Popcorn flowers, Fiddleneck, Blue Dicks, Filaree (aka storksbill) and, in the pond Flag Iris was spotted.

Hikers spotted ducks on the pond, a white egret and numerous varieties of birds. I took a walk along the pond (not an easy walk) to see the beaver dam. The hikers also spied a coyote and the real home owner of the area a bobcat with kittens.

The Orangevale History Project hopes to assist with the development of this area in the future to make it accessible for all the community.

HISTORICAL TRAIL SIGN OF 1860'S RAIL-ROAD DEDICATION CEREMONY

Orangevale, CA -- The Orangevale History Project (OHP) is hosting a dedication ceremony for the historical trail sign showing the route and berm of the Railroad that went through Orangevale in the 1860's. The California Central Railroad was the second railroad in California and the first to span a river in the West. Designed by OHP, the sign will be placed on a walking trail near one of the remaining railroad berms still visible in the park. The ceremony will take place Saturday, May 20, 2023, at 2:00pm

at the Orangevale Community Park (*see note below for directions – parking is off Filbert Ave).

Special guests include Sacramento County Supervisor Sue Frost, Assemblyman Josh Hoover, and Congressman Kevin Kiley.

"This is the first of many historical signs the OHP wants to recognize and share with the Orangevale community," said Mark Aring, OHP President. "All are welcome to join us!"

Special thanks to these partners for their support in making the historical sign project possible: Orangevale Recreation & Park District for approving and installing the sign, Rotary Club of Orangevale for the donation for the sign development, and Zack Construction of Roseville for the sign's frame.

VANILLA CUPCAKES Makes about 30 cupcakes

1 ¾ cups cake flour, not self rising

2 cups sugar 1 tablespoon baking powder ³/₄ teaspoon salt 1 cup (2 sticks) unsalted butter, cut into 1-inch cubes 4 large eggs

- 1 cup whole milk 1 teaspoon pure vanilla ex-
- tract

Vanilla Buttercream frosting

1.Preheat oven to 325°. Line cupcake pans with paper liner; set aside. In the bowl of an electric mixer, combine flours, sugar, baking powder, and salt; mix on low speed until combined. As mixer is mixing, add butter until just coated with flour.

2. In a large glass measuring cup, whisk together the eggs, milk and vanilla. With mixer on medium, add these ingredients in 3 parts, scraping sides of bowl after each addition; beat until all ingredients are incorporated.

3. Scoop batter into paper cups with an ice cream/ cookie

dough scoop about two-thirds full. Bake until a cake tester inserted comes out clean, 17-20 minutes.

4. Transfer to a wire rack to cool. Frost with buttercream frosting and decorate with colored sprinkles.

VANILLA BUTTER-CREAM FROSTING

cup (2 sticks) unsalted butter, room temperature
6-8 cups confectioners' sugar
cup milk
teaspoon pure vanilla extract

Cream butter in an electric mixer until smooth and creamy- about 2-3 minutes. With mixer on low speed, add 6 cups sugar, milk and vanilla; mix until light and fluffy. Add extra sugar if needed for desired consistency.


