





DRANGEVALE RESIDENTS 1850



ORANGEVALE RESIDENTS IN 1850 California is rich in history and has quite a tale to tell. I

and has quite a tale to tell. I cannot possibly do that any justice from my knowledge and thumbnail research.

What I can do is try to share what was going on around the state and the country when immigrants from all over the world traveled to a place called Mississippi Township in California and made it their home.


The Gold Rush was on -it's 1849 and the lure of making fortunes in gold drive many men to California. California has only been governed

by the US for about a year after freeing herself from Mexican rule. Names from history like Leland Stanford, Daniel Webster, Henry Clay, and Stephen Douglas should not only be remembered but revered as the driving forces for California to become the 31st state in the union and even more important a Free state. Though the Civil War was not to come for a decade, tension existed as did political posturing. We were almost split in half, with the south aligned with the Confederacy.

So, California became a state on September 9th, 1850, and by September 21st, a census was being taken in our own Mississippi Township as in every other community across the state. Residents totaled 378 and all were miners with the exception of two Physicians. These men, and it appears they were all men, mostly between 20 - 39 lived in 102dwellings – so that is about 4 per dwelling, with mostly different last names.

It was the next decade when families started to appear. Farmers brought their families to this place that now had a few less, but I imagine more substantial dwellings. There were only 93 dwellings and approx. 300 people. There were still miners, almost 50 of them, but there were now 15 farmers, a hotel keeper, a butcher, a couple of blacksmiths, now only one physician and several laborers.

MAJOR FUNDING FOR FOLSOM'S "JOHNNY CASH TRAIL ART EXPE-RIENCE" APPROVED IN CALIFORNIA BUDGET

Assemblyman Josh Hoover (R-Folsom) announced the passage of a California budget bill that secured \$425,000 to the City of Folsom Parks & Recreation Department for the Johnny Cash Trail Art Experience - Cash's Pick No. 2.

Folsom's Johnny Cash Trail, a bike and pedestrian trail that borders Folsom State Prison, was completed in 2017. Folsom Parks & Recreation is currently fundraising to install a world-class linear public art experience that will celebrate and honor the legendary Johnny Cash, his music, and his strong connection to the City of Folsom. As part of the public art project, installments at the beginning and end of the trail will feature "Cash's Pick", 7 foot tall bronze guitar picks. The funding secured by Assemblyman Hoover will be used for the design and fabrication of Cash's Pick No. 2. The first pick is currently slated to be installed by early 2024.

I have another salad for the summer! My husband found this recipe online and it is perfect for those of you who have numerous tomatoes from your garden! As a side dish, this salad will last for a few meals. Otherwise, it could be a main dish for two people. You can use whatever you have in your fridge to add to this salad. •1 small cucumber, diced

- ³/₄ cup grape tomatoes, halved or fresh tomatoes, cut into bite-sized pieces
- •1 small red onion, minced
- •1 small carrot, chopped
- ½ red bell pepper, chopped
 About six dried dates, chopped (optional)
- •A bunch of fresh cilantro, chopped
- •2 Tbsp extra-virgin olive oil •Lemon juice from 1 lemon
- 1/4 teaspoon kosher salt, more to taste
- 1/8 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper, more to taste
 1/2 cup feta cheese, crumbled

INSTRUCTIONS

1) Halve your cucumber and slice each half lengthwise into four slices. Hold the slices together like a bouquet and chop them into small pieces. Add them to a medium-sized mixing bowl.

2) Halve the tomatoes and add them to the bowl along with the red bell pepper, carrot, dried dates, and finely chopped cilantro. If using large tomatoes, cut them into bite-sized pieces.

3) Soak minced red onion in lemon juice and set aside.

4) Cube the feta cheese or crumble it directly into the bowl with your hands. Add the kosher salt, black pepper, olive oil, and lemon juice with onions. Mix thoroughly until the salad is well coated and serve.





ANOTHER GREAT SEASON FOR FOV LITTLE LEAGUE ALL STARS By Jeff Pitnikoff



The team was led by coaches Paul Horning, Ryan Thibeault and Manager Joe Duran.





Are YOU the one Overwatering?


How do you know? If you live in Sacramento County, actually most of the Sacramento Region, you have quite a bit of CLAY in the soil. When this clay gets wet, it will form a "seal" through which water will not travel easily. What that means is.....that when you are watering your lawn, the water soaks through your topsoil and will sit on top of the clay layer. When your topsoil can't take any more water, it flows off of your lawn and into the street and storm drains. This is where the water wasting comes from. Your lawn can only handle about 6 to 8 minutes of watering before it can no longer absorb the water from the sprinklers. Don't believe it?, time it for yourself to determine when your watering starts to flow into the streets. And, no matter how much you water your concrete curbs and road ways, they will NOT grow.

ps- That clay in the soil is not providing any nutrients to your lawn. A good fertilizer to feed your lawn is the best way to a green lawn.
