Dear Friend,

The Supermajority in the Assembly reached new levels of hypocrisy this week. They simultaneously passed a constitutional amendment to reduce the vote threshold for local tax increases (ACA 1) then passed another constitutional amendment to increase the vote threshold for passing taxpayer protections (ACA 13). No matter how high our taxes get in California, it never seems to be enough. Instead of increasing the cost of living in our state even further, our Legislature would be wise to get a handle on its propensity to over spend. Thankfully, these measures can still be stopped in the State Senate or rejected by voters at the ballot box.

If they do make it to the ballot, however, they will likely get a favorable title and summary from the Attorney General. You may remember that the infamous Proposition 47, which reduced penalties for shoplifting and created a nightmare for small businesses, was presented to voters as the "Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Act." This is because California allows a partisan official to write the ballot title and summary that appears on every voter's ballot. My colleague Senator Roger Niello has introduced SCA 3 to fix this by transferring this authority to the non-partisan Legislative Analyst. While it did hit a speed bump this vear in the Senate Appropriations Committee, we both remain committed to pushing this forward in future years.

The Legislature is currently considering hundreds of oth-

er bills during End of Ses-

sion before we adjourn for the year on September 14th. I previewed the Top 10 "bills to watch" on my podcast this week, you can watch or listen here if you are interested in learning about some of the legislation we will be debating over the next couple weeks.

I will continue fighting to protect taxpayers over these final days of session, it is an honor to represent you.

NORMA HAMLIN PARK

While taking testimony of Snipes-Pershing and Palisades Parks, 40 years ago the district's directors of the Orangevale Recreation and Park Distract discovered that neighbors of Palisades Park had no input or recommendations. This is a two-acre park that during the rainy season looks like a lake next to the two existing tennis courts. The tennis courts belong to the park district but are located on Palisades Elementary School property. The district was reviewing each park.

However, several neighbors of Snipes-Pershing Park had definite ideas of what should be done. Those presents were shown a slide show of the two parks from numerous angles prior to the board taking public testimony.

One neighbor of the park, Norma Hamlin, had sent a letter to the board requesting that Snipes-Pershing Park be rezoned to agricultural, with no lights or ball diamonds, just left as open space!

The area around the park is mostly privately owned with homes to the north and west and undeveloped land to the east and south. The state owns the bluff area that descends behind the park to the American River. Proposed development of the land surrounding the park had previously created controversy. Proposals were made for development and building of condominiums along the bluff area.

A dirt road that enters land adjacent to the park from the south had been used by illegal dumpers to dispose of building materials, tree trimmings and plain old garbage! One resident had requested that the park district barricade the access areas and place "No dumping" signs!

With only three-fourths of an acre of the 5.25 acre park developed, it was questioned whether the board policy should be dictated by the concerns of the immediate neighbors of the parks or by the needs of all Orangevale residents. This park is shaped like a horseshoe around a private residence and was originally intended as a rest stop for a horse trail. Residents wanted the park developed in a way to keep more homes from being built there.

Today you find the 4.5 acre is the Norma Hamlin Park which is on the southeast corner of the park district. Only .75 acre is developed with a huge playground and three picnic table area. It also has water fountains for people and dogs. Trails follow to the American River. The park property is rich in oak trees and natural vegetation and several vernal pools can be found in full bloom during the spring season.

Interested in a nice location to hike and enjoy a picnic visit Norma Hamlin Park.

nant Church joined the drive three years ago, when Marcus Arnold of Divine Savior Catholic Church invited others to join the collection he had organized in-house the year before.

"There are a lot of hungry people in Orangevale. There is often a long line of cars at the foodbank on Main Ave," says Meyerpeter. The food bank currently serves 1,388 families, approximately a 15% increase since last year, says Andrea Scollay, OV FO Food Bank Director,

"Jesus cares about hungry people," Meyerpeter continues. "Our hope is that we can join God in this important work of loving our neighbor. It is incredibly satisfying and life giving for us to help and serve by unloading and sorting canned goods. The food drive has helped our people connect and know we are part of something bigger than ourselves."

The third reason Meyerpeter love this food drive? "Adalbertos breakfast burritos for volunteers. Enough said."

Those who work with youth feel a similar need to defragment; to reconnect our youth with the community while also giving them opportunity to experience a love and satisfaction for community leadership.

Juleah Dresser, student council faculty advisor at Orangevale Open K-8 school, relayed the invitation. They accepted.

"The students have full control over how the event is experienced, with me acting as support," explains Dresser. "I hope that the students will learn the ins and outs of running a large-scale service event as well as the confidence that comes with being a leader. More importantly I hope that they can see the good they can do for their community and become more understanding, compassionate, and empathic people."

She is reconnecting with Orangevale Open's core values, which center on building community. This includes doing acts of service. "We have run events like this before and I felt it was time to get back to the roots of the school," says Dresser.

FOUR LAYER DELIGHT

1st layer: Mix together 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup flour and ³/₄ cup butter (let sit out a bit) by cutting in with a pastry blender. Then add ¹/₂ cup of your favorite chopped nuts. Gently pat into a 9 x 13-inch baking pan. Bake at 375 degrees for 15 minutes. Set aside to cool.

2nd layer: Cream together an 8 ounce package of softened cream cheese, 1 cup powdered sugar and 1 cup Cool Whip (from a large container of Cool Whip). Spread over cooled 1st layer and chill.




Casa Roble Flag Football LADY RAMS MAKING HISTORY


