A New Multi-Use Trail to Connect Orangevale to the Sunrise Marketplace

The Arcade-Cripple Creek Trail (ACCT) is a 2.9 mile multi-use recreational trail that runs from Wachtel Way (north of Oak Ave.) to Sunrise Blvd. (north of Greenback Lane). Most of the trail follows the existing Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) electric easement corridor. In addition to SMUD property, the trail also crosses properties belonging to the City of Citrus Heights, Sunrise Recreation & Park District, the County of Sacramento, the San Juan Unified School Continue on Page 5

"Go big or go home" might be the motto for Sankalp Immadisetty, 14 who has been growing and mastering the art of growing giant pumpkins for the past three years. With a passion for gardening, Sankalp has been planning and preparing for what he hopes will be his biggest pumpkin yet!

Last year Sankalp nurtured and grew an award winning pumpkin weighing in over 585 lbs. This year, he's taken everything he's learned and devised a plan to grow an even larger pumpkin in hopes of setting a new record for under 18 at the giant pumpkin competition held at Bishop's Pumpkin Farm in Wheatland.

Prior to this year, Sankalp grew his giant

District, and Orangevale Recreation & Park District. The ACCT is expected to be completed and fully open for public use in early December. For OVparks, this project provides healthy and active recreational opportunities to Sundance Park and Streng Park which have primarily been passive open space areas for the western neighborhoods of our District. The ACCT will be a 10-foot-wide paved accessible trail with 2-foot-wide decomposed granite pathway shoulders, being ideal for walking, bicycling, and pushing strollers. Pedestrian safety features include new solar-powered lighting along the trail and new crosswalks at Fair Oaks Blvd., Woodmore Oaks Dr., and Streng Ave.

The most requested park feature from Orangevale residents has been walking paths. It has been a top priority of the OVparks Board of Directors to make our parks more walkable, and this project is something they have been looking forward to for several years. In just a couple of short months we will have a new trail that will connect parks, schools, and neighborhoods. Much gratitude goes to the City of Citrus Heights for their vision of this trail, and for securing \$6.2M through the Caltrans Active Transportation Program grant. The City of Citrus Heights has taken the lead and has formed strong partnerships with OVparks and other agencies to take the ACCT project to the finish line.

pumpkins in the Orangevale Grange Garden, but after realizing the daily attention needed to grow giant pumpkins, the family decided to move to a property nearby where Sankalp, and his younger brother Sreeyan, 6, could "dig in" and carefully monitor and fine tune the pumpkin growing process.

During an interview with Good Day Sacramento, Sankalp shared his labor of love describing the process and length of time it takes to grow a giant pumpkin, "We spent six months growing this pumpkin, and that includes about a year of prep." Further, he went on to describe the process to include growing in greenhouses, misting, fertilizing, burying vines, adding nutrients, and using shade cloth among other things to help maximize the growth for a colossal pumpkin.

This year's pumpkin, affectionately named "Sloby" for its slow start, proved to be anything but. Before the competition, which was held on September 30th, Sankalp estimated the weight of his pumpkin by measuring the six feet wide by six feet long. pumpkin. His best guess of the weight of his giant pumpkin 1,300 to 1,400 pounds. The actual official weigh in was 1334 pounds!

His younger brother Sreeyan, 6, shined bright in this year's competition entering the "smaller" pumpkins that Sankalp also helped nurture along, but ultimately did not use as his entree. Overall the results were impressive for both brothers, finishing with both growing over 2000 pounds of pumpkin!

After the competition, the giant pumpkins were on display for all to see earlier this month at the 2nd Annual Pumpkin Palooza in Orangevale.

PART 2 Cristie Hall Gerard Homes and Memories

This house is located at the corner of Hazel Avenue and Central Avenue when both narrow streets. Let me start with the outside of the house. It was previously owned by a judge in Fair Oaks, at least that's the story I always heard, Judge Diestel. When my family lived there, about 1955 through 1960, there were olive trees lining the front on Hazel Avenue and a large swooping evergreen of some kind on the corner. There was no traffic to speak of. Because dad was in the cement business - Folsom Ready Mix - he poured concrete for a driveway from Hazel Avenue all the way back to the garage-and then a sidewalk around the house so that Bryan, my little brother, could ride his trike around the house. That was a lot of cement. The house had brown shingles on all sides with white wood frames around the windows. There was a basement window you visible from the driveway.

There was a big screened in front porch with cement walls for railings and they were usually cool to the touch and a great vantage point out front. The front door had a small diamond shaped window in the top half so grownups could look out and see who was there.

The stairs were inside on the left and had a window seat on a landing about a quarter of the way up. Directly forward of the front door was the

kitchen opening. It took up the left side of the downstairs. To the right was the formal living room and then the formal dining room, with built in dividers and a hutch for all the dishes. The vents for the heater were on the floor. There was a small office past the dining room. The dining room also had a window seat that stretched beneath the three windows looking out toward Central Avenue.

The back porch held the washing machine on one side and lots of room for being outside on the other. There was no dryer, just those stand-up pant frames that Mom used. There was a clothes line out back on the Central Avenue side where there were crab apple and other trees and lawn.

The bathroom was upstairs and was huge – just the same size as the bedrooms. It too had some built-in cabinets. One of those cabinets was a laundry chute that ran right down to the washing tub on the back porch. Mom had some kind of stick to get it open.

Somewhere on the back porch was the door to the basement. I didn't get to go down there much. I remember it being flooded occasionally and it being cool with moms canned fruit jars lining a shelf or two.

Upstairs were three bedrooms. The main one was really big and had one whole wall of built-in drawers and a closet that went behind all the drawers. So fun to play there.

The other two bedrooms had a similar but smaller built-in dresser. My bedroom was over the back porch, had windows and a tree, very close to the windows. This room also had a closet and a half closet with a door and three shelves on one side. A great place to roast marshmallows with a candle.

Most of my time was spent outside. My dad got me a horsePeaches- and then another Big Boy. I could barely reach him, but Peaches I would ride bareback, like you were supposed to do with Indian Pintos. Their pasture is now the home of three duplex units along Hazel Avene. There was also a corral.

The back-behind the house a good 50' was the wooden garage. It was two stories and had a tack house behind the place for the cars. Upstairs was all mine-a playhouse for us kids. There were windows that opened to face the house and a rope that we used to drop for mom to put goodies in.

Behind the garage was the chicken coop. Goodness knows why, but we also had some Banty roosters and chickens. This building was about 5' wide and 15' long.

To the left of the cement driveway between the house and garage was a massive Weeping Willow tree. We had a swing on it and a sand box under it. I loved climbing this tree.

On Central Avenue, I had some friends I haven't thought about in ages. Billy Cozad sounds right, for sure Nancy Terpenning, the Trezona's lived there too and Mrs. Doris Dawson and her son Bill. Almost to Beech, was Hank & Ramona Burdoffs home and Ramona's Beauty Shop. My mother took me to see Ramona for hair trims and permanents. Maybe that's why my hair has been really short since I was a young adult. I did like to sleep under that big tube of a hairdrver.

The Smithharts were also across the street on Central Avenue and Mr. & Mrs. Trevey lived in a similar big old house across Hazel Avenue on Central Avenue. Mrs. Trevey was my mother's piano teacher when she was in grade school. Mrs. Trevey also taught me piano at her house around this time. Mrs. Trevey was one of the Greenhalgh daughters, her sisters Martha Bost and Sadie Cable.

This lot is smaller today and had a car hit the front of the home but still stands strong.

EASY CHOCOLATE CHIP PUMPKIN MUF-FINS

1 ³/₄ cup all-purpose flourspooned and leveled 1 tsp baking soda ½ tsp ground cinnamon
 ½ tsp pumpkin pie spice
 ¼ tsp ground ginger
 ½ tsp salt
 ½ cup vegetable oil or

melted coconut oil ¹/₂ cup granulated sugar 1/3 cup packed light or dark brown sugar 1 ¹/₂ cup canned pumpkin puree (not pumpkin pie filling)

2 large eggs ¼ cup milk 1 heaping cup of chocolate chips

Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Spray a 12-count muffin pan with non-stick spray or line with cupcake liners.

In a large bowl, whisk the flour, baking soda, cinnamon, pumpkin pie spice, ginger and salt together until combined. Set aside.

In a medium bowl, whisk

the oil, sugars, pumpkin, eggs and milk together until combined. Pour this into the large bowl of dry ingredients. Fold everything together until combined. Then add the chocolate chips and fold into the mixture.

Spoon the batter into liners, filling them all the way to the top

Bake for 5 minutes at 425 degrees, then reduce the temperature to 350 degrees and bake for and additional 16-17 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean.

Cool for 5 minutes in the muffin pan before enjoy-ing!

After cooling, cover tightly and store at room temperature for up to a week.



He served nine years as a UNICEF Ambassador and in 2003, he co-founded, with Diane Bubel, what is now the National Inclusion Project to advocate and increase opportunities for children with disabilities to be included in extracurricular activities (such as summer camps and after-school programs) with their non-disabled peers. Additional TV appearances include: 30 Rock, The Office, Scrubs, Days of Our Lives, and Law & Order: SVU. Additional 2nd place finishes include: The Celebrity Apprentice in 2012 and the NC 2nd District US House race in 2014. Beyond all of his successes (and near successes) his proudest accomplishment remains his son. Parker.Ruben Studdard rose to fame as winner of the second season of American Idol and received a Grammy Award nomination in December 2003 for Best Male R&B Vocal Performance for "Superstar". In the years following Idol, Studdard has released six studio albums, including his platinum-



selling debut, Soulful, and the top-selling gospel follow-up, I Need an Angel. He is most wellknown for his recording career, which has produced hits including "Flying Without Wings," "Sorry 2004," and "Change Me," but he has also segued into television and stage work. Most notably, he toured with Robin Givens in the comedy-drama I Need a Hug and in 2008 starred as Fats Waller in a national tour revival of Ain't Misbehavin, which spawned a Grammynominated soundtrack. Studdard most recently appeared on the 15th season of The Biggest Loser. Ruben Sings Luther (a tribute to Luther Vandross) the album was re-released on October 23rd, 2019, and includes a new tune. The album is available via all streaming and download platforms. "Ruben Sings Luther," the North American concert tour is on its third national run. In November of 2019, Ruben returned to the Broadway stage with fellow American Idol finalist and best friend, Clay Aiken, in their critically-acclaimed, Ruben and Clay's First Annual Christmas Show. During American Idol, Studdard gained the nickname "Velvet Teddy Bear" and was noted for his shirts printed with "205," the telephone area code of his hometown of Birmingham. Alabama Governor. Bob Rilev declared March 11, 2003, as "Ruben Studdard Day".
